

Foreword 5

BISHOP ALAN'S FOREWORD

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

One of the most joyful moments of the last year in the Diocese was the ordination of seven new priests, one new deacon and three permanent deacons. What a great moment of grace for us – a moment of humble thanks to the Lord for his great goodness and love towards us.

There are still five seminarians studying for the priesthood and two men who are in a propadeutic year, working in Peterborough and Sawston. We also have three men studying for the permanent diaconate with two more being discerned.

Please pray for them all and pray for more to respond to God's call to serve him across the Church.

November 17, 2019, saw the launch of Caritas East Anglia, with the appointment of our Caritas Co-ordinator, Jacinta Goode, and with a lunch for homeless people in Norwich. The latter took place in the cathedral but was hosted by all our parishes with a representative from each looking after one of our guests.

There will be events during the year around the Diocese to make the work



of Caritas widely known. I am grateful to all our parishes for the ways in which you support the local work that is carried out amongst the most needy and marginalised in our society.

By the time you receive this Yearbook we will be about to begin The Year of the God who Speaks. This is to celebrate the 1,600th anniversary of the death of St Jerome who was a celebrated Scripture Scholar in the early Church. He painstakingly translated the Greek version of the Scriptures into Latin – the translation we know today as the Vulgate. He wrote many important commentaries on the Scriptures which are filled with deep spiritual wisdom.

It was St Jerome who said: "Ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ". This Year also commemorates the tenth anniversary of the Apostolic Exhortation of the

now Emeritus Pope Benedict, Verbum Domini, which is the most important document on the Word of God since the Second Vatican Council.

In it, Pope Benedict, summarised the reflections of the Synod Fathers who met in 2008 to discuss the 'word of God in the life and mission of the Church'. Among many practical suggestions, Pope Benedict called on parishes to devote time and effort to celebrations of the Word especially during the great liturgical seasons, that all Catholic families should own a Bible and keep it in a worthy place in the house, and that priests ensure their homilies "bring the scriptural message to life in a way that helps the faithful to realise that God's Word is present and at work in their everyday lives." (n. 59) The Pope reminds us that the Bible is not just simply a word from the past, but a living and timely word.

I hope that during this year, each parish, each priest, each family and each individual might explore ways in which we can make the above suggestions a reality in our own lives.

Finally, I wish to thank those who have played any part in the publication of this Yearbook. It is a record of the ongoing mission of our Diocese.

DIOCESE OF EAST ANGLIA

The Diocese of East Anglia is a suffragan diocese within the Province of Westminster, erected on 13 March 1976 by the decree Quod Ecumenicum of Pope Paul VI, using territory taken from the Diocese of Northampton, which was created in 1850. After the Reformation, the area of East Anglia was soon placed under the care of the Vicars Apostolic of the Midland District, and later of the Eastern District, until the hierarchy was restored by Pope Blessed Pius IX. Today, the Diocese incorporates the English counties of Norfolk, Suffolk and Cambridgeshire and the city of Peterborough.

THE BISHOP

The Rt Rev Alan Stephen Hopes BD AKC converted to Catholicism in 1994 and was ordained a priest of the Diocese of Westminster the following year. He worked in Kensington and Chelsea and later was appointed Vicar General of the Diocese. He was ordained to the episcopate by Cardinal Murphy-O'Connor in 2003, holding the title of Titular Bishop of Chester-le-Street, and serving as auxiliary bishop in Westminster, until he was appointed Bishop of East Anglia in 2013. He took possession of his cathedral in Norwich on 16 July 2013.

The Bishop's Predecessors

The Rt Rev Alan Charles Clark was the first bishop of the newly erected Diocese, from its creation in 1976 until his resignation in 1995. He was previously Titular Bishop of Elmham and Auxiliary Bishop of Northampton. He died in 2002 and is buried in Walsingham.

The Most Rev Peter David Smith was ordained Bishop of East Anglia by Cardinal Hume in 1995 and served as bishop until 2001, when he was translated to the See of Cardiff. In 2010, he became Archbishop of Southwark, until his retirement in 2019.

The Rt Rev Michael Charles Evans was ordained Bishop of East Anglia by Cardinal Murphy-O'Connor in 2003 and served the Diocese until his death in 2011. His corporal remains are buried in St. John's Cathedral in Norwich.

An introduction to Caritas in East Anglia

Caritas Development Worker for East Anglia, Jacinta Goode explains what Caritas East Anglia is all about and what she has been doing in the role.

■ Caritas is a Latin word meaning 'charity' or 'love in action.' With that in mind, it's easy to see why an international Catholic organisation calling itself Caritas is relevant to our faith and our mission in the world. After all, Jesus' ministry and teaching was centred around how we are to love God and our neighbour.

Caritas is inspired by Scripture, Catholic Social Teaching and by the experiences and hopes of people who are disadvantaged and living in poverty. We are all called, as Christians, to offer charity – or love – to our neighbours. Jesus commands us to 'love our neighbour as ourselves'. Indeed, Jesus goes on to tell us that on these two commandments – 'Love God' and 'love your neighbour as yourself' – hang the whole Law! (Mt 22:37-40) So this 'caritas' – this 'charity' – this 'love in action' – seems to be central to what we Christians are about

This is why Caritas was set up as an international Catholic organisation – to serve (love) God by serving (loving) our sisters and brothers in need. In England and Wales, Caritas reports to the Bishops Conference. Many dioceses (including our own) are members of the organisation, as are many charities - CAFOD, SVP, PACT and the Medaille Trust being some that are familiar to us here in East Anglia.

My role as the Caritas Development Worker is to oversee all of this love in action across the diocese. I am here to support existing projects and to help with new ones, to encourage and co-ordinate the development of this vital part of our Catholic life.

In East Anglia, many people are doing charitable work – putting their faith into action – and it's wonderful to see articles in every edition of Catholic East Anglia about these projects.

To celebrate the ways in which we're putting our faith into action we will be holding a Diocesan Caritas Festival in 2020. This will take place in various locations around the diocese and will be an opportunity to showcase your organisation and celebrate what you do. It will also be the event to go to if you'd like to get involved, but don't know how. You will be able to find out about lots of different projects, ask questions and perhaps find something that you feel drawn to. There will be Festival events in different areas of the diocese. Look out for one near you. For more information, visit: www.rcdea.org.uk/caritas-east-anglia/caritas-festival

I'm delighted to have been appointed to serve in this way in East Anglia. Through the



teachings of Jesus in the Gospels and of the Church in Catholic Social Teaching, we learn how to love our neighbour as ourselves and to value everything we have as gift from God. We are called to serve God in the poor and the marginalised. I'm excited to see how the Holy Spirit leads us to serve Him in East Anglia.

Vocations – Fr Simon Davies and Fr Alfonso Jude Belnas

Fr Simon Davies and Fr Alfonso-Jude Belnas were two of five priests ordained in Norwich in July. Here are their vocation stories.

Simon Davies was born in Cyprus, where his father was stationed in the RAF, moving to St Neots in the 1990s $\,$

■ When he was 16 he decided to restart attending Mass. He started serving at both Sunday and weekday Mass, was confirmed at 18 and was also involved with visiting the sick.

Simon continued these things at the University of East Anglia in Norwich, where he went to study History and Politics, at both the student chaplaincy and St John's Cathedral.

On completing university in 2009, he went to Oscott seminary for three years, where he studied for the priesthood and gained a Theology degree awarded by Birmingham University. Trying to discern how he should move forward, he took a break from study and went to do pastoral work in Haverhill, working at St Felix's Primary School as a teaching assistant and also in the Chaplaincy at Highpoint Prison.

While working he contemplated his vocation and explored several religious communities

before settling on the Norbertine community in Chelmsford. He also spent some time studying in Oxford for 18 months living within the Oratorian community in order to continue his priestly studies. He took his vows in 2014, but decided he would not take his final vows within this community.

In 2016, he applied to Bishop Alan to return to the Diocese as a student and was accepted. He went to St Laurence in Cambridge for a few months to be formed pastorally and recommencing his studies in September 2017 at Wonersh in Surrey.

Alfonso-Jude Belnas (from St Philip Howard, Cambridge), was trained at St Mary's Seminary, Oscott (Birmingham), he writes:


■ "My vocation has always been an experience of trusting and accepting the will of God and viewing him as a Good Shepherd. I came from a humble family with an extended family that gave me security, good moral guidance and the faith that I have now.

"My earliest recollection of the desire for priesthood was when my mother was back in the Philippines during Easter and Christmas from Hong Kong. She left the family and me when I was only six years old in order to give us a better education and life.

"I had duties and obligations in the local village chapel and the parish and was head of the parish youth ministry.

"The diocese accepted my application to enter formation in 2012 and has since given me all the resources needed, both spiritually and financially so that I would be able to undergo my seminary formation.


"A visa issue meant I had to leave Oscott for the Philippines with a broken heart. The event was a turning point in my vocation. God heard my prayers and I came back to Oscott with the visa resolved.

"Events, including my father's death in June 2016, tested my trust and became the foundation of my discernment to the priesthood. I was able to identify my failings and I was able to measure how trusting I was in God."

Vocations – Fr Richard Ireson

Former Anglican minister Richard Ireson was ordained as a priest at St John's Cathedral in Norwich on September 29. Here is his vocation story.

■ Richard (aged 73) is a retired Anglican minister who after training as a teacher, entered and served in Anglican orders for 40 years.

Training at Lincoln Theological College and specialising in rural groups and teams of parishes, he served in a variety of market towns including Grantham, Boston and Alford; in his last posting he was responsible for ten villages and creating an effective pastoral team.

Married to Janet, a teacher and with three daughters and three grandchildren life has been busy and full on the domestic front as well as following my vocation, says Richard.

"I have been blessed in my life by having a wonderful Christian family and raised in a community where the faith was taught by believers. I was taken by our faithful Anglo Catholic parish priest to the Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham at an early stage and introduced to regular disciplines such as daily Morning and Evening Prayer and confession.



Richard was educated at Nottingham High School, a pre Reformation charity foundation, by committed Christian teachers and in an open Christian ethos.

In his early teens, with the support of a convent educated grandmother and regular visits to family connections in Brussels, Richard became aware of the Worldwide Catholic Church, the Rock of Peter.

"My pilgrim path has been a long one, but I can only say that the joy and sense of arriving home at last, when I was received into the Church before the Easter Vigil at Ampleforth, Easter 2012, was a supreme moment in my life," said Richard.

"My reason for leaving the Anglican Church was chiefly the lack of true authority and a yearning to be in Communion with the Bishop of Rome. Bl John Henry Newman, Ampleforth, Belmont Abbey and Mount St Bernard's Abbey have been inspirations in the last seven years as a Catholic and together with the gracious concern and guidance of Bishop Alan the discernment process has been positive and fulfilling.

"I emphasise however, that I offered myself to Our Lord first and foremost and if the resulting outcome had been otherwise I would have accepted it without question," said Richard. "I now place myself entirely in His hands; His grace will be sufficient for this very weak vessel."

Fr David Hennessy (1928-2019)

Fr David Hennessy, a former parish priest in Felixstowe and ex-headmaster of St Joseph's College in Ipswich, has died peacefully after a long illness.

■ Bishop Alan said: "After many years of living with cancer, Fr David died very peacefully early on March 9 in the convent of Jesus and Mary in Felixstowe.



"He was aided by the prayers of his family

and some of the sisters who were with him. I am extremely grateful to the Sisters and to Carol (the Manager) who have supported him and encouraged him through these last months."

Then Brother David, of the De La Salle order, he became head of the independent St Joseph's College day and boarding school in Ipswich in the autumn of 1987, and, after leaving the order remained as head of the School.

David later trained for the Catholic priesthood at St John's Seminary, Wonersh, and was ordained in the college chapel on December 6, 1998.

He was appointed as assistant priest at All Souls', Peterborough, where he stayed until be became parish priest of Sawston in Cambridgeshire. He was transferred to St Felix parish in Felixstowe in 2007. In all three parishes in which he served he is remembered as a kind pastor, a gifted preacher and an inspiring teacher.

Fr Liam Crowley (1928-2019)

Fr Liam Crowley, formerly of the Diocese of East Anglia, died peacefully on Thursday May 23 at the age of 91, in the nursing home in Ireland where he had lived for the last six years.

■ Fr Liam was born in Ballinadee, Bandon, in County Cork. He was ordained priest by the Bishop of Clogher in June 1965 for the Sacred Heart Community. He first served in the parish of Rochester, New York, and for seven years in the Missions in the Bahamas, stationed on Abaco Island.

On returning to England he served as an Assistant in West Acton in Westminster before his appointment as an Assistant in the parish of St Michael Huntingdon. As Parish Priest he served the people of God in the parishes of St Felix, Haverhill, St Jude's Whittlesey and St Joseph's, Sheringham.

He was incardinated into the Diocese of East Anglia in February 1991 and was then appointed to St Dominic's Downham Market. He retired in 2003 and went to live in the family home in Ireland. The funeral Mass took place on May 25 in Ballinadee.

Fr Ben O'Rourke (1929-2019)

Fr Ben O'Rourke OSA, who was parish priest of the Clare Priory church of Mother of Good Counsel for 16 years, has died at the age of 90. Fr David Middleton OSA pays tribute.

■ Fr Ben came from Co Kerry in Ireland and was ordained as a priest in 1956, spending 25 years at Austin Friars School, Carlisle, where he was an inspiring teacher of English and a very successful headmaster.

In the early 1980s he was appointed to join the Augustinian community at St Mary's, Harborne in Birmingham as parish priest. And finally he served at Clare Priory for 20 years, 16 of those as parish priest. In addition he was a well-known spiritual guide. Many people are grateful to him for the counsel that they received from Fr Ben. For many, an encounter with him was a life-changing moment.

His book Finding Your Hidden Treasure is highly regarded as a guide to contemplation and prayer. And his translation of The Confessions of St Augustine from the original Latin

shows very clearly, in a modern and often poetic style, the journey of faith that make Augustine so relevant to us today.

Bishop Alan Hopes said: "Fr Ben will be remembered by many with great affection and especially for making the Confessions of St Augustine so available for our young people."

Latterly Fr Ben has been cared for by the Little Sisters of the Poor in St Joseph's care home in Harborne, Birmingham. He died on August 25, four days after his 90th birthday, and was buried at Clare on September 17.

Sr Wendy Beckett (1930-2019)

Tributes have been paid to Norfolk Catholic nun Sister Wendy Beckett who earned an international reputation as an unlikely art critic and television star.

■ Sr Wendy, who lived at the Carmelite Monastery at Quidenham for the last 40 years, died aged 88 on Boxing Day.

Born in South Africa in 1930, Sr Wendy was raised in Edinburgh where her father studied medicine.

At 16 she joined a convent and in 1950 was awarded a Congratulatory First Class degree in English literature from Oxford University. She later taught in cities including Cape Town and Liverpool.

She began studying fine art in the 1980s and wrote a book on the subject to raise money for her convent.
Contemporary Women
Artists, published in 1988, was followed by more books.



She lived a hermit-like existence in a caravan at Quidenham until 1991 when the BBC commissioned her to present a television documentary on the National Gallery in London. Sr Wendy became well-loved for her unique presenting style. She would stand in front of paintings in galleries around the world and discuss, without autocue, the work in detail.

Sr Stephanie Walters, Prioress of Quidenham Monastery, said: "Sr Wendy lived alongside us for over 40 years and was a good friend, an inspiration and totally unique.

"With her openness to God in her writing and programmes she could communicate the love and mystery of God through art and literature to many who may not otherwise hear of it. Christmas was a beautiful time for her to return to her Lord and be with him."

Bishop Alan, said: "Although Sr Wendy lived as a hermit in Quidenham, her influence and impact on many, many people across the world was enormous as she spoke simply about the love of God expressed through art.

"I am sure that her influence will go on through her writings and her recordings."







Notes to the Accounts

- 1. Although it benefits from enthusiastic and faithful volunteers, priests and religious, the Diocese of East Anglia is not financially well off. It has limited reserves or investments of its own, receives relatively small amounts through legacies and donations and has historically been reliant on raising income from its parishes. This it does by levying charges based as a percentage of parish offertory collections. The income which it receives is used to pay for the organisation and administration of all Diocesan activities, for the repairs and adaptations to its schools, for the training of future Diocesan priests and for all those services which are given to parishes without charge.
- 2. The activities of the Diocese are largely undertaken through its parishes. Of the overall diocesan finances, parishes account for over 78% of income and approximately 58% of expenditure with some 69% of the Diocesan charity's net assets being held at parochial level. The work of the parishes involves amongst other things the pastoral care of the Roman Catholic and general community of the parish and maintenance and upkeep of places of worship.

3. An ongoing fund-raising campaign, Alive in Faith, has been undertaken since February 2015. This has four primary aims to provide funding for the following:

- Training of future priests
- Support of retired clergy
- Special parish projects
- Social outreach
- 4. During the year ending on 31 December 2018 £6,349,824 was the total committed in pledges over five years, and £1,130,646 income from these pledges was recognised in the year. Expenditure in this year was £346,610 on Seminarians, Parish Projects and Social Outreach grants. Total fundraising costs over the 5 years are expected to be around 16% of the amount raised.
- 5. At 31 December 2018 the Diocese's reserves centrally stood at £10m. Of this, £3.1m is restricted to particular uses and £4.4m has been designated by the Trustees for certain specific purposes.
- 6. Of the remaining reserves parochial funds amount to £21.9m of which £13.96m is represented by fixed assets in the form of churches and other property which are required for the purposes of the Diocese and could not be realised without undermining its work. This leaves free parochial reserves of £7.94m which represents around 2 years' total parochial expenditure and levy charges. This level of reserves is considered necessary by the Trustees to enable the parishes to conduct their work in an orderly and efficient manner as well as providing income through investments to supplement the amounts received by donations.
- 7. This leaves general reserves at the Diocese amounting to £2.5m which are free reserves whose use is unrestricted. This represents over 2 years' unrestricted Diocesan expenditure and is considered necessary in order for the Diocese to continue supporting and advising the parishes. The Trustees are anticipating a gradual reduction in the Diocese's overall free reserves, as they are used to provide the support necessary for the Diocese to fulfil its objects.

DIOCESAN CALENDAR FOR EAST ANGLIA 2020

"Christ's saving work is celebrated in sacred memory by the Church on fixed days throughout the course of the year. Each week on the day called the Lord's Day the Church commemorates the Lord's resurrection. Once a year at Easter the Church honours the resurrection of the Lord and his blessed passion with the utmost solemnity. In fact, through the yearly cycle the Church unfolds the entire mystery of Christ and keeps the anniversaries of the saints."

(GNLY 1)

Preliminary Notes

- This Calendar is based on the GENERAL ROMAN CALENDAR, the NATIONAL CALENDAR as contained in the Roman Missal (2010) and the revised DIOCESAN CALENDAR.
- The titular and anniversary of dedication of each church are kept as Solemnities. Lest they be overlooked, it is advisable to mark them in this Calendar.
- Local observances are permitted of Saints or Beati connected in some way with the locality, as through birth, ministry, death, or custody of major relics. The Bishop should be consulted in each instance.
- On the 'green' ferias *per annum* (of the year) a wide choice of Mass formula is available: EITHER of *any* of the 34 Sundays *per annum* (with the prayers of the Sunday selected, or of another Sunday, or those provided *ad diversa*), OR of any Saint mentioned on that day in the Martyrology, OR of any votive Mass or Mass *ad diversa*, OR of any Mass for the dead (provided that the daily Mass formula is only used when the Mass is, in fact, applied for the dead).

The Requiem Mass which forms part of the funeral rite is allowed on any day except the Paschal Triduum, the Sundays of Advent, Lent and Easter, and the Holydays of Obligation.

- The *Gloria* is said on all Sundays (apart from Advent and Lent), Solemnities, Feasts, and other solemn celebrations, but not on Memorials. The *Credo* is said on Sundays and Solemnities, and is also allowed at other solemn celebrations.
- THE LECTIONARY. On Sundays, Cycle A (Year 1) is to be used until the First Sunday of Advent, when Cycle B (Year 2) begins. The weekday readings are of Year 2. Attention is drawn to the section headed 'Principles of Choice' in the introduction. A decided preference is expressed for continuous readings, as provided for the weekdays throughout the year, even though a Memorial occurs (apart from the few instances noted in the Calendar of a strictly proper reading). The 1981 Lectionary provides readings for Feasts observed in this country (Vol II, pp 1316 and fol). For other Solemnities and Feasts lacking proper readings, the appropriate Common should be used, while suitable readings may be chosen for special celebrations.
- As Eucharistic Prayer IV must always be used with its own preface, the days on which it may not be used have been indicated by the note 'Not EP IV'.

The Eucharistic Prayer for Masses for Various Needs and Eucharistic Prayers for Reconciliation also have integral prefaces, and may not be used on Sundays or days when EP IV is not permitted.

- Parish priests are bound to offer Mass for their people on all Sundays and Holydays of Obligation.
- The necrology includes all clergy of the former Northampton Diocese from the year

1850. Places in parenthesis are where priests died or retired from. Any errors or omissions in the necrology of diocesan clergy should be notified to the Bishop's Personal Assistant

NATIONAL CYCLE OF PRAYER

Introduction

In the Catholic tradition the human experience of time is used as a way of engaging us with the saving mystery of Christ's passion, death and resurrection. The cycle of days, weeks and the whole year is, for this reason, of supreme importance in Christian worship.

Each week, on the day called the Lord's Day, the Church commemorates the Lord's resurrection. Once a year, at Easter, the Church honours this resurrection and passion with the utmost solemnity. Through the yearly cycle the Church unfolds the entire mystery of Christ and keeps the anniversary of the saints.

All other celebrations need to find their proper place in the Calendar so that the principal mysteries of the redemption do not lose their appropriate prominence.

Amongst these other celebrations, from the earliest times have been the rogation and ember days, days of prayer for particular need or in thanksgiving for particular blessings of the Lord. Since 1972, the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales has preferred to drop all distinction between ember and rogation days, and to speak simply of Days of special prayer.

In 1972, six such days were introduced, but in the years which followed the number of such days increased to such an extent that they risked intruding on the celebration of the liturgical year, and especially on the celebration of the Lord's Day on Sundays. Subsequently the Bishops' Conference concluded that from Advent 1996 these Days of special prayer be subsumed into and replaced by a Cycle of Prayer.

The Cycle of Prayer seeks to preserve the integrity of the Sunday liturgy, without losing sight of the importance of being united with the universal or local Church in praying and working for important intentions. It seeks to do this by encouraging the faithful to pray for the intentions set out in the Cycle in their personal prayers throughout the period specified, and not only at Mass on a particular day.

The Cycle of Prayer is based on a division of the year into six periods, three of these being the principal liturgical seasons of Advent/Christmas; Lent and Easter and the other three periods being divisions of Ordinary Time, namely Winter, Summer and Autumn.

Each of these six periods is allocated its proper series of intentions for prayer, which may be taken up by both individuals and parishes and other groups throughout the season. Each individual intention also has its particular focal point, ie a particular celebration or Day of Prayer ordered by the Holy See.

How might a parish keep the Cycle of Prayer?

Outside of the Liturgy

■ Intentions for the whole period might be listed in the parish newsletter or printed on a prayer card so as to help individual parishioners keep in mind and pray for the intentions for that period.

- Publicity and informational material might be displayed on parish noticeboards.
- Prayer-focuses may be placed in an appropriate place in the Church following the example of the candle symbol popularised by Amnesty International.
- Parish meetings might be arranged so as to better inform parishioners about the particular objects of the intention (eg peace, Christian unity, the place and role of women in the Church and the world, the sick, sea-farers, racial justice, prisoners and their families). This will also give the opportunity for parishioners to learn how they might become actively involved in working for the fulfilling of the intentions for which they pray.
- Retiring collections might be taken to support particular forms of pastoral activity.

Within the Liturgy

Mass

- On the Day of Special Prayer itself, and especially on Sundays, it is appropriate to announce the Day of Special Prayer in the opening remarks at the beginning of Mass, and for the special intention to be included in the Prayer of the Faithful (Bidding Prayers). Care should be taken that the remaining petitions of the Prayer of the Faithful should be formulated in accordance with the norms given in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal.
- When a Day of Prayer or other observance falls on a Sunday, the Mass and Lectionary texts of the Sunday are normally to be used.
- On weekdays the use of suitable 'Masses for Various Needs and Occasions' or 'Votive Masses' should be considered to support the marking of the Day of Prayer. The readings assigned for each day in the Lectionary for weekdays should not be omitted too frequently and without sufficient reason. It is often more fruitful to explore any special intentions through the readings assigned to the day, than to choose from the Common those which may appear at first sight more appropriate to the intention.
- The homily at Mass is necessary for the nurturing of the Christian life. It should develop some aspect of the readings from the scriptural readings or liturgical texts of the Mass, while taking into account the mystery being celebrated or the needs proper to the listeners. The homily should not be narrowly confined to the intention of the Cycle of Prayer alone, nor be replaced by a non-homiletic talk or an appeal for money.

Other Liturgies and Celebrations

- When it is desired to have a form of extended prayer for one of the intentions in the Cycle of Prayer, serious consideration should be given to holding a special non-eucharistic service for that purpose, such as a Vigil, the Evening Prayer of the Church, a Liturgy of the Word, or a procession with litanies.
- Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, 'which must clearly express the cult of the Blessed Sacrament in its relationship to the Mass', should also be considered. It should be noted that there is specific provision within this rite for special prayers.
- When considering how particular intentions are to be presented and marked within a parish, every effort should be made to extend the invitation to participate in this to all members of the parish, including the younger members of the parish, and the housebound.

Each of the 51 parishes within the Diocese of East Anglia will be allocated **one week** during the year during which to pray, not only for the Intentions of the National Cycle of Prayer, but also for Vocations to the Priesthood and to the Religious Life, and the Needs and Intentions of the Diocese. During this week, each Parish shall also have the opportunity to celebrate 40 Hours of Eucharistic Adoration, including as they do so, the specific prayers and initiatives of the New Evangelisation.

THE NATIONAL CYCLE OF PRAYER

During Ordinary Time – (Winter) i.e. up to Lent, we are asked to pray for these intentions:

Peace on Earth: especially on 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time and on Racial Justice Day which occurs three Sundays before the 1st Sunday of Lent. The World Day of Prayer for Peace is marked on 1 January. As this day is when the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God and it is the beginning of the new year in England, the day is transferred to 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time. There may be a collection on this day for the work of Pax Christi. The day of prayer for Racial Justice is organised by the ecumenical Churches' Commission for Racial Justice. Within the Catholic Church material is distributed by Catholic Association for Racial Justice (CARJ) for whom a collection may be taken on this day.

Praver:

O God of peace, who are peace itself and whom a spirit of discord cannot grasp, nor a violent mind receive, grant that those who are one in heart may persevere in what is good and that those in conflict may forget evil and so be healed.

Roman Missal

Christian Unity: especially during the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity: 18–25 January. The Week of was originally begun in 1908 by the American Episcopalian clergyman Paul Wattson who later became a Catholic. The Week begins on 18 January and ends on 25 January—the Feast of the Conversion of St Paul. Material for the Week of Prayer is prepared in collaboration by Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity and The Commission on Faith and Order of the World Council of Churches. Each year this material is produced by Christians in a different country.

Praver:

May the divisions among Christians be overcome so that we may hasten to your eternal Kingdom in the perfect communion of the Church cf. Roman Missal

Victims of Trafficking: especially on feast of St Josephine Bakhita — 8 February. St Josephine Bakhita is the Sudanese Saint who at the age of nine was kidnapped and sold into slavery. She suffered terribly at the hands of her kidnappers so much so that she forgot her birth name. Her kidnappers gave her the name 'Bakhita' which means 'Fortunate'.

Praver

O God, who led Saint Josephine Bakhita from abject slavery to the dignity of being your daughter and a bride of Christ, grant, we pray, that by her example we may show constant love for the Lord Jesus crucified, remaining steadfast in charity and prompt to show compassion.

Roman Missal

The Sick and Those Who Care for Them: especially on World Day of Prayer for the Sick — 11 February. 11 February is the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. On this the Church all to pray and give attention to the sick and those who care for them. Each year the Holy Father writes a message.

Prayer

Accept the prayers we offer for our brothers and sisters who are ill, that, having been

anxious for them in their danger, we may rejoice at their recovery of health. cf. Roman Missal

The Unemployed: especially on the Sunday before Ash Wednesday. The Day of Prayer for the Unemployed was organised by Church Action on Poverty. They have recently renamed their day as Poverty Action Sunday. Caritas-Social Action is the agency in the Catholic Church which acts an umbrella for many diocesan and local organisations concerned with poverty and other social issues.

Prayer

O God, the source of human dignity, in your image every person is fashioned and by your Son all people are redeemed.

Make us honour the work of your hands, that we may reverence you in those whom the world considers least and serve you in all whom society neglects.

During Lent we are asked to pray for these intentions:

Candidates for the Sacraments: especially on the Sundays of Lent

For those preparing to be initiated into the Church at Easter, Lent marks the final stage of preparation, the period of Purification and Enlightenment. It begins with the Rite of Election on the First Sunday of Lent. During the season of Lent the Scrutinies are celebrated on the 3rd, 4th and 5th Sundays in preparation for Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. Many parishes will also receive candidates for Reception into the Church.

'The people of God, as represented by the local Church, should understand and show by their concern that the initiation of adults is the responsibility of all the baptised.'

'During Lent, the period of purification and enlightenment, the faithful should take care to participate in the rites of the scrutinies and presentations and give the elect the example of their own renewal in the spirit of penance, faith, and charity. At the Easter Vigil, they should attach great importance to renewing their own baptismal promises.' RCIA 9

The celebration of other Sacraments, such as Confirmation and First Holy Communion, will often take place within the Easter season so that candidates for these Sacraments will also be preparing in Lent. These candidates should also be remembered in the prayers of the community.

Prayer

Father of love and power, it is your will to establish everything in Christ and to draw us into his all- embracing love.

Guide the elect of your Church, strengthen them in their vocation, build them into the kingdom of your Son, and seal them with the Spirit of your promise.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

The Needy and Hungry of the World; especially on Lenten Fast Day —Friday of the first week in Lent.

The agency for overseas development, CAFOD, encourages the Church in England and Wales to use the Friday of the first week in Lent as an opportunity to remember the needy and hungry of the world. The day is an opportunity the three Lenten disciplines of Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving which derive from the proclamation of the Word on Ash Wednesday.

The proceeds from the practice of fasting on the Friday are usually collected at Mass on the 2nd Sunday of Lent.

All powerful Father, God of goodness, you provide for all your creation. Give us an effective love for our brothers and sisters who suffer from lack of food. Help us do all we can to relieve their hunger, that they may serve you with carefree hearts.

Roman Missal

Women's World Day of Prayer; especially on 1st Friday in March

Women's World Day of Prayer is a worldwide movement of Christian women who come together to observe a common day of prayer held on the first Friday in March each year, and who, in many countries, have a continuing relationship in prayer and service. Through Women's World Day of Prayer women are encouraged to become aware of their talents and use them in the service of the wider community.

Prayer

Father, you have given all peoples one common origin, and your will is to gather them as one family in yourself.

Fill the hearts of all women with the fire of your love and the desire to ensure justice for all.

Hear the prayers offered you by women throughout the world for an end to all division, and a human society built on love and peace.

Penitents and Wanderers:

The twin themes of Lent are baptism and penance. Lent is a time of reflection and preparation for Easter. Many parishes offer opportunities for the celebration of the Sacrament of Penance in the Lenten season. In recent years some parishes have explored using the Lenten period as a time to assist those returning to the Church after a period of not being active in the life of the Church. This reflects the ancient practice of the Order of Penitents which reached its end on the morning of Holy Thursday.

PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

The Mass of the Lord's Supper is celebrated in the evening; crosses may be veiled in white and the altar decorated with flowers in moderation. The tabernacle should be entirely empty and sufficient hosts consecrated for today and tomorrow. The Altar of Repose should be decorated with flowers and candles. While the *Gloria* is sung, all the bells in the church are rung and then remain silent until the *Gloria* of the Easter Vigil. During the same period, the organ and other musical instruments may be used only to support the

singing. The Washing of Feet may take place during the Mass. Following the Prayer after Communion, the Blessed Sacrament is taken to the Altar of Repose where it is kept in a tabernacle. Solemn Adoration may not continue after midnight. After the Blessed Sacrament has been transferred, the altar is stripped of all cloths, cross and candles.

The Church has long celebrated the agricultural harvest. This intention also includes all human work. In all circumstances of human life there are choices to be made regarding the environment and our reverent stewardship of the God's gift of creation.

"The external deserts in the world are growing, because the internal deserts have become so vast. Therefore the earth's treasures no longer serve to build God's garden for all to live in, but they have been made to serve the powers of exploitation and destruction" (Benedict XVI, homily at Inaugural Mass, 2005).

On December 3rd the Church commemorates St Francis Xavier. This is the day chosen by the Pontifical Council for the Pastoral Care of Migrants and Itinerant People to mark World Migration Day. Each year there is a message from the Holy Father reflecting on the 'signs of the times'.

"Asylum seekers and refugees - I wish to underline how the tendency is to stop at the question of their arrival while disregarding the reasons for which they left their native land." [Benedict XVI - Message for World Migration day 2005]

In your kindness watch over refugees and exiles, those separated from their loved ones, young people who are lost, and those who have left or run away from home. 
