Parishes for Peace THINKING OF YOU – PRAYING FOR YOU – WE LOVE YOU

These are the messages Della Shenton (St Mary church) took with her in over 1,000 Christmas cards when she flew out to Jordan on behalf of 'Parishes for Peace'.

The cards were from Religious (CJs and Franciscans) and from parishes in Cornwall, Devon, London, Somerset, Worcester, Surrey, Lancashire and Cumbria together with 220 wrapped and labelled presents for 56 Iraqi Christian refugee families being cared for by three parishes in Jordan.

"It was a drop in the ocean of this terrible religious persecution," said Della, "but it was a beginning, to be in direct communication - which is what Parishes for Peace is all about. Their joy was nothing compared with ours at the opportunity to give and to share", she added, speaking of the experience of the ten days meeting, listening, laughing and learning from these brave Christians who left everything rather than deny their faith.



these 7,000

or so who came to the Church for help is hardly mentioned in the media. They are families with young children, teenagers and grandparents.

All are registered UNHCR refugees. in transit for an indeterminate period, waiting in uncertainty for visas for Australia, Canada, America or Britain. To date they

have been waiting for 18 months. They are doctors, engineers, teachers, businessmen, skilled craftsmen - an asset in any community - but as refugees not allowed to work in Jordan. They are therefore entirely dependent on donations and handouts from the major charities to pay for rent, food, water and heating. There is nothing like enough funding, and this is where parishes in the UK can step in and plug the gaps by directly befriending families known to be in need.

Parishes for Peace is set up to support the refugees by linking parish families in the UK with Iraqi Christian families (1,300 of them) in Amman, developing a relationship, preserving dignity and helping to relieve the isolation. Working with the parish priests alongside the major charities, Parishes for Peace will provide food vouchers, money for mid-morning lunch and transport for the children, English lessons for the adults, and much-needed "outings" as highlights to look forward to.

"Whilst there, all the families living in porta cabins on parish car-parks were finally moved into flats in Amman with help from the Vatican, with Caritas paying most rents. They were without furniture but at least were dry; hungry and cold, but safe. Parishioners, priests and foreign donations from charities like ours helped with money for food, heat and essential furniture.

Parishes for Peace broke a funding deadlock for two

desperate young families with a donation that enabled them to move. Their smiles in the photograph tell all.





Even with so little, they always invited us to eat with them.



We will go again to Jordan on 24 February en route for a pilgrimage to the biblical sites - and this time for a day trip out with their priests to the Baptism site of Jesus at the Jordan River, followed by lunch,

which has been sponsored by Weybridge parish. "It will be a great day to remember - and I hope the first of many" added Della.



Apostleship of the Sea (Aos) Port chaplain prays with Muslim seafarer





The Catholic seafarers' charity Apostleship of the Sea (AoS) supports seafarers regardless of their religion or beliefs. John Pinhay, AoS port chaplain in Fowey, went on board a ship called the Skagenbank over the Christmas period to visit its crew and give out presents.

The crew members were very busy but John was welcomed by the ship's chief engineer who in turn introduced John to Radjo Muhammad, the cook. Radjo received the Christmas gifts on the crews' behalf, and he and John got talking about a multitude of topics.

After a long conversation and a coffee, Radjo mentioned to John that he was a practicing Muslim who respects all believers in God; as John was about to leave he asked Radjo if he wanted to join in a prayer and this the seafarer readily did. They offered prayers for the safe passage of the crew and eventual safe return home to family and friends.

John said: "It was a very memorable experience and a good opportunity to live out Pope Francis' call to engage in meaningful dialogue and friendship with our brethren of other faiths."

Due to the nature of their work, seafarers can spend up to nine months away at sea, separated from their family and loved ones and sometimes working in harsh

conditions. In the Plymouth Diocese, AoS' chaplains and ship visitors provide spiritual, pastoral and welfare support to seafarers who arrive at ports in the South West. This includes organising Mass and prayers on board ships as well as helping seafarerscontact their families back home.

The Film 'Spotlight' the true story of how the Boston Globe uncovered the massive scandal of child abuse and the cover-up within the Catholic Archdiocese of Boston. A spokesman for the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales said: "The film Spotlight shows how victims of abuse were failed in Boston, USA. The Church deeply regrets all instances of sexual abuse and accepts that grave mistakes

were made in the past. Victims must come first. In this country, following two independent inquiries, there is no place to hide for those who commit these horrific crimes. All allegations of abuse reported to the Church in England and Wales are immediately passed on to the police and the statutory services of the local authority. The Church in this country works closely and cooperatively with the statutory

authorities as these allegations are investigated. Following this investigation, which follows UK law, the Church in England and Wales conducts its own internal investigation, following Canon law."



Saturday Feb 6th certainly gave all our pilgrims a taste of travelling under difficult conditions. It was windswept and very rainy in Exeter as they gathered from Bristol, Swindon, Gloucester, Poole, Torquay, Plymouth and the far flung parishes of Cornwall. We hope for much better weather in Poland! As you can see from our group selfie with Bishop Mark our spirits are high and there is a real sense of excitement about the pilgrimage ahead.

We gathered this time as the combined Dioceses of Clifton and Plymouth to meet in small groups so that pilgrims could get to know their leaders, explore the theme of Mercy and celebrate Mass with Bishop Mark at the end of the day.

Currently our group stands at nearly 90 pilgrims of whom approximately 30 are under 18. We have a fairly even balance of the genders and a good spread of pilgrims from across our Plymouth Diocese.

I want to thank the parishes who have really gone out of their way to support us with prayers and fundraising. We have also received some generous donations from individuals who have sponsored pilgrims and this has made a real difference to our numbers. I am still campaigning to raise funds over and above covering pilgrim basic costs as we want to be able to visit one or two places in Poland while we are there. This includes Wadowice, the birth place of St John Paul 11 and Auschwitz.

We meet again on Saturday May 7th for our final joint event at which Bishop Mark and Bishop Declan will commission us as pilgrims.

For now, we have started on our journey, have adopted Lenten resolutions which reflect the corporal and spiritual acts of mercy and have our eyes firmly set on Kraków 2016.

Liskeard and Sclerder Parish Walking for Refugees

Thank you so much to all of you who sponsored us or donated money for our cross-parish walk in aid of the refugees. We set off on the coast path at sunrise —about 7.30am and walked the coast path via Seaton and Downderry to Tregantle Fort, with Rame Head in the distance. We had a fifteen minute refreshment break at Portwrinkle at about 11am then left the coastal path and headed inland towards Antony through some lovely sheltered lanes around St John.

Before walking on to Torpoint where we caught the ferry to

Before walking on to Torpoint where we caught the ferry to Plymouth. This enabled another refreshment break – tea and mince pies disappeared very quickly!

We arrived in Plymouth at about 2pm and walked up through Devonport and Keyham to the Tamar Bridge, by which time the weather was really beginning to set in. We crossed the Tamar back into Cornwall, arriving very wet and windswept at the pub next to Saltash Station at about 3.15pm. Liquid refreshment was very welcome and we returned by train to Looe (and the Glebe!) by 5.15pm.

It was a fantastic day and we were very lucky with the weather. So far, we have raised £1,342.25! All of you at Sclerder (as usual) have been extremely generous and we have also had a lot of support from outside – Malcolm's friends and family in Northampton and his colleagues on the railway; Cathy's friends and family in Walsall and her colleagues at Liskeard market and in Looe; Len's family and friends in London. Fr David in Launceston also held collections for us and £260 has come from his parishioners in Launceston, Bude and Callington, so this has been a real team effort.

The money raised is for the United Nations High Commission for Refugees and will help to provide basic survival equipment for the refugees such as foil blankets, blankets, food and medicine.


St Joseph & St Walburga, Branksome

Samara's Aid Appeal for Middle East Refugees

Eighteen months ago 2 young mothers from Brighton started the 'Samara's Aid Appeal' to send clothing to the thousands of families who had fled their homes to escape ISIS. In Northern Iraq many of these families are trying to survive in flimsy tents in temperatures as low as minus 10°C.

Following an urgent appeal last December, Axminster Churches Together (ACT) provided some practical support for these desperate people and generously gave good quality warm clothing, shoes and bedding. This was brought to Purzebrook Chapel where the Axminster Christian Fellowship kindly offered their premises for sorting and packing into banana boxes for shipping. In less than a week we filled 180 boxes and 2 volunteers from the Baptist Church transported them in vans to the collection depot in Worthing. Towards the end of the week we asked the churches not to donate any more clothing as there was still enough, awaiting packaging, to fill a third van and it was close to the delivery deadline.

Many of the donors said that they were so pleased to be able to do something to help the major refugee crisis in the Middle East and all agreed that that they had started something they would like to continue.






Plymouth Circle enjoyed a great night out at the Westward Inn, Lee Mill when 30 Brothers and Ladies met for the Annual Skittles evening.

Living With Grief – Walking the Spiral Bairbre Cahill


Grief often follows a spiral path, bringing us back to a place we have been before but at a different level. In this book the author invites us to walk part of the spiral with her, accompanied by others who have experienced loss and raw grief.
