ORIGINS

Formed on 28th May 1965 by division of the Diocese of Southwark into the Archdiocese of Southwark and the Diocese of Arundel and Brighton.

FORMER BISHOPS

DAVID CASHMAN

Born 27th December 1912. Ordained Bishop of Cantano and Auxiliary in Westminster 27th May 1958. First Bishop of Arundel and Brighton 14th June 1965. Died 14th March 1971. Buried at Arundel.

MICHAEL BOWEN

Born 23rd April 1930. Ordained 27th June 1970, Bishop of Lamsorti and Coadjutor Bishop of Arundel and Brighton. Succeeded 14th March 1971. Translated to Southwark as Archbishop 23rd April 1977. Archbishop Emeritus 6th November 2003. Died 17th October 2019.

CORMAC MURPHY-O'CONNOR

Born 24th August 1932. Ordained Bishop 21st December 1977. Translated to Westminster as the 10th Archbishop 22nd March 2000. Created Cardinal 21st February 2001. Archbishop Emeritus 2009. Died 1st September 2017.

KIERAN CONRY

Born 1st February 1951. Ordained Bishop 9th June 2001. Resigned 27th September 2014.

OBITUARIES

Fr Peter ap Morris

Born on 17th March 1931, he studied at King's College in London before entering the Civil Service. In 1958, his work for the Foreign Office took him to Canada. His vocation developed and after a time at Osterley he studied in Rome at Beda College before being ordained on March 30th 1968 for the Archdiocese of Montreal. He had a varied ministry being involved in peer counselling and appearing on a television programme featuring questions of moral and social issues. He undertook studies in Dynamic Psychology at Champion College, and in 1988 he won the Heart of Gold Award from Air Canada. Serving as Senior Chaplain to the 3rd Militia Regiment in Canada, he was accorded the rank of Major. He also set up a half-way house and so continued the eclectic nature of his career.

On returning to England he served as Catholic Chaplain to HMP Belmarsh before coming to Arundel and Brighton 'on loan'. Parishioners of Heron's Ghyll came to appreciate him as a priest with a great deal of energy, a prayerful person and a rock of traditional faith having become a Catholic 50 years previously. Described as one of life's eccentrics, he retired first to East Grinstead and then to the Hawthornes in Eastbourne. He died on October 26th 2018. Following his Requiem Mass, he was buried at St John's, Heron's Ghyll.

May he rest in peace.

Fr David Goddard

Father David Goddard was Custodian at the Shrine of Our Lady of Consolation at West Grinstead for some twenty-two years – in fact for the whole of his Catholic priesthood. In the last few years when it became possible for married men to fulfill the role, he was also Parish Priest. He was born in Kent and educated in Gravesend, going on to university in Nottingham to read music, and later studying at Trinity Music College, London. He achieved a Fellowship in Composition, and later, an FRCO in Organ Performing. At that time everything seemed to point to a career in music. He was a church organist and choirmaster, running a choral society and forming a madrigal group. For some years he was Head of Music at Gravesend Grammar School. He met his future wife Susan, a fellow musician, and after graduation worked for the BBC.

But things were to change. At the age of thirty-six – now married with three children – David felt the calling to ordination in the Church of England. He was accepted for training at Salisbury Theological College. After ordination, his title parish was Romsey Abbey, which he greatly appreciated for its fine music and historic architecture.

His first incumbency was in Southsea near Portsmouth and then St Michael's in South Lancing where he sponsored a most successful parish mission. But this was the time in the 1990s when radical changes were being proposed in the Church of England, and David and his family felt they must seek their spiritual home in the Catholic Church. His son and daughter, having preceded him into the Church, were sponsors for their parents when they were received. Then Bishop Cormac Murphy O'Connor accepted him for the Catholic priesthood. He attended the famous course of talks for convert clergy arranged by Cardinal Basil Hume at Westminster Cathedral (which the Cardinal called the Irish dancing classes!) then went on to study at Womersley. There, his musical gifts came to the fore once again as he also taught music part time.

Almost immediately after his ordination Fr David arrived in West Grinstead and for him and indeed for his family this proved an ideal appointment. The parish, now joined with Horsham, covers a large geographical area, from Pease Pottage to Washington and Barnes Green to Hickstead. However, this is also the site of the Shrine of Our Lady of Consolation where an increasing number of pilgrims, both individually and in groups visit each year.

Recently, at the canonisation of St John Henry Newman – to whom Fr David was devoted – Prince Charles offered these rather surprising thoughts: 'as an Anglican, Newman guided the church back to its Catholic roots, and as a Catholic he was ready to learn from the Anglican tradition, such as promoting the role of the laity'.

Fr David, like Newman, spent half his life as an Anglican and then as a Catholic, and he is a representative of those many men who have served in the ministry of both churches. At West Grinstead he had an outstanding pastoral ministry, both to pilgrims and parish, in which his family shared. He loved the Church and did much to enhance its beauty, its liturgy and, of course, its music. In recent years Fr David suffered increasingly from poor health which he bore with courage and fortitude, with the support of his family, particularly his wife Susan and daughter Kate.

Father David was a larger than life character with a great sense of humour whose company was greatly appreciated especially by his fellow priests.

It was his request that a mass should be celebrated in the Tridentine form and so his son, Fr Matthew Goddard, celebrated High Mass in the Shrine Church on the eve of his funeral. The following day Bishop Moth presided at the Funeral Mass in Arundel Cathedral followed by interment in the graveyard at West Grinstead.

Fr David J. Irwin

Fr Charles Jeffries

Born on 2nd May 1934, he was educated at Merchant Taylors' School in Northwood, Middlesex. He spent much of his National Service in Germany and he was baptised in the Catholic Church at Westminster Cathedral on 31st December 1957.

Entering St John's Seminary, Womersley in 1961 he was ordained to the Priesthood on 22nd July 1967 at St John the Evangelist, Horsham by Bishop Cashman. His first parish was The Sacred Heart, Cobham where he remained until 1972 when Bishop Cashman sent him to Corpus Christi College, London, for Catechetical Studies. Following this he established and led the Arundel and Brighton Religious Education Service (ABRES). From 1979 – 1983 he was Parish Priest of St Hugh of Lincoln Knaphill after which he was appointed by Bishop Cormac as Parish Priest of Weybridge. It is not every priest who has the mandate to build a new church, but he did so with determination and strong backing from the parishioners of Weybridge. The result was the splendid Church of Christ the Prince of Peace.

Nine years later he became the Director of the Ministry to Priests Programme, promoting the holistic well-being of clergy, while pastoring the parish of West Grinstead. His last parish was Our Lady of Lourdes, Queen of Peace, Rottingdean. Retiring in 2003, he acted as Spiritual Director at St Cuthman's Retreat Centre until 2017 when he moved to St Mary's House, Preston Park.

With a great gift for friendship, wise counsel, and a ready wit, he maintained contact not only with his sister and niece but with countless friends far and wide. A lover of nature, his knowledge of birds was immense – woe betide you if you spoke of seagulls. An inveterate tease, no one could escape.

His inspiration in life arose from a sense of justice, the fraternity of Jesu Caritas, the writing of the Carmelite Nun Sister Elizabeth of the Trinity, and his total commitment to God.

Fr Charles died on March 2nd 2019, with funeral taking place in the Church of Christ the Prince of Peace, Weybridge, followed by burial in Rottingdean

Mgr Bryan Chestle

Bryan George Chestle was born in London on 1 September 1933, the elder of two children. Educated at the Jesuit Wimbledon College, he won a state scholarship at the age of 16. After working for a year as a clerk in the Education Department for Surrey County Council, he did his National Service in the Royal Artillery & Intelligence Corps 1951-53. Posted to Northern Ireland, he was recalled and sent to the London University School of Slavonic Studies. It was the period of the Cold War when selected service personnel were trained to speak Russian in case of a war with the Soviet bloc. He qualified as Service Interpreter in Russian with the rank of Lieutenant in 1953. He then took up his state scholarship at Pembroke College, Oxford, 1953-56, graduating in Russian and French. He briefly tried his vocation with the Jesuits before offering himself to the archdiocese of Southwark as a candidate for the secular priesthood. His archbishop sent him to the Venerable English College in Rome to study there and at the Pontifical Gregorian University. He arrived at the College in November 1956. During his seven years in Rome he took his Licentiate in Philosophy and Theology. He was ordained on July 8th 1962

He returned to England in 1963 and took up his first and only appointment in the country of his birth. St Joseph's, Mark Cross, in East Sussex was the minor seminary for St John's College, Womersley. It had recently been extended to allow for six extra classrooms. There he taught religion and French for five years. In 1968 he was asked to work in the Secretariat of State. He was to stay in Rome for the next forty-three years, living in the English College and becoming the College's elder statesman. He also took charge of the College garden which benefited greatly from his horticultural knowledge and expertise. He recalled with pleasure Pope St Paul VI taking him on one side and saying: 'Thank you for all you do, but above all thank you for your friendship'. He also let slip that when he was teaching Pope St John Paul II Russian the Pope couldn't understand how an Englishman spoke better Russian than he did. At that time, the English College was in financial crisis. A legacy had come to

the Vatican with a value of £4 million. Bryan suggested that Archbishop Bowen, then chair of the College Trustees, should apply for a grant and showed how to do it. The paperwork came to Pope John Paul II with a recommendation that £200,000 might be given to the College. Pope John Paul II discussed it with Bryan, signed the paperwork and added an extra zero, which meant that the College received not £200,000 but £2 million. That money was put into trust and forms the present Endowment of the College. Meeting Queen Elizabeth twice during her visits to Pope St John Paul II gave him great satisfaction. But life at the Secretariat meant more than mixing with dignitaries. There was the ordinary daily grind, carried out devotedly. He was conscious of the fact that in serving his time in the Secretariat of State he was directly serving the Holy See, the supreme spiritual authority over the Catholic Church which the Pope has as successor of Peter.

Retirement from the Secretariat of State came in 2003 and he returned to England in 2011. The Sisters of Our Lady of Pity at St John's Convent in Kiln Green welcomed him, and he was happy there. Then illness overtook him, and he needed more specialist care. His last years were spent at St Clare's Home in St George's Park, Ditchling Common, East Sussex where he received exquisite nursing from the Augustinian Sisters and Staff. One who had lived a life of faithful and diligent service deserved nothing less. He died on September 4th 2019.

Archbishop Michael Bowen

Born in 1930, his early years were marked by the Second World War and the death of his Father, who was serving in the Irish Guards, the Regiment in which both Michael and his older brother, Pat, were to serve. Indeed, in 1949, at the presentation of new Colours to the Regiment, both brothers carried the Colours – perhaps a unique moment in Regimental History. Work with Saccone and Speed, the Wine Merchant who – amongst other responsibilities – cared for the alcohol requirements of the Royal Navy in Gibraltar, lead to an in-depth understanding and appreciation of wine and others benefitted from his knowledge over the years. Following studies for the Priesthood at the Venerable English College, gaining Licentiate Degrees in both Philosophy and Theology from the Gregorian University, he was ordained to the Priesthood on 6th July 1958. After one year as Assistant Priest at St Gregory's, Earlsfield, he moved to English Martyrs, Walworth, where he had oversight of St Augustine's House – a residence for men preparing for seminary formation while continuing their jobs. This role in formation was to continue as a member of the staff at the Pontifical Beda College in Rome. He

was on the staff while the Second Vatican Council met. These were heady times in the life of the Church and an exciting time to be in Rome. Returning to England in 1966, he was appointed Chancellor of the newly-created Diocese of Arundel & Brighton. Carved from Southwark, the first bishop was David Cashman whose health was poor and in 1970, aged only 40, Fr Michael Bowen was ordained Titular Bishop of Lamsorti and Coadjutor to Bishop Cashman, succeeding him as Bishop of Arundel & Brighton on 27th June 1971. In 1970, Bishop Cashman, despite his ill-health, was in Rome for the Canonisation of the 40 Martyrs. The following year, it was Bishop Michael who received into the Cathedral at Arundel the body of St Philip Howard, now patron of the Diocese. Only four days later, Bishop Cashman died and Bishop Michael succeeded him as Bishop of Arundel & Brighton. Very soon, much work was needed to save the Cathedral. This was a major task, for the roof was in a state of collapse, yet Bishop Michael saw this as an opportunity to bring the whole Diocese together and enable parish communities to relate more strongly to their mother Church. It was during Bishop Michael's time in the Diocese that much of the pattern of life and structure of the relatively new Diocese was put in place, including the Arundel & Brighton Pilgrimage to Lourdes, beginning in 1974. This has remained one of the key events in the life of the diocese. Speaking in an interview in 1990, he described his years in Arundel & Brighton as 'halcyon days', marked by the way in which 'everyone pulled together'. 'There was', he said 'tremendous joy there and a lot of beauty too.'

This way of bringing people together was to mark Archbishop Michael's years in Southwark, where he was appointed to succeed the Late Archbishop Cyril Cowderoy, being installed on 23rd April (his birthday) in 1977. With great energy, he set himself to visit every parish in the Diocese with great speed – a means of creating a sense of unity – and his practice of being close to the Religious communities of the Diocese, begun in Arundel & Brighton, was to be a feature of his service in Southwark too. Given the size of the Diocese, it was not long before he requested two more Auxiliary Bishops and created the three Pastoral Areas of the Diocese. Bishops Howard Tripp and John Jukes OFM Conv joined Bishop Charles Henderson and the new pattern of working became very firmly and effectively established. It worked well, perhaps, because Archbishop Michael never sought to place himself in the limelight. He was always happy to see others shine and to allow 'grass-roots' initiatives their place in the life of the Diocese. Those that were effective found rich soil and produced much good fruit. In 1982, Pope Saint John Paul II made his visit to England & Wales. St George's Cathedral became a hospital ward for a day, as the Cathedral had been chosen for a Service for the Sick. This was a moment of great joy for Archbishop Michael and he would often report the fact that the Holy Father would mention the occasion to him when the two

met in Rome. It was under Archbishop Michael's guidance that the Diocese developed a Lay Pastoral Council and addressed the needs of ongoing formation of Clergy. The re-establishment of RCIA in the Church was a key moment for him and he initiated a major conference for representatives from every parish to ensure that RCIA would have its place in the Diocese. In the wake of *Pastores dabo vobis* a Propaedeutic Programme at Cathedral House was established. Perhaps Archbishop Michael had in mind his experience in earlier times at St Augustine's House. Something of an experiment, it ran for a couple of years – but it was a real attempt to address the changing culture and the needs of those discerning the vocation to the Priesthood. In the early 90s he sought permission from the Holy See to divide the Diocese. Much work went into the plan, but the proposal was rejected. With great openness he announced the news at the Chrism Mass, before the customary great gathering of people and clergy. He had a lovely sense of humour. With those with whom he worked very closely, he could occasionally play some well thought out and hilarious practical jokes. He enjoyed golf and tennis and was an example to his clergy of the need to remain fit and healthy. As time went on, it would be true to say that Archbishop Michael showed some signs of tiring. He had contracted glandular fever while in Arundel & Brighton and this had left its mark. He had also carried the burden of episcopal office for a long time. In 1993 he offered his resignation to the Holy Father and went on to live a very quiet life. As age and infirmity caught up with him, he moved from his flat to the Little Sisters Home in Vauxhall and died, after a period of illness, on 17th October 2019. In 1995, the people and clergy of the Archdiocese of Southwark had gathered at Aylesford Priory to celebrate the Silver Jubilee of Archbishop Michael's Episcopal Ordination. Cardinal Basil Hume preached on this occasion, saying 'Southwark is blessed to be served by a gentle shepherd'. These words of the late Cardinal express very well the ministry of Archbishop Michael. To all who were privileged to know him, their experience was of a gentleman in the true sense of that word. He was a true shepherd to the 'flock of God' that had been entrusted to him, seeking always to 'serve and not to be served'.

**Personal recollections of Archbishop Bowen
by Mgr Barry Wymes and Mgr Provost Emeritus John Hull**

Bishop Michael took over as our Bishop soon after the closure of the Second Vatican Council. Under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit this was a time of expectation, hope and promise throughout the Church.

He was quietly but deeply imbued with the vision, spirit and teaching of that Council. To implement the Council he set about establishing the necessary structures throughout the Diocese. He appointed a priest as full-time Diocesan Director for Pastoral Renewal – first in the country – with wide-ranging responsibilities: to establish two Pastoral Centres one in Surrey (Maryvale) and one in Sussex (Sayers Common) for the formation of priests and laity; to further active consultation and collaborative ministry between laity and priests he built on foundations laid by Bishop David and encouraged the establishment of Parish, Deanery and Diocesan Pastoral Councils.

He was a keen ecumenist and worked collaboratively with sister Christian Churches. He introduced five-day In-Service Training Days for Priests. Perhaps the 'Jewel in his Pastoral Crown' was his encouragement to renew our Annual Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes by breaking away from the Catholic Association group of pilgrimages and setting-up our own structure for an independent Diocesan Pilgrimage.

Bishop Michael epitomised the essence of a Christian as defined by Pope Francis at the recent Canonisation of St John Henry Newman:

'The Christian has a deep, silent, hidden peace which the world sees not. The Christian is cheerful, easy, kind, gentle, courteous, candid, unassuming, has no pretence'. This is an apt description of the Bishop Michael many of us knew and now remember with affection and gratitude.

He was a man of God, pastorally kind, sensitive and an able administrator – A Bishop who was indeed a 'Kindly Light'!

Mgr Barry Wymes

Succeeding Fr Michael G. Bowen as Chancellor in 1970 and being present at the deathbed of the first Bishop of Arundel and Brighton when the coadjutor became the second Bishop introduced me to a man of total priestly commitment and gentility. Responsible for setting up the Chancery Office in Hove, his introduction to the intricacies of Dispensations, Decrees, Documents, Convalidations and much else was thorough and precise, made all the more easy by his meticulous creation of Registers and Files.

Trustingly one day asking to be driven in his automatic Hillman, he was less than pleased to discover on stopping that it had been driven with the handbrake on resulting in red hot and smoking brake hubs.

There were many things he taught me – one in particular. How to deal with wasp nests: Stand by the dustbin, identify the line of flight, wait until dark, be equipped with a jug of petrol and a turf. Throw the petrol into the nest, cover

immediately with the turf and retreat. Next day dig up the nest. Not recommended by H&S.

On his return from the Synod on Justice, over the cornflakes, he announced 'we are moving from Storrington'. Efforts were made but not realised until two Bishops later

His time as Bishop in A&B resulted in many initiatives including Commissions, the Cathedral Roof Restoration, the Diocesan Pastoral Council and many more - all contributing to the establishment of a forward-looking Diocese. It was with mixed emotions on St George's Day 1977 that his Secretary and myself walked him up the aisle of the Cathedral to 'give him away' to the Church of Southwark.







BEQUESTS

Why give to my parish?

Your parish relies on the generosity of its parishioners for support and finance to cover the day-to-day running of the parish. However, any repairs or enhancements can be very costly.

Why give to the Diocese?

The Bishop leads our Diocese and is assisted by Diocesan Trustees. The Diocese is the central body supporting our priests, parishes and schools. You can help the Bishop with a general bequest to the Diocese or one for the training of priests or caring for sick or retired priests. One way of helping your parish/Diocese in the future is through your Will.

NOTE ON HOW TO MAKE BEQUESTS

Legacies for charitable purposes are exempt from inheritance tax. The Diocese is a registered charity and so can benefit from bequests. Care must be taken over the wording; home-made Wills can lead to court action and the frustration of the testator's intentions. Your legal adviser should incorporate the wording(s) below in your Will.

The Bishop is the senior Trustee of the Arundel and Brighton Diocesan Trust. The gifts in bequests A, B and C are charitable and qualify for exemption from Inheritance Tax.

A. BEQUESTS TO THE DIOCESE

I give to the Trustees of the Arundel and Brighton Diocesan Trust of Bishop's House, The Upper Drive, Hove, BN3 6NB being registered charity Number 252878 (the sum of £..... free of tax) (..... of my residuary estate) and the receipt of the Financial Secretary or other officer of the Trust shall be a full discharge to my executors in respect of the same.

B. BEQUEST FOR A PARISH/SPECIAL PURPOSE

I give to the Trustees of the Arundel and Brighton Diocesan Trust of Bishop's House, The Upper Drive, Hove, BN3 6NB being registered charity Number 252878 (the sum of £..... free of tax) (..... of my residuary estate) on trust for such charitable purposes in connection with (..... see note 1.) in the said Diocese as the Trustees shall in their absolute discretion think fit and the receipt of the Financial Secretary or other officer of the Trust shall be a full discharge to my executors in respect of the same.

C. BEQUEST FOR A FOUNDATION MASS (see over)

D. BEQUEST FOR MASSES

2. The minimum sum for a Foundation Mass is £300

WHAT IS A FOUNDATION MASS?

This describes an arrangement to have a Mass offered annually for a particular intention.

In the Diocese of Arundel and Brighton and in accordance with Canons 1303-1310 these regulations apply:

The capital sum is £300 (Jan 2014)

Each foundation is to have a written consent of the Bishop and is to be founded through the Financial Secretary of the diocese.

For each Foundation one Mass will be celebrated annually for 25 years.

The stipend for each Mass is £10. Each quarter a notification of the Unit Trust interest paid to the parish will be provided.

At the end of 25 years the capital sum will be transferred to the Ecclesiastical Education Fund.

A newly ordained priest is requested to offer one Mass for the intentions of the donors.

Instructions for a Foundation Mass may be written into Wills or individuals may request that a Mass be offered for a deceased person or for some other intention "on or about" a determined date.

A list of Foundation Masses should be kept in the Sacristy so that the donor's intentions can be fulfilled.

LITURGICAL CALENDAR

THE ORDER FOR THE CELEBRATION OF MASS AND OF THE DIVINE OFFICE ACCORDING TO THE GENERAL ROMAN CALENDAR FOR THE LITURGICAL YEAR 2020, TOGETHER WITH DIRECTIVES FOR THE DIOCESE OF ARUNDEL AND BRIGHTON

THE SACRAMENTS

Infant Baptism

Parents are obliged to see that their infants are baptised within the first few weeks. As soon as possible after the birth, indeed even before it, they are to approach the Parish Priest to ask for the sacrament for their child, and to be themselves duly prepared for it (Canon 867 §1). For an infant to be baptised lawfully it is required: first, that the parents, or at least one of them, or the person who lawfully holds that place, give their consent; secondly, that there be a realistic hope that the child will be brought up in the Catholic religion. If such hope is truly lacking, the baptism is, in accordance with the provisions of particular law, to be deferred and the parents advised of the reason for this (Canon 868 §1).

The Reception of Infants and Children into Full Communion with the Catholic Church

Since the reception of Holy Communion in a Catholic Church does not, in itself, bring with it membership of the Catholic Church, validly baptised infants and children whose parents desire that they become Catholics, are to be received into full communion with the Church through an act of reception. Application for permission is to be made through the Chancery, and the reception is to be carefully recorded in the parish register of receptions.

Adult Baptism

The baptism of adults, at least of those who have completed their fourteenth year, is to be referred to the diocesan Bishop (Canon 863) through the Chancery

The Reception of Adults into Full Communion with the Catholic Church and the Confirmation of previously-baptised Catholics

Application for permission to receive validly baptised Christians into full communion with the Catholic Church is to be made through the Chancery. For validity, a priest wishing to confer the sacrament of confirmation must have the faculty to do so, either from the universal law or by way of a special grant from the competent authority, issued through the Chancery.

Confirmation

The particular law of the Diocese of Arundel and Brighton requires that, ordinarily, candidates for confirmation be, at least, in their fifteenth year (school year ten).

Sunday Mass Obligation

The Church obliges the faithful to take part in the Divine Liturgy on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation and, prepared by the sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession), to receive the Blessed Eucharist at least once a year, if possible during the Easter season (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1389). If it is impossible to participate in the Eucharistic celebration, either because no sacred minister is available or for some other grave reason, the faithful are strongly recommended to take part in a liturgy of the word, if there be such in the parish church or some other sacred place, which is celebrated in accordance with the provisions laid down by the diocesan Bishop; or to spend an appropriate time in prayer, whether personally or as a family or, as occasion presents, in a group of families (Canon 1248 §2).

The Eucharistic Fast

Whoever is to receive the Blessed Eucharist is to abstain for at least one hour before Holy Communion from all food and drink, with the sole exception of water and medicine (Canon 919 §1). The elderly and those who are suffering from some illness, as well as those who care for them, may receive the blessed Eucharist even if within the preceding hour they have consumed something (Canon 919 §3).

Veneration of the Most Blessed Eucharist

In churches or oratories which are allowed to reserve the blessed Eucharist, there may be exposition, either with the ciborium or with the monstrance, in accordance with the norms prescribed in the liturgical books (Canon 941 §1). It is recommended that in these churches or oratories, there is to be each year a solemn exposition of the blessed Sacrament for an appropriate time, even if it be not continuous, so that the local community may more attentively meditate on and adore the Eucharistic mystery. This exposition is to take place only if a fitting attendance of the faithful is foreseen, and the prescribed norms are observed (Canon 942).

Penance

According to the Church's command, 'after having attained the age of discretion, each of the faithful is bound by an obligation faithfully to confess serious sins at least once a year'. Anyone who is aware of having committed a mortal sin must not receive Holy Communion, even if he experiences deep contrition, without having first received sacramental absolution, unless he has a grave reason for receiving Holy Communion and there is no possibility of going to confession. Children must go to the sacrament of Penance before receiving Holy Communion for the first time (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1457).

Anointing of the Sick

The anointing of the sick 'is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death.

'Hence, as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived' (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1514).

Marriage

It is the particular law of this Diocese that at least twelve months' notice be given to the Parish Priest before the date proposed for the marriage. This is to ensure adequate time for the preparation of the couple, as well as for the gathering and processing of the necessary documents.

Orders

Arundel & Brighton Vocations is the vocations service of the Diocese. It exists to help all men and women who are seeking to hear the call of God in their lives. The work of the vocations service focuses primarily around the promotion of priestly vocations and supporting men in the early stages of discernment for, and discovery of, the priesthood.

SACRED TIMES**Holy Days of Obligation**

On Sundays and other Holy Days of Obligation, the faithful are obliged to participate in the Mass. They are also to abstain from such work or business that would inhibit the worship to be given to God, the joy proper to the Lord's Day, or the due relaxation of mind and body (Canon 1247).

Days of Penance

All Christ's faithful are obliged by divine law, each in his or her own way, to do penance. However, so that all may be joined together in a certain common practice of penance, days of penance are prescribed. On these days, Christ's faithful are in a special manner to devote themselves to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, and to deny themselves, by fulfilling their obligations more faithfully and especially by observing the prescribed fasting and abstinence (Canon 1249). The days and times of penance for the universal Church are each Friday of the whole year and the season of Lent.

Abstinence from meat, as determined by the Bishop's Conference of England and Wales, is to be observed on all Fridays, unless a solemnity should fall on a Friday. Abstinence and fasting are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday (Canon 1251).

The law of abstinence binds those who have completed their fourteenth year. The law of fasting binds those who have attained their majority, until the beginning of their sixtieth year (Canon 1252).

Friday Abstinence

In 2011, the Bishops of England and Wales re-established the practice of Friday penance in the lives of the faithful as a clear and distinctive mark of our own Catholic identity, underlining, at the same time, the importance of a united, common act of Friday penance that is, in itself, an act of witness to the Crucified Lord. This corporate act of Friday penance should properly be fulfilled by abstaining from meat. Those who cannot or choose not to eat meat as part of their normal diet should abstain from some other food of which they regularly partake.

First Friday Prayers

On 7 September 2012, Bishop Kieran Conroy published a call to public prayer every first Friday of the month, as an act of faith and public witness. He said, 'A simple way that we can contribute to the mission of the Church and grow in our relationship with Jesus Christ, is to pray publicly during the day. I would like to invite every Catholic... to pause for a moment of prayer of praise and thanksgiving at 3pm, if possible, or perhaps when you break for lunch, on the first Friday of every month. Whatever you are doing, as your responsibilities allow, stop, perhaps close your eyes, bow your head and prayerfully and silently meditate on the sacrifice that Jesus made on the Cross out of love for you and everyone. You might even want to set your mobile phone to ring at 2.55pm to remind you to pause for prayer. You may choose to make up a prayer of your own just thanking the Lord – "heart speaking to heart", as was Blessed Cardinal Newman's motto. Or you might want to say a favourite short prayer such as "We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you, because by your holy Cross you have redeemed the world". The exact words used are not so important as just pausing to be with Jesus in that moment. In this way you're not only deepening your relationship with him, but quietly and confidently witnessing to your faith to those around you'. The practice of pausing for prayer at 3pm on Fridays has been a longstanding Catholic tradition because this is the time when Jesus died on the Cross. Additional prayer has been observed specifically on the first Friday of every month since the Seventeenth Century when Jesus appeared to St Margaret Mary Alacoque and spoke to her of His Sacred Heart.

SPECIAL COLLECTIONS

Special collections are taken up for various charities throughout the year. They are prescribed either by the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales or by the Diocese. There are also a few Voluntary Collections. The following notes give an indication as to how the money is applied.

DIOCESAN COLLECTIONS

These are eligible for Gift Aid

EDUCATION OF FUTURE PRIESTS: With the need to pray for priestly vocations, there is also the necessity of providing for the training of priests at home and abroad to serve the Diocese of Arundel and Brighton.

CATHEDRAL MAINTENANCE: Arundel Cathedral is the mother church of the Diocese and the church of its chief pastor, the Bishop. The heavy expenses for its upkeep have to be shared by the parishes of the Diocese.

RETIRED PRIESTS' FUND: To assist with the accommodation, welfare and support of diocesan priests in retirement.

FUND FOR THE MISSIONARY ENDEAVOUR OF THE DIOCESE:

The Diocese has a continuing link with the Diocese of Chulucanas, Peru, supporting diocesan priests serving in missions and assisting students from missionary dioceses.

LOURDES PILGRIMAGE FUND: This is taken on the Sunday nearest the Memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes (11 February) in those parishes in which no appeal is made on behalf of the Lourdes Pilgrimage Fund.

NATIONAL COLLECTIONS

Gift Aid is applicable only if using an envelope provided by the Charity

OVERSEAS MISSIONS: If a parish is unable to have the designated missionary appeal for the year, this collection is made in its place and provides the people of a parish with the opportunity to help the missionary work of so many priests, religious, and lay people, and thereby be joined with the Church in spreading the message of the Gospel.

LENTEN ALMS: These are offerings which are given during Lent and usually placed in a box in the church for that purpose. The proceeds are sent to the Contemplative Orders of women in the Diocese.

COMMUNICATIONS DAY: The Collection supports the work of the Catholic Communications Network in providing facilities and training for those working in the apostolate of the mass media.

PETER'S PENCE: By reason of the bond of unity and charity the Bishops of the Church with their people join together to produce those means which the Apostolic See needs to exercise its service of the Universal Church.

APOSTLESHIP OF THE SEA: The Apostleship of the Sea provides pastoral care throughout the UK for seafarers.

NATIONAL CATHOLIC FUND LEVY: The National Catholic Fund supplies the Bishops of England and Wales with the revenue necessary for the central administration of the Church in this country. A collection may be taken at any time when appropriate to offset the Levy.

DAY FOR LIFE: The Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, in response to St Pope John Paul II's Gospel of Life and the Bishops' teaching document Cherishing Life, set aside the last Sunday of July to celebrate and reflect on Life-related issues. The collection, which may be Gift Aided, is distributed to charities associated with the theme.

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY: Collection for The Association for Propagation of the Faith, one of the Pontifical Missionary Aid Societies, now described as MISSIO.

HOME MISSION SUNDAY: This is taken up on or near Home Mission Sunday, the third Sunday of September.

VOLUNTARY COLLECTIONS

Gift Aid is applicable only if using an envelope provided by the Charity

THE CATHOLIC ASSOCIATION FOR RACIAL JUSTICE (CARJ): This is taken up on Racial Justice Sunday, the Second Sunday of February.

CAFOD FAST DAYS: in Lent and at harvest time.

CATHOLIC EDUCATION SERVICE: This is the chief negotiating and advisory body on matters affecting all aspects of Catholic education.

CRIB COLLECTION: It is recommended that the Crib Collection should be donated to the Arundel and Brighton Crisis Fund c/o Catholic Children's Society (A&B Crisis Fund) 73 St Charles Square, London, W10 6EJ. Missio or the Friends of the Holy Land are also suitable beneficiaries for this collection.

PAX CHRISTI: This is taken on Peace Sunday, the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time.

SPECIAL COLLECTIONS 2020

LITURGICAL NORMS governing the manner of observing certain days in the Liturgical Year

TEXTS FOR MASS This edition of the Liturgical Ordo includes, for each day, page numbers from the Roman Missal. On that page will be found additional indications (not included in the Ordo) for the celebration of Mass on the particular day. These additional directives indicate, for example, the page numbers for any Common texts which are to be used in the celebrations of the Saints and other Mysteries of the Faith, whether the Gloria and the Creed are to be included in the Mass, and other provisions (such as Solemn Blessings) suggested for the day in question.

RANKS OF CELEBRATIONS Celebrations, according to the importance assigned to them, are distinguished one from another and termed: Solemnity, Feast, Memorial. These distinctions are indicated in the Ordo by the abbreviations 'Sol', 'Feast' and 'Mem'. Optional Memorials may be used *Ad libitum*.

SOLEMNITIES Solemnities are counted among the most important days, whose celebration begins, ordinarily, with First Vespers (Evening Prayer I) on the preceding day. Some Solemnities are also endowed with their own Vigil Mass, which is to be used on the evening of the preceding day, if an evening Mass is celebrated.

Solemnities take the Kyrie, Gloria, Creed, Sanctus and Agnus Dei.

FEASTS Feasts are celebrated within the limits of the natural day; accordingly, they have no First Vespers (Evening Prayer I), except in the case of Feasts of the Lord that fall on a Sunday in Ordinary Time or in Christmas Time and which replace the Sunday Office.

Feasts (other than those celebrated on a Sunday, when the Creed is to be used) take the Kyrie, Gloria, Sanctus and Agnus Dei.

MEMORIALS Memorials are either obligatory or optional. Their observance is integrated into the celebration of the occurring weekday in accordance with the norms set out in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal and of the Liturgy of the Hours.

PROPER CELEBRATIONS In this edition of the Ordo, there are no indications of Solemnities, Titles and Feasts proper to individual churches. Solemnities of Title are celebrated in accordance with I.4.c of the Table of Liturgical Precedence set out on pages 141 – 142 of the Roman Missal.

Likewise, the anniversary of the dedication (consecration) of one's own church is celebrated as a local Solemnity in accordance with I.4.b of the same Table of Precedence.

TRANSFERRED CELEBRATIONS For the pastoral good of the faithful, it is permitted to observe on Sundays in Ordinary Time those celebrations that fall during the week and that are agreeable to the devotion of the faithful, provided the celebrations rank above that Sunday in the Table of Liturgical Days (pages 141 – 142 of the Roman Missal). The Mass of such celebrations may be used at all the celebrations of Mass at which the people are present.

THE CALENDAR FOR THE EXTRAORDINARY FORM OF THE ROMAN RITE The Sundays of the Calendar for the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite are indicated in square brackets.
