# Column

I could call the month of October this year a "month of pilgrimage". Over the weekend of October 11 and 12, I will be leading the Annual Diocesan Pilgrimage to the Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham. Although there are many shrines to Our Blessed Lady throughout our land, Walsingham holds the title of the "National Shrine". The Diocese of Middlesbrough featured prominently in the re-establishment of the Shrine earlier last century, and, of course, with the Marist Fathers taking the role of Director of the Shrine for many years now, this has drawn our Diocese even closer to Walsingham. The origins of the Shrine go back long before the Reformation; it has always been a focus for England's great devotion to the Mother of God, earning it the wellloved title of "Dowry of Mary". I personally look forward to this pilgrimage every year and encourage as many of you as possible to join us, at least spiritually, as we give honour to Our Lady and remember there all the

needs of our Diocese. Our Lady of Walsingham Pray for us I am sure that many of you will have heard that we have been entrusted with some further relics of Blessed Nicholas Postgate and Blessed Thomas Thwing – also a priest and martyr of our area, from Heworth Hall, Heworth, York. The Archbishop of Birmingham responded positively to my request that the relics, for many years in the custody of St Mary's College, Oscott, should be loaned to our Diocese. The relics are in a sealed cabinet and will begin a round of the Diocese this month. Each parish will have the relics for a few weeks throughout the next two years. It is my hope that as a result of this, even greater devotion to Blessed Nicholas Postgate will grow and develop in our parishes. If you have a special intention, then ask the Lord to grant it through the intercession of Blessed Nicholas. Especially if there is someone close to you who is sick or in real need, then turn to the intercession of Blessed Nicholas. He was a priest and pastor of this area. He cared for the needs of our forefathers, never sparing himself. Surely he will intercede for their sons and daughters in this generation. Do not be afraid to ask the Lord for a miracle as a sign that our priest and martyr, Nicholas Postgate, is to be numbered among the saints of God.

# **Fast Day**

CAFOD's Harvest Fast Day is on Friday (October 3) and this year the Catholic aid agency is focusing on sharing what we have with others. Traditionally, harvest is a time of celebrating the abundance that

nature provides. This harvest, CAFOD would like to introduce you to someone your donations to CAFOD has helped. Her name is Yehwah, she is 37 years old and lives in Kenema, eastern Sierra Leone.


Her name means "Great Mother", which is appropriate as she regularly shares her food with other people and children. Even when it isn't harvest time, Yehwah is able to make room at her table for young and old alike. Every day she cooks for 29 students at her husband's small school, runs a business selling chillies and vegetables and works on the family farm.

Although three out of every five women and men in the district live on less than a dollar a day, the community is thriving. They suffered considerably during the country's brutal 10-year civil war and recovery is a slow process.

Yehwah says: "We had a lot of difficulty finding food after the war. The rebels burned bananas and rice. They torched homes and destroyed farms.'

She lost her father in the war but she survived by fleeing to another village where the chief's wife took her in.

"From an early age I was exposed to very hard labour," she says. "I was accepted because I was used to a hard life. That is why I am not

a weakling now."

Like any mother, she wants her children to enjoy a good life. For her husband's students, she does it because they need food to continue learning. She also wants to provide her children and others like them with the chance of the security that was denied to her.

"When I went back home after the war, I could see the ruins of our house that my father had started building. The rebels burned it to the ground. It offended me to see his hard work destroyed."

Caritas Kenema, CAFOD's local Church partner, has worked with Yehwah and her community to help them rebuild their lives. This meant long-term projects they could run and own themselves, including a community savings and loans scheme.

It has helped many people with low-cost loans to help them through the long rainy season, when food is scarce. Thank you for all the support you give - it is greatly appreciated.

# Call For Prayers Over Ebola Crisis

Caritas Kenema director Patrick Jamiru, who visited our Diocese in February, says aid work is continuing unabated despite the risks presented by the Ebola crisis currently affecting the area in which they work.

This deadly virus is causing death and misery in the West African countries of Guinea, Liberia and Nigeria, as well as Sierra Leone.

"The Ebola situation is quite serious in Kenema and Kailahun districts, which constitute Caritas Kenema's operational areas," reports Patrick.

"Kono district is also under threat. The Sierra Leone government is doing very well but requires the assistance of others to fight the epidemic. The crisis has not stopped our work, as we still go to the communities affected by the Livelihoods project implementation.

"It is a risk to go to the communities at this time, but we do not have a choice, as the interests of our poor, disadvantaged rural community are our prime concern. Please continue to keep

us in your prayers." Kenema, Kailahun and Kono districts are among the poorest and hardest places to reach in Sierra Leone, as roads are nothing more than dirt tracks that become impassable during the rainy season from May to September. This will

### A Harvest Festival For The World

CAFOD has been working with contacts in Hull to prepare a Harvest Service as part of Caritas Social Action Network (CSAN) in the Diocese. One of the group has written about their plans...

Our CAFOD Harvest Service is focusing on climate change and energy and food poverty at home and overseas.

The local CAFOD group is inviting all the parishes in the region to attend the service and to participate by collecting non-perishable food, which will be distributed through churches and organisations that run foodbanks and similar projects in the city.

Bishop Terry will preside at the service and the Lord Mayor of Hull has accepted an invitation to attend.

Norah Hanson, of the Hull CAFOD group, said: "Our focus this year will not only be on the plight of people in the developing world. We have decided to hold a Harvest Service to also focus on growing concerns around the need for foodbanks and the plight of people affected by poverty in Hull.

"In this sense we are seeking to bring together the issues of poverty overseas and at home."

At the start of the service, candles will be lit on the Chanukah, which is loaned to CAFOD each year by the Jewish community. This candelabrum was brought out of a synagogue in Berlin at the start of the Second World War.

Focussing on our Christian responsibility to respond to the cry of the poor, there will be readings from the Gospels and the book of Genesis, as well as from Pope Francis' first encyclical, *Evangelii* 

*Gaudium*, in which he says: "In all places and circumstances, Christians, with the help of their pastors, are called to hear the cry of the poor."

He quotes the Bishops of Brazil speaking out against the injustice facing the poor in their own country: "We are scandalised because we know that there is enough food for everyone and that hunger is the result of a poor distribution of goods and income."

The Harvest Service is on Sunday October 5 at 3pm in St Charles Borromeo Church, Jarratt Street. CAFOD has asked that those bringing food please deliver it to the church for 1pm. All are welcome.

hamper the response to the Ebola crisis.

More than 2,000 people have died in West Africa, predominantly in Sierra Leone and Liberia, but also in Guinea and Nigeria.

Government Health Ministries are working closely with the World Health Organisation (WHO) and nongovernmental organisations (NGOs) to contain the crisis, but cases are still being reported and in new locations, with the WHO now calling this an "international emergency". We ask for your prayers that the brave people who are treating those affected with the virus will get the help they need to bring it under control. courageous stand against war because of their religious beliefs have been remembered in a service at Richmond Castle.

The Richmond 16 refused to fight when conscription was introduced in 1916 at the height of the First World War.

Detained in the cells at Richmond Castle, they believed they were going to be executed but this did not deter them from a deeply held belief that killing their fellow men was in opposition to the teachings of Christ by which they lived.

They paved the way for a new public attitude to conscientious objection. Britain was one of the first countries to enact any kind of legal provision for conscientious objectors. Sentenced to death when they were sent to



France, this was commuted to 10 years' penal servitude, which for most of them became many years of public hostility and rejection.

We gathered in the garden where there are 16 topiaries grown to commemorate them. We placed a wreath of red poppies to remember so many who had died in the First World War, before naming each of the 16 and placing a white poppy alongside their name, circling the wreath.

In a symbolic "coincidence", there were 16 of us taking part in the commemoration.

They aren't allowed to work or to attend college in this country unless they pay, but many still manage to remain cheerful.

Father Pat Keogh greeted the group and told them how pleased we were to see them and that he hoped they felt the warmth of our welcome.

Tables in the parish hall groaned with food donated by parishioners, who sat with the visitors to share a meal and hear their stories

The children were then taken onto the beach for paddling and sandcastle building, while older visitors were taken around the town to experience the sights, including the 199 steps.

Contributions of clothes and toys were also gratefully received.

We would like to thank all those who contributed in any way and express special thanks to the asylum seekers for sharing their stories and their warm smiles.

A show that impressed audiences at this year's Edinburgh Fringe Festival is now available for viewing closer to home.


The 50-minute production, King David's Wives, is the latest from York-based Mary Callan's Blazing Grannies.

# An Email **From America**

Although August is usually a "down month" in Youth Ministry, this year it provided a huge surprise for the MYMission Team. We were contacted by Father Andrew Small OMI, National Director of the Pontifical Mission Societies in North America.

He had seen the work of the Mission Team on the internet and was particularly impressed with our use of social media, including Facebook and Twitter. Father Andrew issued an invite to a meeting in New York to plan for a more imaginative and cohesive use of the internet in the future.

Father Paul pulled rank and found himself on a plane to New York in the middle of August. The week-long trip centred around a series of day-long meetings with around 20 experts in their field.

Software guys were joined by Father Dave Dwyer, the Paulist Father responsible for the impressive youth website and radio show, Busted Halo. Julie Enzenberger, a consecrated virgin of the Diocese of Peoria, in Illinois, was also there. Julie is the web and social networking administrator for her Diocese and is also the promoter for the campaign to canonise Archbishop Fulton I Sheen. MYMission was in heady company indeed!

We need not have worried, our input was not technical but more to do with the New Evangelisation - how can we use this new technology to extend our ministry?

It may seem to many within the Church that a website, Facebook and Twitter are a luxury, something to pursue if we have time, but the reality is these tools are often the first point of contact for many when they seek us out. It is how they get their news and how they exchange information.

We relegate this technology to the "we'll do it if we have time" bracket at our peril. Now, don't tell anyone in America, but we at MYMission have to admit that our web content is all done in the "we'll do it if we have time" bracket! But a week spent in discussion of the ecclesiological possibilities rather than the technological ones opened our eyes.

During the week, Father Paul contributed heartily to the Pontifical Mission Societies' upcoming project and gained much in return. Friendship and mutual respect for each other's ministries led to an appearance, along with Father Andrew, on Father Dave Dwyer's radio show, which is broadcast nightly across the whole of the USA An unexpected invite led to MYMission helping others much further afield and we gained so much in return. We now have partners in ministry in America as well as our colleagues in this country. We support each other and help each other develop our ministries, and

# Help Us Answer Our Lady's Call!

Each year, our Diocese is challenged to ensure that every pilgrim, and especially the "supported pilgrims", can fully experience Lourdes and participate in all the services and processions that make up our week.

To do this, we rely on men and women of all ages and backgrounds coming to Lourdes as volunteer helpers in response to Our Lady's call.

Do you think you can help? Give Lourdes a try and share some of the experiences you can read about on the next page.

Our volunteer helpers, who are pilgrims themselves, strive to encounter Jesus in each pilgrim, caring for their physical, emotional and spiritual wellbeing. They include doctors, nurses, and non-medical helpers – *brancardiers* (male), handmaids (female), musicians and youth.

The purpose of pilgrimage is to grow in faith while visiting a place made holy by a sacred event that took place there. It is often as pilgrims, away from our everyday life and routine, that we experience a deepening relationship with God.

Being a volunteer at Lourdes is both a profound experience and an extraordinary privilege that we all share. As a volunteer, or helper, you are first and foremost an "active" pilgrim at the service of others.

Just as Bernadette was welcomed and accompanied at all times, we in turn should know how to welcome and accompany pilgrims, especially those who are sick or disabled and accommodated in the hospital or in hotels.

#### Healthcare Professionals

All healthcare professionals, for example doctors, nurses, physiotherapists and emergency care practitioners, are welcome.

Our nursing team consists of qualified nurses in current registration with the Nursing and Midwifery Council and retired nurses with valuable experience, along with healthcare assistants.

Currently registered nurses will be responsible for duties such as the administration of medicines and assessing and planning care for our supported pilgrims.

Nursing students can also work as volunteers in Lourdes and a reflection of this unique experience of holistic care can be included in their portfolios.

#### Brancardiers

Male helpers (or *brancardiers*, which is an old French term for stretcher-bearer) are involved in a range of duties and are primarily called on to support the pilgrimage with practical action.



Duties often include the more physical or active tasks, but there is also an important social aspect to our care, and often it can make a real difference to one of our VIP's lives by simply sitting down and talking to them. Whatever your level of physical ability, there is a role for all.

#### Handmaids

The handmaid's role is multifunctional and covers many areas. You may not wish to take on all the duties and it's absolutely fine to take on only those you feel comfortable and competent with. During our week on pilgrimage, handmaids will work on a duty rota within a team working alongside other *Hospitalité* members. Their primary role is to look after the wellbeing of the supported sick pilgrims and to ensure that they are

supported sick pilgrims and to ensure that they are treated with respect and consideration. They help with all aspects of our supported pilgrims' social care needs, assist with the washing and dressing of our for breakfast, lunch and dinner.

Spiritual needs are, of course, of primary importance to our supported pilgrims and they may wish you to accompany them to the Grotto or Stations of the Cross.

Most of our helpers work primarily with supported pilgrims from our own Diocese who stay in the hospital or *Accueil*, which means "place of welcome" and is a purpose-built modern building opened in 1997.

All volunteers are required to undertake a mandatory training session every year and will require a DBS certificate. They all travel and stay at their own expense.

During our week in Lourdes, friendships are made in a moment and last a lifetime. It's a call to service, friendship, celebration and commitment.

### A Family's Story

Way back in the 1950s, the then Head Brancardier of the Middlesbrough Pilgrimage, Leo McLoughlin, told my husband, Peter, that they needed strong young men like him to go to Lourdes as brancs.

In those days, the pilgrimage went overland by train, and cost £26, which was a lot of money. With a young family, money was tight, and there was no way we could afford it.

Leo said there was a fund for just such cases, but Peter was too proud to accept help, so I said we'd just have to pray about it. Shortly afterwards, a customer of Peter's gave him a tip for a horse called Merriman, and so he decided to back it.

The horse won, and the winnings came to exactly  $\pounds 26$ . It was clear to us that Our Lady agreed with Leo.

In the following years, Peter made sure he got to Lourdes by saving a small amount each week with Jack Wilson, who ran a savings club in the 'Lourdes Corner' at the Knights Club.

He recruited me as a handmaid, and as our children grew up, they became brancs and handmaids.

In 1995, we returned from the pilgrimage on the Friday, full of that Lourdes joy. Then on the Monday, Peter suffered a heart attack and died, but it was a great comfort to him – and to me – that he had so recently received the sacraments of Anointing and Reconciliation in Lourdes.

And he has left a wonderful legacy. We are still very much a Lourdes family. This year, he could look down on four generations of his family in Lourdes, and we are all very grateful to Peter, and to Leo and even to Merriman, but most of all to Our Lady, for the gift of Lourdes in our lives.


### A Pilgrim's Story



To get term off to an exciting start, years one and two from St Martin's Ampleforth School visited Newby Hall, near Boroughbridge, North Yorkshire.


This term the children will be learning about sculptures and the many varieties of materials that they can be made from.

# **Barney's Place Of Honour**

As someone whose childhood revolved around the Middlesbrough Diocesan Lourdes Pilgrimage, I naturally knew of Barney Connelly as a man who gave a huge amount to make it what it is today. A Lourdes legend, if you like.

Barney was made a Knight of St Gregory by the Pope in 1999 for his services to the Catholic Church. This Papal Knighthood is one of the highest honours for a Catholic layman or woman and was richly deserved.

With my memories still vivid after all those years as a pilgrim, on moving to London earlier this month, how lovely a surprise it was to see his name on full display in the book of deceased Papal Knights in no less a setting than Westminster Cathedral.

What makes the honour even more profound for me is the fact that it is shown directly beside the tomb of His Eminence Cardinal Basil Hume.

Barney ran pilgrimages to Fatima, Rome and Knock and always enjoyed going to Lourdes, which he first visited in 1950, aged 28, and continued to visit each year until 2011.

Seeing a great Middlesbrough man honoured in this way in this place made me proud to have Barney Connelly as one of our own, as I'm sure everyone else in the Diocese will be.

### What's The Bishop Going To Do About The Number Of Priests?

#### Over the summer, Bishop Terry asked me to take on the role of Vocations Director for the Diocese, following in the footsteps of Father William Massie. My thanks to him for all he has done and the help he is giving me in getting used to new responsibilities.

One thing has really surprised me. So many people have already come up to me to ask what the Bishop is going to do about the shortage of priests.

Why am I surprised? Because the responsibility of providing priests for the Diocese rests with us all and ultimately, priestly vocations are nurtured at home in your families.

Please do continue to pray hard for vocations but in those prayers, right near the top of the list, place the vocation to marriage and family life. This is where priests and religious come from.

Of course we need priests and of course, in this day and age, it is a courageous individual who will discern and test such a call. But it just might be that such an individual is also your son, or your brother, or your cousin.

I know of no priest who does not rely heavily on his family for much of the support he needs in his ministry. That is often not the product of coping with the stresses and strains of ministry, rather it is the continuing expression of mutual love and support that has always existed.

So please pray for vocations, pray for those who are courageous enough to try to answer the call, but also remember that you might just be sitting next to the person you are praying for.




