## **CELEBRATE, CATHOLIC CHARISMATIC RENEWAL SERVING THE CHURCH**

In June 2014 Pope Francis addressed the 'Renewal in the Spirit Conference in Rome'.

Speaking to the throng of around 53,000 people gathered in the Olympic Stadium in Rome he began by saying: "Dear brothers and sisters! I thank you so much for your welcome. No doubt someone told the organizers that I very much like this song, "The Lord Jesus Lives". When I celebrated holy Mass in Buenos Aires with the Charismatic Renewal, after the consecration and after a few seconds of adoration in tongues, we sang this song with so much joy and force, as you did today. Thank you! I felt at home!"

Celebrate began in Ilfracombe, in the Diocese of Plymouth, on Easter Sunday 1994, so 2014 is our 20th anniversary! It all began in 1992 when the Lord convinced us that he wanted a conference which would provide spirituality for every age group, at which every individual would be valued within an atmosphere of friendship and close fellowship. Since then year after year we see around 1,500 people, of whom almost half are aged 22 years and below, attend the main conference. (Extract from an article by Charles & Sue Whitehead).

Because the usual Celebrate Conference in 2014 in Ilfracombe clashed with the very early start of the school summer term eleven Celebrate Weekends took place between May and November at a variety of locations around the UK and, in the Plymouth Diocese, at St Cuthbert Mayne School, Torquay on 18th and 19th October.

## CAFOD Ebola appeal hits £500,000

Thank you for donating more than half a million pounds to our Ebola crisis appeal. Your generosity is saving lives.

Parishes, schools and individuals across England and Wales have responded with huge compassion to our Ebola crisis appeal, donating more than £500,000 to help stop the spread of the virus across Sierra Leone, Liberia and Guinea.

Your support is helping our Church partners to educate people about the risks, to provide essential hygiene kits and washing-stations, and to ensure that burials are carried out safely. In total, thanks to you, we will reach more than 200,000 people over the coming weeks.

Christian Modino, our Head of Emergency Programmes for Africa, said: "It's important to keep repeating messages about how to prevent the spread of Ebola, and it's important to do



it sensitively. Some customs that people in West Africa consider normal – like shaking hands when you greet a friend or touching the body as part of funeral services - can greatly increase the risk of the virus being transmitted. One legacy of civil wars in Liberia and Sierra Leone is that people do not always trust information provided by governments. That means that faith leaders have an absolutely crucial role to play in explaining how to control the disease. "Our partners are spreading accurate information through Sunday sermons in churches, through Friday prayers in mosques, through Church radio stations, through posters, through public theatre, and by going door to door. The messages

are getting through, but there's still a huge amount of work to do."

In Sierra Leone, we have already trained 400 priests and catechists about Ebola prevention and each one is going door to door to discuss the disease with at least 40 families. In Guinea, we have provided health education and hygiene kits to 28,000 people. In Liberia, we are providing emergency supplies of rice to more than 17,000 people in areas that have been quarantined or where farming has been restricted. However, with the virus still spreading, we urgently need to scale up our work. There have been more than 13,000 reported cases of Ebola in total, but the World Health Organisation has warned that the number could reach up to 10,000 a week in December if more isn't done to stop the spread.

Catherine Mahony, our Regional Emergency Coordinator, who is based in Sierra Leone, says:

"People's lives are being changed by the Ebola outbreak, in many different and challenging ways. Communities are accepting these difficult changes, making great sacrifices so that they, and everyone they know, will be safer sooner. While this is an extremely sad and traumatic time, it is inspiring to see such strength, and to witness the goodness that people act upon freely. Sierra Leone is a land of the living, its people are brave and positive. We're focusing on the end of the dark time, and the light at the end of the tunnel."

#### **Volunteers sought for Homeless Projects**

St Petroc's Society in Partnership with the Diocese of Truro is seeking volunteers for Homeless projects:

- **Cornwall Nightstop** will help prevent young people from sleeping rough in Cornwall. We are in need of volunteers to become Cornwall Nightstop hosts, who will provide an emergency bed for the night in their spare room for a 16 to 25 year old young person who find themselves with nowhere else to stay. Cornwall Nightstop will be affiliated to the National organisation Depaul Nightstop UK and so will meet their quality assurance standards of service delivery and safeguarding. Full training and support is provided. We also cover out of pocket expenses. The simple act of offering the young person a bed gives the professional staff extra time to put appropriate care in place without leaving the young person in a vulnerable situation.
- The Winter Night Shelter Cornwall (WNSC) The

Winter Night Shelter Cornwall Project (WNSC) will provide night shelters in December and January. Last winter we accommodated 111 rough sleepers and 75 % of these were helped into permanent accommodation as a result of their contact with the service. WNSC could be a life saver for those with no home and also provides companionship and food. The night shelters need a large number of volunteers to make this project a success. Full training and expenses will be given to prepare for this challenging, but always rewarding service to those in most need.

### POPE FRANCIS' TEN TOP TIPS FOR BRINGING MORE JOY TO DAILY LIFE

- 1. Live and let live. Everyone should be guided by this principle, he said, which has a similar expression in Rome with the saying, "Move forward and let others do the same."
- 2. Be giving of yourself to others. People need to be open and generous toward others, he said, because "if you withdraw into yourself, you run the risk of becoming egocentric. And stagnant water becomes putrid."
- **3. Proceed calmly in life.** The pope, who used to teach high school literature, used an image from an Argentine novel by Ricardo Guiraldes, in which the protagonist -- gaucho Don Segundo Sombra -- looks back on how he lived his life. "He says that in his youth he was a stream full of rocks that he carried with him; as an adult, a rushing river; and in old age, he was still moving, but slowly, like a pool" of water, the pope said. He said he likes this latter image of a pool of water -- to have "the ability to move with kindness and humility, a calmness in life."
- **4. A healthy sense of leisure**. Pope Francis said: "The pleasures of art, literature and playing together with children have been lost. Consumerism has brought us anxiety and stress, causing people to lose a healthy



culture of leisure. Their time is swallowed up so people can't share it with anyone. Even though many parents work long hours, they must set aside time to play with their children; work schedules make it complicated, but you must do it."

Families must also turn off the TV when they sit down to eat because, even though television is useful for keeping up with the news, having it on during mealtime doesn't let you communicate with each other.

- **5. Sundays should be holidays.** Workers should have Sundays off because Sunday is for family.
- 6. Find innovative ways to create dignified jobs for young people. We need to be creative with young people. If they have no opportunities they will get into drugs and be more vulnerable to suicide. It's not enough to give them food; dignity is given to you when you can bring food home from one's own labour.
- **7. Respect and take care of nature.** Environmental degradation is one of the biggest challenges we have. A question that we're not asking ourselves is: 'Isn't humanity committing suicide with this indiscriminate and tyrannical use of nature?'
- **8. Stop being negative.** Needing to talk badly about others indicates low self-esteem. That means feeling so low that instead of picking myself up I have to cut others down. Letting go of negative things quickly is healthy.
- **9. Don't proselytize; respect others' beliefs.** We can inspire others through witness so that one grows together in communicating. But the worst thing of all is religious proselytism, which paralyzes. The church grows by attraction, not proselytizing.
- **10. Work for peace.** We are living in a time of many wars and the call for peace must be shouted. Peace sometimes gives the impression of being quiet, but it is never quiet, peace is always proactive and dynamic. It is also threatened by food insecurity.

## Diocesan News Marriage Care South West

Cardinal Nichols recently returned from the Extraordinary Synod of the Family, praying, studying and conversing with bishops from across the world. In addition they listened to the stories of families drawn from many different backgrounds. Bishops expressed the very important role the Catholic Church community and Catholic agencies like Marriage Care can play in nurturing and supporting couples at the time of their marriages as well as ongoing support throughout their married lives.

Churches and their communities are in a unique position; in their welcome and marriage preparation they offer something couples cannot get by marrying in a hotel or stately home. Their careful and generous welcoming of a couple demonstrates God's love and care not just about the big day, but all the days afterwards.

As part of that welcome, Marriage Care offers opportunities for couples to dedicate time to think about their relationship, their marriage vows and to prepare for their lives together after their wedding. Marriage Care in the South West offers marriage preparation in the form of one-day courses attended by several couples or (for individual couples) face-to-face sessions with a facilitator (based on answering questionnaires about their beliefs and attitudes). Although some couples are anxious at the beginning, most of them find this experience rewarding, informal and even fun!

In October in Torbay, couples spent a day away from their wedding preparations to consider their lives together after the wedding. As one participant, Rebecca, said at the end:

I was nervous about attending the course and wasn't sure what to expect, but Fiona, Susie and Harry made it friendly, informal and fun. – I honestly think every couple should attend and are guaranteed to take something useful from it. Thank You.

Of the 3,000 couples Marriage Care sees annually across England and Wales, the vast majority have been living together for at least 5 years and many have children. Yet they still find it is helpful to dedicate some time to think about their relationship and what it means to them. (A government report from earlier this year revealed that 88% of couples who attended one of our courses found it useful.) As a comment from another bride shows, time devoted to marriage preparation is well spent:

'I found talking about our experiences and how our childhood has affected our personalities most useful. Things about what we want to take from our childhood and past into our relationship. It was just good to talk and has been a great time for us to think about and focus on our relationship'.

St Paul the Apostle Church in Tintagel is now designated a Chapel of Ease or Oratory, but formerly was called a Mission Church within the Parish of Bodmin, the Deanery of Cornwall and the Diocese of Plymouth, England. The church is dedicated to St Paul whose apostolate was his missionary work. He was also one of the main characters to spread and develop early Christianity.

The Mission of Tintagel, like so many others in Cornwall, was founded by the Canons Regular of the Lateran from Bodmin. The Church of St Paul the Apostle was built in 1968; of particular interest in the modern building is the Cornish serpentine statue of the Blessed Virgin, Stations of the Cross carved locally and the stained glass made by the monks of Buckfast.

Fr Ciaran worked and served tirelessly in our parish, looking after our three churches, our parish school of St Mary & St Joseph, visiting the sick and housebound and always on call and available to all who needed him. He also served as prison chaplain, celebrating Mass and visiting prisoners and young offenders. Fr Ciaran, a familiar and well loved character running through the Dorset lanes and countryside, will be greatly missed by everyone. The evening ended with a presentation to Father, followed by a buffet supper. And, if you are wondering, a Fuddle is a fun filled cuddle!

Just before Fr Ciaran left the parish he arranged for a parting memento to the church of St Edward, Wareham.
