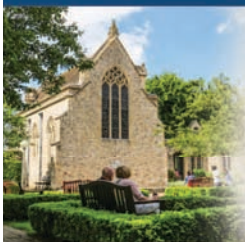

BISHOP ALAN'S FOREWORD

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Welcome to the 2021 Yearbook and Liturgical Calendar for the Diocese of East Anglia. Once again, I would like to thank all those who have contributed to its publication this year.

There is so much to be grateful for as we look back on the year 2021 and, as a Diocese, we can say with renewed conviction that the blessings of the Lord are indeed renewed every day.

Over the year we have witnessed our Catholic communities gradually overcoming the fear and isolation brought about by the pandemic and once again coming together as the Family of God to celebrate the Mass as the heart of all that we are and do. It seems entirely providential that this has been the Year of the Family, since it has been a time when, as families, we have been able to reconnect, reaffirm our bonds with each other and celebrate our common faith in the Lord Jesus Christ.



As a Diocese, we have launched many initiatives this year to further strengthen our families, giving special care to any who might have felt downcast or marginalised by the events they have been through. There have been Masses for couples who have experienced miscarriages or infertility, and retreats for men and women and for those recovering from the distressing experience of abortion.

In this 150th anniversary year of St Joseph as Protector of the Church, Fr Luke Goymour has painted an icon of the saint which is now on a journey through every parish of the Diocese, so that each community can entrust their own families to the prayers of the foster father who cared so faithfully for Mary and for our Lord Himself.

It is only right that the Church should lead the way as society reopens, and during the year we relaunched the Commission for the New Evangelisation. In line with the desires of all the Bishops of England and Wales, this will help us to reach out not just to the fearful or disconnected, but also to those who in a time of pandemic have been searching for deeper meaning and are curious as to what the Catholic Faith can offer.

Once again this year, our Diocese has been blessed by the arrival of new priests. Fr Dennis Gallagher has joined us from the Irish Archdiocese of Tuam, and Fr Alban Hood from Douai Abbey has taken over the important role of chaplain at Fisher House in Cambridge. He replaces Fr Mark Langham who died at the beginning of this year after struggling with a long illness. We also welcome back Fr Paul Maddison, who takes on a new role as one of the Diocesan Environmental Team. After completing his studies at the Beda in Rome, Fr Michael Smith was ordained in St John's Cathedral, where he is also beginning his ministry among us.

As a Diocese, we are greatly enriched by the presence among us of Radio Maria England. This year we said farewell to Fr Sam Randall who, after launching the station in Cambridge, has taken on another pioneering role with Radio Maria in Australia. Fr Sam looks to Radio Maria Austria as his model, so it is indeed a gift that Fr Andreas Schätzle, the experienced Director of Radio Maria Austria, has now moved into our Diocese to continue the work which Fr Sam began.

We have also made new appointments to the Diocesan curia. Eloise Limmer, who takes on a new role as a part-time Historic Churches Support Officer, has already helped us to secure grants to improve some of the many beautiful buildings which provide us with places for prayer and community life. As a Diocese we are immensely grateful to Historic England for the generous grants that have been made towards the upkeep of some of our historic churches – the Cathedral, St Mary's Great Yarmouth, St Peter Gorleston and Our Lady of Consolation and St Stephen, Lynford. This will ensure that these churches are preserved for future generations.

Sandra Portas has also joined us as part-time Stewardship and Fundraising Officer and is working with individual parishes as they consider how to put their time, talents and treasures at the service of the Church which means so much to them.

One of the strengths of the Catholic Church in this country has, for many years, been its schools, and we are delighted as a Diocese to be opening the St John Henry Newman Catholic Primary School in Peterborough. It is the first brand-new Catholic school to be built in this country for more than ten years. The turf has already been cut on the site, and we hope to welcome the first students in autumn 2022. We have also been pleased to appoint Flavio Vettese as CEO of the Walsingham Multi Academy Catholic Trust. Sadly, Julie, O'Connor, our Diocesan Director for Schools, will be retiring from the post she has held for many years at Easter 2022. We shall miss her great expertise and leadership but wish her well for the coming years.

Towards the end of this year, we began as a Diocese to walk the Synodal path, which is enabling Catholic communities across the world to prepare for the next Synod of Bishops, to take place in Rome in 2023. It is a path on which we have a renewed opportunity to converse with each other as we journey together as the Pilgrim People of God.

In this process of listening to the Holy Spirit and to each other, we will come to recognise anew the immense gift of our Catholic faith, and the strength which comes from being part of a believing community. "Confidence placed in the Church and steadfastly maintained," wrote the great Catholic theologian Henri de Lubac, "is the first condition of all rejuvenation and progress." It is in that spirit of confidence that we look towards the coming year, in expectation of the new mercies which the Lord Jesus Christ will show us.

DIOCESE OF EAST ANGLIA

The Diocese of East Anglia is a suffragan diocese within the Province of Westminster, erected on 13 March 1976 by the decree *Quod Ecumenicum* of Pope Paul VI, using territory taken from the Diocese of Northampton, which was created in 1850. After the Reformation, the area of East Anglia was soon placed under the care of the Vicars Apostolic of the Midland District, and later of the Eastern District, until the hierarchy was restored by Pope Blessed Pius IX. Today, the Diocese incorporates the English counties of Norfolk, Suffolk and Cambridgeshire and the city of Peterborough.

THE BISHOP

The Rt Rev Alan Stephen Hopes BD AKC converted to Catholicism in 1994 and was ordained a priest of the Diocese of Westminster the following year. He worked in Kensington and Chelsea and later was appointed Vicar General of the Diocese. He was ordained to the episcopate by Cardinal Murphy-O'Connor in 2003, holding the title of Titular Bishop of Chester-le-Street, and serving as auxiliary bishop in Westminster, until he was appointed Bishop of East Anglia in 2013. He took possession of his cathedral in Norwich on 16 July 2013.

The Bishop's Predecessors

The Rt Rev Alan Charles Clark was the first bishop of the new Diocese, from its creation in 1976 until his resignation in 1995. He was previously Titular Bishop of Elmham and Auxiliary Bishop of Northampton. He died in 2002 and is buried in Walsingham.

The Most Rev Peter David Smith was ordained Bishop of East Anglia by Cardinal Hume in 1995 and served as bishop until 2001, when he was translated to the See of Cardiff. In 2010, he became Archbishop of Southwark, until his retirement in 2019. He died in 2020 and is buried in Southwark Cathedral.

The Rt Rev Michael Charles Evans was ordained Bishop of East Anglia by Cardinal Murphy-O'Connor in 2003 and served the Diocese until his death in 2011. His corporal remains are buried in St John's Cathedral in Norwich.

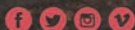

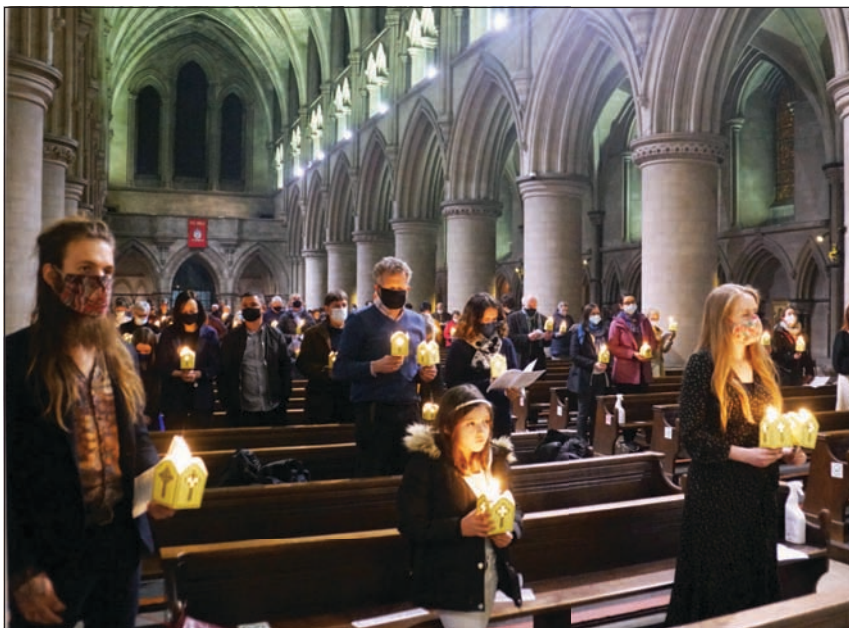

Father Michael Smith

After spending most of the last four years studying at the Pontifical Beda College in Rome, Deacon Michael Smith was ordained a priest in the Diocese of East Anglia on Saturday July 3. Keith Morris reports.

■ The Mass of Ordination took place in front of a socially distanced congregation of up to 150 people and 25 priests at the Cathedral of St John the Baptist in Norwich and was celebrated by Bishop Alan Hopes.

Fr Michael had recently arrived back from Rome after a 10-day period of Covid-19 quarantine. Aged 57, he has worked for 20 years on the Cambridge Science Park in a publishing role for the Royal Society of Chemistry.

During his ordination homily, Bishop Alan said: “Dear brother, dear Michael, you have been chosen out of the priestly people of God, to be set apart to share in his High priesthood so that you can serve his holy people. You are called, in a special way, through your life and through your ministry, to proclaim to God’s people and to the world that Christ is risen.

“As you reconcile men and women to God through the Sacrament of Confession, anoint the sick, celebrate the Sacraments and carry out your pastoral ministry in many

different ways, you will encounter the Lord you serve. Conversely, your ministry will invite the people you serve to encounter the Risen Lord Jesus Christ, to touch his glorious wounds, where they will find resurrection and hope in his healing presence.”

Speaking about his ministry, Fr Michael said: “I don’t think you can ever feel fully prepared for it but ultimately it is about trusting in God that he will give you the strength to do his work – which is really important, because it is not about me and what I can do, although I will bring my talents to the role. It is really about letting God work through us so that we can serve one another and we can love and help one another, particularly after the pandemic. There is lots to do to reconnect people and to be of service to one another to build community again.”

Talking about his journey to the priesthood, Fr Michael said: “I had a sense of being called to ministry in my 20s and I joined a religious order and spent three years with them. I left them as I wanted to be absolutely sure that this is what I wanted to commit the rest of my life to.

“I then got involved in a career in science publishing, which was quite absorbing. It did not take me away from the church or from prayer but it did take me away from thinking about the priesthood. But the little voice inside never went away and so in the end, if you start to listen to it, it comes up stronger.

“In my first year as a priest I am really looking forward to working with people and helping them in their faith and in their prayer life. Also to be involved in a parish community as someone who can hopefully make a difference and grow and strengthen our community at this difficult time we have been through,” said Fr Michael. “It is not all about me helping others but us all helping each other and ministry in the church is very collaborative and everyone brings their talents to build the Kingdom of God.”

Paul Raynes and Gianluca Savini

Two students for the Permanent Diaconate in the Diocese of East Anglia took important steps forward at a Mass in St John the Baptist Cathedral in Norwich on Saturday September 4. Assistant Director of the Permanent Diaconate, Deacon John Bell reports.

■ Gianluca Savini from Our Lady and the English Martyrs, Cambridge, and Paul Raynes from St Etheldreda's, Ely, were instituted into ministries as part of their preparation for ordination as permanent deacons. Gianluca became an Acolyte and Paul became a Lector.

An acolyte is commissioned by the Church to assist priests and deacons in the Mass, to take Communion to the sick and to lead Eucharistic Adoration or services. A lector is commissioned to proclaim the Word of God both in the liturgy and as a catechist. Unlike ordinary Eucharistic ministers or readers, the role of acolyte or lector is not limited to a specific parish or to a specific period of time.

In his homily, Bishop Alan Hopes addressed both men in their new ministries, concluding: "In all of this dear Gianluca and Paul, seek to keep your eyes fixed on Jesus Christ. As you grow closer to Him, so your lives will become more and more conformed to His so that you might become ambassadors of His life to others."

A permanent deacon is typically married and is in full-time work. Gianluca Savini is married to Erminia and they have four children. He runs his own business and was previously a research scientist.

Paul Raynes is married to Sarah and they have four children. Paul is Director of Strategy and Planning of the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority and was previously a diplomat.

For each, formation as a permanent deacon has come as part of a long journey of faith. Gianluca came from a non-religious family, but came to faith at university. He has been a catechist and served on the altar. Paul was born into a Catholic family and attended Catholic schools. He has been active in his parish, particularly as a catechist.

Permanent deacons can be ordained at any age between 35 and 65. Anyone interested in the permanent diaconate should talk first with their parish priest.

Monsignor Mark Langham

Catholic Chaplain to the University of Cambridge, Mgr Mark Langham, a former Administrator of Westminster Cathedral, died on January 15, after a long battle with cancer.

■ From 2013 to his death, Mgr Mark served as Catholic Chaplain to the University of Cambridge – a place he studied Classics in 1979.

A few weeks before his death, he wrote to the community at Fisher House, the university's Catholic chaplaincy, thanking them for their support and prayers and insisting he didn't want any "fuss" as he moved into a hospice for end-of-life care:

"I have had a wonderful and varied ministry and priesthood, and undertaken extraordinary tasks, but none

has thrilled and delighted me like the chaplaincy at Fisher House. The opportunity to encounter and influence the young people, to be fired by your enthusiasm and holiness, and to build the wider community, has given me great hope for the future of the Church and of our society."



Bishop Alan Hopes paid tribute, saying: "The Diocese of East Anglia has reason to be grateful to Mgr Mark for his wonderful and fruitful work at Fisher House among the Catholic and many other students of Cambridge University. Also for his support and encouragement for many of our clergy in the work of spiritual direction and assisting in the work of ongoing formation. Our prayers and thoughts are with his family and the members of the Cambridge Catholic Chaplaincy at this time. May he rest in peace."

On learning of Mgr Mark's death, Cardinal Vincent Nichols, Archbishop of Westminster said: "Since March 2020, 18 priests of Westminster Diocese have died. The latest sad death is that of Mgr Mark. Each of these priests contributed mightily to the work of the Church, as did Mgr Mark. We pray for them all, and today we pray especially for Mgr Mark. May they rest in peace and rise in glory."

Diocese of East Anglia Chancellor, Mgr Eugène Canon Harkness, paid tribute saying:

"Mgr Mark has left a huge legacy of pastoral care throughout his priestly life. He is now called on to continue his work of intercession for us as we will for him. We thank God for the gift of his life and commend him into His care that he may rest in peace and rise in glory."

A staff member of the Vatican's Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity from 2009-2013, Mgr Mark. retained his great interest in ecumenism when he returned from Rome to join the chaplaincy team at Cambridge University.

Before his death, Mgr Mark. thanked Addenbrooke's Hospital in Cambridge for their "wonderful treatment" that enabled him to "lead a full and active ministry" towards the end.

Mgr Mark. died peacefully at the Hospice of St John and St Elizabeth, St John's Wood, London where he received end-of-life care since January 6.

Deacon Chris Heath

Chris Heath, who served for twenty-four years as a Deacon in the Diocese, passed away just before Holy Week. John Morrill writes an appreciation of his ministry.

■ Deacon Chris Heath was ordained as a permanent deacon for the diocese of East Anglia on the Feast of SS Peter and Paul 1996, one of eight men ordained by Bishop Peter Smith that day. Bishop Peter took them aside one by one and told them that their first vocation was to their wives and children, their second vocation was in jobs that had in the community and that the Church would gratefully accept what was left over. This was very much how Chris saw his calling.

His life with his wife Eilish was very much a partnership in prayer and service and indeed I was not alone of thinking not of Chris and Eilish but ChrisEilish, without a hyphen. He was deeply committed to his children and more recently grandchildren.

He had a career with the Inland Revenue, and then as a kind of gamekeeper-turned-poacher, he helped



people with their tax affairs, most notably a good many of the clergy. Indeed, it was life with the Inland Revenue that had him moving round the country until the family came to Bury St Edmunds in the 1970s, which is where he spent his last 50 years.

Chris was from a large Catholic family – the youngest of eight – and a devout family (two of his five brothers were priests, one of them, Bernard, also serving in East Anglia, and his brother Jim a deacon also, and Eilish came baptised in the holy waters of Ireland).

Chris was active in the life of St Edmund's parish from the moment they arrived and his calling to the diaconate was nurtured especially by Fr John Drury when he was parish priest, with his deep pastoral approach and commitment to collaborative ministry, and to working with other Christians. All these became an important part of Chris's witness.

He and Eilish helped to develop the prayer life of the parish and led days of prayer and recollection as part of the ministry of Sr Kathleen O'Sullivan during her years in the convent of the sisters of St Louis in Newmarket. For many years they continued in this work, especially in an ecumenical retreat house at Wenham, near Southwold. When he was in formation, Chris began a prayer group for the six men based in Cambridgeshire and West Suffolk which met monthly in the homes of each of them in turn and had a profound effect on the lives of all of them in their ministries.

He was very much at peace in his relationship with God, but he was often very restless in his relationship with the world (and even with the Church) and he felt, perhaps more than he needed to, hemmed in by rules and regulations. But there was about him a generosity of spirit, a love and respect for all, that made him an outstanding companion to those families he worked with in preparation for baptisms, weddings and funerals. Alongside this work and his support for the outreach activities of the parish, his main ministry was (again alongside Eilish) in West Suffolk Hospital where he brought peace and understanding to the sick and the dying. There was also a notable ecumenical ministry and they were key members of a team of more than 70 chaplains and volunteers.

In the last years of his life, he suffered from dementia and just before Covid lockdown, he moved into a care-home near Stowmarket. Chris died after a short final illness in West Suffolk Hospital just before Holy Week, and his Requiem Mass for his family and close friends was held in the parish church he loved at the end of Easter Week.

At his ordination, Bishop Peter Smith handed him the book of the gospels and said: "Chris, receive the Gospel of Christ whose herald you now are: believe what you read, teach what you believe, and practice what you teach." And in a new way, with sacred visibility, that is what he did, with humility and faith, for 24 years and nine months. May he rest in peace and rise in glory.

HRH the Duke of Edinburgh

Two solemn Requiem Masses for the repose of the soul of His Royal Highness the Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, who died aged 99 at Windsor Castle on April 9, were celebrated in the Diocese of East Anglia in Norwich and King's Lynn.

■ Lady Dannatt, the Lord Lieutenant of Norfolk, attended a Requiem Mass which Bishop Alan Hopes celebrated at St John's Cathedral.

In his homily, Bishop Alan recalled the funeral ceremony in 2011 of Otto von Habsburg, the last Crown Prince of the Austro-Hungarian Empire. Following a Mass at St Stephen's Cathedral in Vienna, his cortège made its way to the Franciscan Capuchin church. The chamberlain knocked on the door with his staff and from within a friar asked: "Who seeks entry?"

The chamberlain answered "Otto Von Habsburg", followed by all his royal and noble titles. The friar responded: "We do not know him." Again, the chamberlain struck the door, and this time announced Otto von Habsburg's great achievements. Once more the friar replied: "We do not know him." Finally, the chamberlain knocked and announced: "Otto von Habsburg, a mortal, sinful man." This time the friar answered: "Thus you may enter."

We remember Philip Mountbatten, said Bishop Alan, in the same way. He recalled the royal titles – a grandson of Queen Victoria, a prince of Greece and Denmark then of the United Kingdom – and also his “diverse and extraordinary achievements”, including the creation of the Duke of Edinburgh Awards, patronage of some 800 societies and promotion of important causes, notably the environment.

Yet, said Bishop Alan, in the words of the psalmist, we are not to put our trust in princes, but to put our hope in the Lord our God, and so “we stand before the Lord and we pray for Philip, a mortal, sinful man, just like each one of us”.

Bishop Alan recalled that Prince Philip had a Christian faith which was deeply held, as well as a love of family and a sense of duty, which were in themselves Christian qualities. And so, he concluded, “we ask the Lord to have mercy on His servant Philip. Eternal rest grant to him, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in peace.”

Lady Dannatt, who is the Queen’s representative in Norfolk, was accompanied by her husband, General Lord Dannatt, who was head of the British Army from 2006 to 2009. The couple came forward during Holy Communion to receive a blessing. Afterwards the cathedral choir sang the National Anthem. After the service Lord and Lady Dannatt took time to speak with the Bishop and with the Dean, Canon David Paul.

A Requiem Mass was also celebrated at the Church of Our Lady of the Annunciation, King’s Lynn on Friday April 16. Her Majesty the Queen was represented at the Mass by the Vice Lord Lieutenant of Norfolk, Peter Wilson.

Sandringham House and Wood Farm, where Prince Philip spent his final years, are in the parish of King’s Lynn, and the people of Lynn have always regarded the Queen and Prince Philip as “locals”.

The Eastertide Mass, included the seafarers’ hymn ‘Eternal Father Strong to Save’, which the Duke had requested for his funeral. Afterwards the Vice Lord Lieutenant said he had been deeply moved by the service.

Deacon Michael Patrick Wells

Deacon Michael Wells was ordained in 1991 and served the parish of St Benet’s, Beccles, for 30 years until his death in hospital at Gorleston on October 13, 2021. His brother-in-law Richard Jones pays this tribute.

■ Michael was born at Weston Longville, Norfolk, on August 21, 1946, the only child of Philip and Mary Wells. His early years were thus spent in Parson Woodforde country, the renowned 18th century diarist having been vicar of the village church of All Saints. Mike was proud of this connection! The family moved to Heckingham where Philip was a farm manager; meanwhile, Mary became involved with the Mass centre at Loddon.

Mike attended St Benet’s school in Beccles where my sister and I were contemporaries. After further studies in Lowestoft and Norwich, Mike qualified as a quantity surveyor and became a Fellow of the Institute of Management. Mike and Hilary

married at St Benet's in 1983 when the parish priest was Abbot Aelred Watkin OSB.

During the early decades of the restored permanent diaconate, the Diocese of East Anglia was still young. However, Bishop Alan Clarke promoted this ministry afresh, and a number of men, including Mike, prepared for ordination. Mike received valuable advice at this time from Fr Tony Sketch, parish priest at Lowestoft. Following ordination, Mike's ministry included the chaplaincy at Blundeston Prison, Hilary providing musical assistance.

Hilary's memories of holidays with Mike include a visit to Rome where they were given expert guidance by Dom Richard Yeo, formerly parish priest at Bungay. Sadly, such travels ceased when Mike became confined to a wheelchair.



The funeral Mass was celebrated at St Benet's on October 29 by Bishop Alan Hopes, together with priests and deacons of the diocese; the time between Mike's passing and burial had coincided with St Luke's Little Summer! My wife Marion and I were grateful that our sons and their families could participate in the deeply moving liturgy, enhanced by the assistance of musical friends from other churches. Mike's fellow deacon, Tony Felton, preached the homily.

In my Words of Remembrance at the end of Mass, I referred to two passages of Scripture: "While we have time let us do good" from the Epistle to the Galatians, and St Paul's statement upon reviewing the hardships of his life in the Second Epistle to Timothy: "I have kept the faith".

Mike endured his own trials, but never missed the daily Office; he loved the rhythm of the deacon's prayer life. During lockdown Mike regularly 'attended' Mass via the internet with the Dominican Sisters at Lymington in Hampshire, a neat link as Dominican Sisters served the parish of St. Benet's in its earliest years.

Mike explored many avenues during his life. It therefore felt apt to quote from TS Eliot as we prepared to commit Mike's mortal remains to the beautiful cemetery at St Benet's:

"We shall not cease from exploration, and the end of all our exploring will be to arrive where we started and know the place for the first time."

Notes to the Accounts

1. The activities of the Diocese are largely undertaken through its parishes and schools. Of the overall charity finances summarised above, parishes accounted for over 72% of income and approximately 57% of expenditure with some 67% of the Diocesan charity's net assets being held at parochial level. The work of the parishes involves amongst other things the pastoral care of the Roman Catholic and general community of the parish and maintenance and upkeep of places of worship.
2. Although it benefits from many enthusiastic and faithful volunteers, priests and religious, the Diocese of East Anglia is not financially well off. It has limited reserves or investments of its own, receives relatively small amounts through legacies and donations and has historically been reliant on raising income from its parishes. This it does by levying charges based as a percentage of parish offertory collections. The income which it receives is used to pay for the organisation and administration of all Diocesan activities, for repairs and building works at its schools, for the training of future Diocesan priests and deacons and to support retired priests.

3. An ongoing fund-raising campaign, Alive in Faith, has been undertaken since February 2015. This has four primary aims to provide funding for the following:

- Training of future priests
- Support of retired clergy
- Special parish projects
- Social outreach

4. During the year ending on 31 December 2020 a total of over £6.3 million was committed in pledges over five years, and £928,577 income from these pledges was recognised in the year. Expenditure in this year was £780,949 on Seminarians, Retired Priests, Parish Projects and Social Outreach grants. Total fundraising costs over the five years are expected to be around 16% of the amount raised.

5. At 31 December 2020, the Diocese's reserves, including parishes, stood at £33.8m. Of this, £4.4m is restricted to particular uses and £3.5m has been designated by the Trustees for certain specific purposes.

6. Of the remaining reserves, parochial funds amount to £22.5m, of which £14.4m is represented by fixed assets in the form of churches and other property which are required for the purposes of the Diocese and could not be realised without undermining its work. This leaves free parochial reserves of £8.1m which represents around 18 months' total parochial expenditure and levy charges. This level of reserves is considered necessary by the Trustees to enable the parishes to conduct their work in an orderly and efficient manner as well as providing income through investments to supplement the amounts received by donations.

7. Due to the impact of the pandemic on investment income, general reserves at the Diocese decreased from £3.71m to £3.37m. These are free reserves whose use is unrestricted and represent approximately 2 year's total unrestricted Diocesan expenditure. This is considered necessary in order for the Diocese to fulfil its objects, to continue supporting and advising parishes and schools and to cope with the uncertainties and risks posed by Covid-19.

8. The Diocese and its parishes responded to the Covid-19 pandemic through a combination of expenditure reductions and seeking to generate additional income through online donations, accessing grants and use of the furlough scheme. Twenty-one parishes are now able to receive donations via their websites and eleven parishes are using contactless machines to take donations. With the help of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, we were successful in 2020 in obtaining funding from Historic England for urgent capital works on 3 of our historic churches. We remain very grateful to the many generous parishioners who, alongside our dedicated clergy, have given unstintingly of their time and talents to bring the Roman Catholic Church in East Anglia through the unprecedented period of the Covid pandemic.

9. Looking forward, the Diocese has appointed a Stewardship and Fundraising Coordinator to work with all our parishes to encourage parishioners to reflect on their call to be "Faithful Stewards of God's Gifts." A number of parishes held successful stewardship campaigns in 2021, resulting in increased volunteering and offertory income.

DIOCESAN CALENDAR FOR EAST ANGLIA 2022

“Christ’s saving work is celebrated in sacred memory by the Church on fixed days throughout the course of the year. Each week on the day called the Lord’s Day the Church commemorates the Lord’s resurrection. Once a year at Easter the Church honours the resurrection of the Lord and his blessed passion with the utmost solemnity. In fact, through the yearly cycle the Church unfolds the entire mystery of Christ and keeps the anniversaries of the saints.”

(GNLY 1)

Preliminary Notes

- This Calendar is based on the GENERAL ROMAN CALENDAR, the NATIONAL CALENDAR as contained in the Roman Missal (2010) and the revised DIOCESAN CALENDAR.
 - The titular and anniversary of dedication of each church are kept as Solemnities. Lest they be overlooked, it is advisable to mark them in this Calendar.
 - Local observances are permitted of Saints or Beati connected in some way with the locality, as through birth, ministry, death, or custody of major relics. The Bishop should be consulted in each instance.
 - On the ‘green’ ferias per annum (of the year) a wide choice of Mass formula is available: EITHER of any of the 34 Sundays per annum (with the prayers of the Sunday selected, or of another Sunday, or those provided ad diversa), OR of any Saint mentioned on that day in the Martyrology, OR of any votive Mass or Mass ad diversa, OR of any Mass for the dead (provided that the daily Mass formula is only used when the Mass is, in fact, applied for the dead).
- The Requiem Mass which forms part of the funeral rite is allowed on any day except the Paschal Triduum, the Sundays of Advent, Lent and Easter, and the Holydays of Obligation.
- The Gloria is said on all Sundays (apart from Advent and Lent), Solemnities, Feasts, and other solemn celebrations, but not on Memorials. The Credo is said on Sundays and Solemnities, and is also allowed at other solemn celebrations.
 - THE LECTIONARY. On Sundays, Cycle C (Year 3) is to be used until the First Sunday of Advent, when Cycle A (Year 1) begins. The weekday readings are of Year 2. Attention is drawn to the section headed ‘Principles of Choice’ in the introduction. A decided preference is expressed for continuous readings, as provided for the weekdays throughout the year, even though a Memorial occurs (apart from the few instances noted in the Calendar of a strictly proper reading). The 1981 Lectionary provides readings for Feasts observed in this country (Vol II, pp 1316 and fol). For other Solemnities and Feasts lacking proper readings, the appropriate Common should be used, while suitable readings may be chosen for special celebrations.
 - As Eucharistic Prayer IV must always be used with its own preface, the days on which it may not be used have been indicated by the note ‘Not EP IV’.
- The Eucharistic Prayer for Masses for Various Needs and Eucharistic Prayers for Reconciliation also have integral prefaces, and may not be used on Sundays or days when EP IV is not permitted.
- Parish priests are bound to offer Mass for their people on all Sundays and Holydays of Obligation.

■ The necrology includes all clergy of the former Northampton Diocese from the year 1850. Places in parenthesis are where priests died or retired from. Any errors or omissions in the necrology of diocesan clergy should be notified to the Bishop's Personal Assistant.

NATIONAL CYCLE OF PRAYER

Introduction

In the Catholic tradition the human experience of time is used as a way of engaging us with the saving mystery of Christ's passion, death and resurrection. The cycle of days, weeks and the whole year is, for this reason, of supreme importance in Christian worship.

Each week, on the day called the Lord's Day, the Church commemorates the Lord's resurrection. Once a year, at Easter, the Church honours this resurrection and passion with the utmost solemnity. Through the yearly cycle the Church unfolds the entire mystery of Christ and keeps the anniversary of the saints.

All other celebrations need to find their proper place in the Calendar so that the principal mysteries of the redemption do not lose their appropriate prominence.

Amongst these other celebrations, from the earliest times have been the rogation and ember days, days of prayer for particular need or in thanksgiving for particular blessings of the Lord. Since 1972, the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales has preferred to drop all distinction between ember and rogation days, and to speak simply of Days of special prayer.

In 1972, six such days were introduced, but in the years which followed the number of such days increased to such an extent that they risked intruding on the celebration of the liturgical year, and especially on the celebration of the Lord's Day on Sundays. Subsequently the Bishops' Conference concluded that from Advent 1996 these Days of special prayer be subsumed into and replaced by a Cycle of Prayer.

The Cycle of Prayer seeks to preserve the integrity of the Sunday liturgy, without losing sight of the importance of being united with the universal or local Church in praying and working for important intentions. It seeks to do this by encouraging the faithful to pray for the intentions set out in the Cycle in their personal prayers throughout the period specified, and not only at Mass on a particular day.

The Cycle of Prayer is based on a division of the year into six periods, three of these being the principal liturgical seasons of Advent/Christmas; Lent and Easter and the other three being divisions of Ordinary Time, namely Winter, Summer and Autumn.

Each of these six periods is allocated its proper series of intentions for prayer, which may be taken up by both individuals and parishes and other groups throughout the season. Each individual intention also has its particular focal point, ie a particular celebration or Day of Prayer ordered by the Holy See.

How might a parish keep the Cycle of Prayer?

Outside of the Liturgy

■ Intentions for the whole period might be listed in the parish newsletter or printed on a prayer card so as to help individual parishioners keep in mind and pray for the

intentions for that period.

- Publicity and informational material might be displayed on parish noticeboards.
- Prayer-focuses may be placed in an appropriate place in the Church – following the example of the candle symbol popularised by Amnesty International.
- Parish meetings might be arranged so as to better inform parishioners about the particular objects of the intention (eg peace, Christian unity, the place and role of women in the Church and the world, the sick, sea-farers, racial justice, prisoners and their families). This will also give the opportunity for parishioners to learn how they might become actively involved in working for the fulfilling of the intentions for which they pray.
- Retiring collections might be taken to support particular forms of pastoral activity.

Within the Liturgy - Mass

- On the Day of Special Prayer itself, and especially on Sundays, it is appropriate to announce the Day of Special Prayer in the opening remarks at the beginning of Mass, and for the special intention to be included in the Prayer of the Faithful (Bidding Prayers). Care should be taken that the remaining petitions of the Prayer of the Faithful should be formulated in accordance with the norms given in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal.
- When a Day of Prayer or other observance falls on a Sunday, the Mass and Lectionary texts of the Sunday are normally to be used.
- On weekdays the use of suitable 'Masses for Various Needs and Occasions' or 'Votive Masses' should be considered to support the marking of the Day of Prayer. The readings assigned for each day in the Lectionary for weekdays should not be omitted too frequently and without sufficient reason. It is often more fruitful to explore any special intentions through the readings assigned to the day, than to choose from the Common those which may appear at first sight more appropriate to the intention.
- The homily at Mass is necessary for the nurturing of the Christian life. It should develop some aspect of the readings from the scriptural readings or liturgical texts of the Mass, while taking into account the mystery being celebrated or the needs proper to the listeners. The homily should not be narrowly confined to the intention of the Cycle of Prayer alone, nor be replaced by a non-homiletic talk or an appeal for money.

Other Liturgies and Celebrations

- When it is desired to have a form of extended prayer for one of the intentions in the Cycle of Prayer, serious consideration should be given to holding a special non-eucharistic service for that purpose, such as a Vigil, the Evening Prayer of the Church, a Liturgy of the Word, or a procession with litanies.
- Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, 'which must clearly express the cult of the Blessed Sacrament in its relationship to the Mass', should also be considered. It should be noted that there is specific provision within this rite for special prayers.
- When considering how particular intentions are to be presented and marked within a parish, every effort should be made to extend the invitation to participate in this to all members of the parish, including the younger members of the parish, and the housebound.

Each of the 52 parishes within the Diocese of East Anglia will be allocated one week during the year during which to pray, not only for the Intentions of the National Cycle of Prayer, but also for Vocations to the Priesthood and to the Religious Life, and the Needs and Intentions of the Diocese. During this week, each Parish shall also have the opportunity to celebrate 40 Hours of Eucharistic Adoration, including as they do so, the specific prayers and initiatives of the New Evangelisation.

THE NATIONAL CYCLE OF PRAYER

During Ordinary Time – (Winter) i.e. up to Lent, we are asked to pray for these intentions:

Peace on Earth: especially on 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time and on Racial Justice Day which occurs three Sundays before the 1st Sunday of Lent. The World Day of Prayer for Peace is marked on 1 January. As this day is when the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God and it is the beginning of the new year in England, the day is transferred to 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time. There may be a collection on this day for the work of Pax Christi. The day of prayer for Racial Justice is organised by the ecumenical Churches' Commission for Racial Justice. Within the Catholic Church material is distributed by Catholic Association for Racial Justice (CARJ) for whom a collection may be taken on this day.

Prayer:

O God of peace, who are peace itself and whom a spirit of discord cannot grasp, nor a violent mind receive, grant that those who are one in heart may persevere in what is good and that those in conflict may forget evil and so be healed.

Roman Missal

Christian Unity: especially during the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity: 18–25 January. The Week of was originally begun in 1908 by the American Episcopalian clergyman Paul Wattson who later became a Catholic. The Week begins on 18 January and ends on 25 January—the Feast of the Conversion of St Paul. Material for the Week of Prayer is prepared in collaboration by Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity and The Commission on Faith and Order of the World Council of Churches. Each year this material is produced by Christians in a different country.

Prayer:

May the divisions among Christians be overcome so that we may hasten to your eternal Kingdom in the perfect communion of the Church

Openness to the Word of God: especially on 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Sunday of the Word of God takes place on the third Sunday in Ordinary Time. Pope Francis' Apostolic Letter, issued *motu proprio*, 'Aperuit illis', published on 30 September 2019, establishes that 'the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the Word of God'

Prayer

Blessed Lord, who caused all Holy Scriptures to be written for our learning: help us so to hear them, to read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest them, that, through patience, and the comfort of your holy word, we may embrace and for ever hold fast the hope of everlasting life, which you have given us in our Saviour Jesus Christ.

Prayer

All-wise God, as you have granted us to drink with delight from the Word that leads us to know you, in your goodness grant us also to come at length to you, source of all wisdom and stand for ever before your face.

The Sick and Those Who Care for Them: especially on World Day of Prayer for the Sick — 11 February. 11 February is the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. On this day the Church is asked to pray and give attention to the sick and those who care for them. Each year the Holy Father writes a message.

Prayer

Accept the prayers we offer for our brothers and sisters who are ill, that, having been anxious for them in their danger, we may rejoice at their recovery of health.

The Unemployed: especially on the Sunday before Ash Wednesday. The Day of Prayer for the Unemployed was organised by Church Action on Poverty. They have recently renamed their day as Poverty Action Sunday. Caritas-Social Action is the agency in the Catholic Church which acts an umbrella for many diocesan and local organisations concerned with poverty and other social issues.

THE NATIONAL CYCLE OF PRAYER

During Lent we are asked to pray for these intentions:

Candidates for the Sacraments: especially on the Sundays of Lent

For those preparing to be initiated into the Church at Easter, Lent marks the final stage of preparation, the period of Purification and Enlightenment. It begins with the Rite of Election on the First Sunday of Lent. During the season of Lent the Scrutinies are celebrated on the 3rd, 4th and 5th Sundays in preparation for Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. Many parishes will also receive candidates for Reception into the Church.

‘The people of God, as represented by the local Church, should understand and show by their concern that the initiation of adults is the responsibility of all the baptised.’

‘During Lent, the period of purification and enlightenment, the faithful should take care to participate in the rites of the scrutinies and presentations and give the elect the example of their own renewal in the spirit of penance, faith, and charity. At the Easter Vigil, they should attach great importance to renewing their own baptismal promises.’ RCIA 9

The celebration of other Sacraments, such as Confirmation and First Holy Communion, will often take place within the Easter season so that candidates for these Sacraments will also be preparing in Lent. These candidates should also be remembered in the prayers of the community.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

The agency for overseas development, CAFOD, encourages the Church in England and Wales to use the Friday of the first week in Lent as an opportunity to remember the needy and hungry of the world. The day is an opportunity the three Lenten disciplines of Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving which derive from the proclamation of the Word on Ash Wednesday.

The proceeds from the practice of fasting on the Friday are usually collected at Mass on the 2nd Sunday of Lent.

This reflects the ancient practice of the Order of Penitents which reached its end on the morning of Holy Thursday.

THE SACRED PASCHAL TRIDUUM**

The celebrations of the Sacred Triduum are to be carried out in cathedral and parochial churches and only in those churches in which they can be performed with dignity, that is, with a good attendance of the faithful, an appropriate number of ministers, and the means to sing at least some of the parts. Consequently, it is desirable that small communities, associations and special groups of various kinds join together in these churches to carry out the sacred celebrations in a more noble manner (Norms for the Sacred Paschal Triduum, Roman Missal p. 329 #3). A priest may not celebrate the rites of the Sacred Triduum on his own.

MASS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

The Mass of the Lord's Supper is celebrated in the evening; crosses may be veiled in white and the altar decorated with flowers in moderation. The tabernacle should be entirely empty and sufficient hosts consecrated for today and tomorrow. The Altar of Repose should be decorated with flowers and candles. While the *Gloria* is sung, all the bells in the church are rung and then remain silent until the *Gloria* of the Easter Vigil. During the same period, the organ and other musical instruments may be used only to support the singing. The Washing of Feet may take place during the Mass. Following the Prayer after Communion, the Blessed Sacrament is taken to the Altar of Repose where it is kept in a tabernacle. Solemn Adoration may not continue after midnight. After the Blessed Sacrament has been transferred, the altar is stripped of all cloths, cross and candles.

The Church: Especially at Pentecost

Throughout the Season of Easter the first reading at Mass is taken from the Acts of the Apostles. Luke tells the story of the early Church from the Ascension and Pentecost to the early missions of the apostles.

‘When the work which the Father gave the Son to do on earth was accomplished, the Holy Spirit was sent on the day of Pentecost in order that he might continually sanctify the Church. Then "the Church was openly displayed to the crowds and the spread of the Gospel among the nations, through preaching, was begun." As the "convocation" of all men for salvation, the Church in her very nature is missionary, sent by Christ to all the nations to make disciples of them.’ Catechism 767

‘Those who with God’s help have welcomed Christ’s call and freely responded to it are urged on by love of Christ to proclaim the Good News everywhere in the world. This treasure, received from the apostles, has been faithfully guarded by their successors. "The annual World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation will offer individual believers and communities a fitting opportunity to reaffirm their personal vocation to be stewards of creation, to thank God for the wonderful handiwork which he has entrusted to our care, and to implore his help for the protection of creation as well as his pardon for the sins committed against the world in which we live."
(Pope Francis, Letter inaugurating World Prayer of Care for Creation)

The Church has long celebrated the agricultural harvest. This intention also includes all human work. In all circumstances of human life there are choices to be made regarding the environment and our reverent stewardship of the God's gift of creation. "The external deserts in the world are growing, because the internal deserts have become so vast. Therefore the earth's treasures no longer serve to build God's garden for all to live in, but they have been made to serve the powers of exploitation and destruction" (Benedict XVI, homily at Inaugural Mass, 2005). '

The Sunday and the following week seek to focus attention not only on the needs of prisoners but on all those involved the field of prison care, prisoners families, victims of crime, prison staff and many volunteers.

In England and Wales one Mass for the Dead may celebrated on this Sunday.
