

Apostleship of the Sea **New Auxiliary Bishop to** Southwark

Pope Francis has appointed Fr Paul Mason, a former cruise chaplain with seafarers' charity Apostleship of the Sea (AoS), Auxiliary Bishop to the Catholic Diocese of Southwark by Pope Francis. Fr Paul, who was born in North Shields in 1963, will be ordained Bishop in Saint George's Cathedral, Southwark on 31st May. He is a priest of the Archdiocese of Southwark, and has been the Episcopal Vicar for Kent for the past 2 years.

During his time as an AoS cruise chaplain Fr Paul provided support to seafarers on board P&O's Adonia, Aurora and Oceana as well as Cunard's Queen Elizabeth. Despite being among the thousands of passengers and crew members on cruises, Fr Paul was easy enough to spot in his clerical dress. He soon became the go-to person for crew and passengers who needed a listening ear and a confidante with whom they could share their worries and problems. Never mind that Fr Paul was classified as an 'entertainer' for purposes of the contract with the shipping company: "This didn't worry me. They could have called me the chief bottle-washer so long as I was given the opportunity to provide this ministry and sacramental support to seafarers." He added, "It became clear to me early on that Apostleship of the Sea is quite right prioritising crews welfare. While of course being present for passengers is important, the overwhelming need is for the crew, who spend months at sea with limited contact with family and loved ones, and go for months at a time without the sacraments

Due to the nature of their work, seafarers can spend up to nine months away at sea, separated from their family and loved ones and sometimes working in harsh conditions. In the Plymouth Diocese, AoS chaplains and ship visitors provide spiritual, pastoral and welfare support to seafarers who arrive at ports in the South West. This includes organising Mass and prayers on board ships as well as helping seafarers contact their families back home.

Please remember in your prayers the AoS Chaplains in our Diocese and those to whom they minister: John Pinhay (Falmouth and Fowey), Ann Donnelly (Plymouth and Teignmouth) and Rev Roger Stone (Weymouth and Portland).

CAFOD, the Catholic Agency for Overseas Development, is part of Caritas International, a worldwide network of Catholic relief development agencies.

This month marked the end of CAFOD's Lent Campaign and the one year anniversary of the Nepal Earthquake. The Plymouth Diocese has played a crucial role in fundraising and raising awareness to help those in the world's poorest communities.



During our Lent Appeal, people all over the UK joined together to fundraise and have now raised more than £3.7million to help over 300,000 people in Uganda, Zimbabwe and the Republic of Congo to access clean water, training and education.

A Lent Lunch at Our Lady of the Assumption and St Mary Magdalene Church Tavistock, raised over £650 and one Torquay Parishioner, 70-year old Brian Bailey, decided to do a skydive which raised over £3,000 for the Lent Appeal. He completed his skydive on 9th April and although he was somewhat nervous, it was an experience he fully enjoyed and will never forget. He said: "Awesome is the only way I can describe it." Teresa, his wife, added: "It was so brave and courageous, I certainly couldn't do it!"

People from across the UK contacted Brian to send him messages of congratulations and to donate over \pounds 1,890 to his skydive. Brian's parish, family, friends and the local Primary school, Queensway, ran fundraising events which contributed over \pounds 1,000.

Brian said: "The support I've received has knocked me for six, I am really amazed. I want to say a huge thank you. It's amazing that so much was given by people I didn't know." CAFOD's representative in the Plymouth Diocese, Simon Giarchi said: "Being able to turn on a tap and have clean water is something we would normally take for granted. Having to walk miles every day to collect water and being unable to go to school as a result is almost unbelievable, but is a daily reality for so many people around the world, especially girls in some of the poorest communities. We're so grateful to everyone in the Plymouth Diocese who have raised money for our Lent appeal, helping families to access this basic right and empowering girls to get an education and fulfil their potential. It's brilliant to think that their efforts will have double the impact with the UK Government matching the money raised."

The Nepal Earthquake, One year on

This generosity enabled CAFOD to work in 15 of the worst-hit areas of the country, provide immediate emergency supplies, help people survive the coldest months, and now, one year on, the rebuilding of family homes. CAFOD director Chris Bain said: "The generosity and compassion shown by our supporters in Plymouth towards the people of Nepal has been remarkable. Thanks to them, our partners can restore dignity to thousands of people affected by last year's devastating earthquakes."

What I did sense was that when I run a long way (and 13 miles is a long way!), the body seems to open the soul. The mind concentrates on breathing and something which normally gets in the way is denied headspace. A different prayer takes over. Not particularly eloquent or rehearsed. Just... "Thank you." I kept saying it in time with my breathing. And I meant it. Later it became "Help me" and I meant that too. These are not simple words. When breath itself is sought after, so is the prayer. It wasn't the race I was praying about. It was everything and it came from the core of me. I enjoyed the Plymouth half-marathon. Not least because my final prayer returned to gratitude. Beyond the finishing line I pulled up. In front of me was a man who had run the race to raise money for the Alzheimer's Society. His T-shirt read "I ran this for my dad, who doesn't know who I am." Stupid me with a tear in



my eye, thanking God for a generosity that comes from adversity.

Thank you to all our fabulous runners who took part in Paris, Rome, London and Plymouth. We are so grateful for the time, energy and commitment that everyone puts into training and fundraising. Together they have raised a combined total of over £5,500 to support the vulnerable and needy children and families of our diocese. A truly remarkable effort - you're amazing!





Bishop Mark O'Toole, accompanied by Canon Keith Mitchell, opened the Branch AGM by celebrating Mass. Bishop Mark thanked the members of CWL for their qualities of friendship and service to others; talking of Tabitha in the reading of the day from Acts of the Apostles he suggested she might have been a first century CWL member with her good works and making clothes for others and was obviously a member of a large group of like-minded women who were grieving for her passing. He also told members of the Pope's exhortation Amoris Laetitia – the joy of love which he advised members to read, but slowly. In it Pope Francis dwells on the joy of love with poetic insight.

The National President, Elizabeth Upsher addressed the members, speaking of the restructuring of the CWL to start in 2017. She reassured members that they would not see much change at section level, it was more to do with the separation of Trustees from the National Executive to satisfy the demands of the law.

The day continued after lunch with a review of activities within the Branch including the raising of funds and collection of items for Women's Refuges, the National Project this year. A total of over £500 and 493 items have been collected by members so far.

Protesting Ladies

Network Rail want to close the pedestrian crossing at Wareham railway station effectively cutting Wareham in half. There is a footbridae but it isn't accessible to mothers with prams, the disabled or the less mobile. Plans for a ramped crossing were turned down by the Purbeck District Council because it was too steep. The next plan is to build a pavement alongside



Help for the poor in India

The Society of St Vincent de Paul (SVP) hosted a **Coffee Morning at** St Mary's Church Hall, Falmouth to raise funds to support the Kanii Project, a charity run by volunteers, which supports an orphanage, school, poor villages and a **Day Care Centre** around the village of Kanji, Tamil Nadu. The first school and orphanage was in a thatched hut and was started in 1993 by Maria Rayappan from

the village. Friends in England started the charity to support Maria and there is now an orphanage for 75 children and a school with 350 children in the Kindergarten and 1,250 children in the Primary and Senior Schools.

The Kanji Project also funds the Franciscan Sisters in Pudupalayam who look after the poorest families in the local villages. The latest project, which opened in September 2015, is the Sunshine Day Care Centre which helps children with learning difficulties and physical disabilities; there are currently 15 children in the centre getting specialist help

As well as coffee and cakes, the visitors to the hall were able to buy goods brought back from India by volunteers and take part in a raffle. There were photos on display and a DVD showing life in Kanji that had been taken by Ian Parr. Ian, who together with his wife Susan attends St Mary's, visits Kanji regularly. The Coffee Morning raised £374 which will go a long way to fund the running costs of new Day Care Centre for a month.

All Saints Parish, Teignmouth

Children from Our Lady & St Patrick's RC Primary School in Teignmouth told radio listeners about what prayer means to them and describe how they pray in a programme that was broadcast on the morning of Sunday, 1st May. BBC Radio Devon's Sunday Service, a weekly act of worship led by members of Devon's faith communities, was this week recorded at Teignmouth Catholic primary school. Presenter Michael Chequer was joined by David Wells from the Diocese of Plymouth to record the show with pupils and staff from the school and local Parish Priest Fr Mark Skelton.

As well as talking about what prayer is, why they pray and how they pray, the children sang hymns and heard a Gospel story read by one of the Year 5 pupils, Ava. Our Lady and St Patrick's Head Teacher Sarah Barreto and Father Mark also spoke about the role of prayer in school life and in their own lives.

Mrs Barreto told the listeners: "We would like our children to know God, not just know about him. We would like our children to hear God, not just hear about him. As educators of children in a church school, we don't want to solely rely on learning about religion but wish instead to probe deeper and apply it in our everyday lives. People in our community do not then just hear us talking about God," she continued, "but see us, through our actions, living out our faith each and every day with all the people we meet. I truly believe that if we can encourage good practice with children and particularly when children and adults worship together, it might improve the prayer life of the whole church community."

After listening to our children being interviewed today and explaining the power that God has had in their lives, I understand that what they can teach us all is both awesome and wonderful. It's sometimes difficult to imagine what most young children pray for, and how prayer has affected their lives. But the innocence and transparency of these young people, and their love for others, will touch your heart. Jesus is the reason for all of their blessings, and they know it! They may teach adults a thing or two about the importance and power of prayer."

After the recording, Year 5 student Ava said that taking part in the show "made us think more about God and Jesus." She added: "I feel a lot closer to God and Jesus and very proud of myself for talking about how I feel about God."

Joshua from Year 5 commented: "Everyone was cheerful and singing with a smile. The atmosphere was amazing."

The programme was aired on Sunday morning at 6:30am and will be available on demand from the BBC iPlayer.
