



Bernard and Susan Kelly, Southern Regional Couple for Equipes Notre Dame (END) have just returned from the third END International Gathering for Regional Couples in Rome. The theme for the conference was 'Here I am Lord, Send me' (Isaiah 6:8). They continue the story: "END is an international Christian







of being a member of END, the role of prayer in couples and family, the importance of monthly dialogue between spouses and the support and encouragement of priests. Recalling the upcoming Synod on the Family, Pope Francis said: "I ask you, as well as your couples in Teams, to pray with faith and

fervour for the Synod fathers and for me." He thanked END for the support and encouragement in the ministry of their priests saying: "they always find, in contact with your Teams and your families, priestly joy, fraternal presence, emotional balance and spiritual fraternity."

Pope Francis also spoke of the missionary task of the movement, in accompanying young couples and forming them in faith before and after marriage. He emphasised: "the importance of remaining close to wounded families of whom there are so many these day, due to unemployment, health problems, bereavement, the imbalance caused by distance or absence, or a climate of violence." Pope Francis continued: "I encourage couples to be instruments of the mercy of Christ and the Church towards those whose marriage has failed."

The words of the Holy Father are a witness to faith amongst married couples of all ages who we met at the conference, particularly those from countries who are suffering from the effects of flood, famine, war and persecution will remain in our hearts, minds and prayers for ever."

# Thunderbox - An appeal in aid of the Little Company of Mary Palliative care centre in Korçe, Albania Reg. Charity 233137

During 2015 there have been several "Cathedral" funerals for people who have died, often quite suddenly, from cancer. Others are living with the diagnosis and, whilst reactions vary, a faith in God is supportive. Cancer can be frightening and limiting but here in the UK we have our wonderful NHS and linked 'support' that are the envy of poor Balkan

countries such as Albania where there is a poverty stricken, often corrupt and limited health service. Cancer diagnosis there is absolutely terrifying and presentment is frequently too late for cures or surgery The Little Company of Mary (LCM) is a Roman Catholic Congregation of Nursing Sisters who specialise in palliative care for cancer patients in Korçe, a market town in south east Albania and surrounding villages. The Sisters arrived in 1993, starting their work with home visits, then built a Health Centre, officially opened in 1996, trashed in 1997 during civil unrest, re-built from 1998 and handed over with LCM oversight and funding to suitably trained Albanians in 2004. It has subsequently expanded considerably. Primrose Peacock has supported the LCM from the start either as an individual or as the Director of Friends of Albania from 1991to 2012) and she has chosen their work in Korçe as her final project.

The LCM London Provincial asked Korçe what new equipment they would like funded. The response was, unexpectedly, commodes (or Thunderboxes) which are loaned out to terminal patients who either have no indoor sanitation in rural areas or who have to use communal squat lavatories in urban apartment blocks.

The Thunderbox appeal commenced on 1st October and donations can be Gift Aided by UK tax payers if accompanied by a gift aid form (available on request). Each 'thunderbox' costs 250€ which is about £180.00; there are no overheads so what people give goes in its entirety to LCM. Cheques should be made payable to Little Company of Mary, Albania. ## A Call to Action (ACTA) – October Synod for the Family the Vocation and Mission of the Family in the Church and Contemporary World

Whatever the initial outcomes or longer term impacts of the Synod, one of the most important aspects for Catholics in this country might be the decision of the bishops to release a "warts and all" summary of the responses to their questionnaire, released as part of the preparations for the Synod. At the press conference to issue the summary, Cardinal Nichols was reported as commenting: "this family witness to the Church is very, very important, more than what the Church can teach the family." Clergy seem genuinely to have been moved and humbled by

the depth of love for the church, honesty of feedback received and the upset which many feel. After facing criticism for the style adopted for the pre-Synod consultations/deliberations, and again for the lack of feedback issued the first time around, it appears significant that such an extensive and inclusive document was released just before this year's Synod opened in Rome. The document reflects comments received from Catholics in this and other Diocese as well as several local and national organizations including, A Call to Action, the Association of Interchurch Families, the Catholic Women's League, the Union of Catholic Mothers, Two in One Flesh, the National Board of Catholic Women and the Dorcas group.

I would urge all to look at the text of the full document on the bishops' website, http://www.catholicnews.org.uk /Home/News/Family-Survey-Responses. It is an example of a growing willingness to engage in dialogue within the church, which is the essence of what ACTA exists to promote. Many thanks to all who took part in this exercise and those who were part of the decision to publish it.



For I have set you an example that you should also do as I have done to you."

Of particular note were: The central importance given to worship that provides a rhythm and cohesion to life at the school; the clarity of Christian vision lived out and modelled by the school leaders and the effectiveness of the leadership of Religious Education (RE) in successfully managing the subject in this joint school context.

Informally, it was clear that ethos is deeply embedded and articulated, there is an excellent social action approach:

Collective Worship was very strong, and so was RE

St Edward's is a joint Roman Catholic Anglican 11-18 comprehensive school serving the Anglican deanery of Poole and the Catholic community of Poole, Wimborne, Wareham and Swanage, with 1,073 students on roll at the time of the inspection.

The numbers of students in receipt of pupil premium is below the national average and the numbers of students with special educational needs is above average. However, in 2014 the attainment of pupils with Pupil Premium was above the national average, as was progress value added.

Most students are of white British heritage but there are growing numbers of students from other ethnic backgrounds and of students with English as an additional language. 36% of students are from self-identifying Catholic backgrounds; 54% originate from other Christian denominations.

This was the first time the project had been run and we were able to design and implement 10 workshops in a local secondary school for 15 girls.

The main aim of the project was to tackle the issues which prevent young women from completing their education, this included physical health and wellbeing by providing a feminine health kit for each girl.

I was also lucky enough to see much of the area around Moshi including some local wildlife, beautiful lakes and spend time with a local family in



a rural village. It was an incredible rewarding and humbling experience.

My time in Moshi has been integral for securing a place on a Masters program in International Development which I'm about to start at Birmingham University. The project I took part in is self-funding and asks Interns, such as myself, to fundraise to enable self-sufficiency. I am very grateful to the Catenians for the significant amount of funding they provided; it was a great pleasure to join the Axminster Circle for an evening to thank them in person and to share my experiences in Tanzania."

## Ordinariate Catholic Church of Our Lady of Walsingham and St Cuthbert Mayne, Torbay

On 19th of June, at 11:50am a new Ordinariate Church, by permission of our Ordinary Mgr Keith Newton, came into being. Over this last year the Torbay Ordinariate Mission faithfully witnessed in the Methodist Church, Chelston, which then became the



former Methodist Church at Chelston and after an appeal, which was generously supported by so many people and groups, it is now a catholic church. The Methodist community hoped they would be able to sell the church buildings to another Christian community and this hope has been realised.

Like many groups in the Ordinariate, the Torquay Group, since coming into being, sought ways to fulfil something of the prophetic vision of Anglicanorum Cœtibus. The local diocese had been very generous in its welcome and support of the Ordinariate and continues to be so, but it proved impossible to house priests of the Ordinariate in the South West close to their groups. This hampered growth and a solution had to be found.

With the purchase of the Church, the group can now lead a full liturgical life, offer hospitality and be a centre for teaching. The next goal is to construct, within the existing buildings, a presbytery where a priest can be resident to serve the group and the community and be able to give the necessary pastoral care.

Please pray for all at Our Lady of Walsingham with St Cuthbert Mayne as they continue this exciting journey in the service of Christ.


