



## CELEBRATING OUR SCHOOLS

### 150th Anniversary at St Mary's Catholic High School, Chesterfield

The happiest days of our lives are said to be our school days and readers may be hard pushed to disagree as they marvel over 150 years of educational anecdotes and pictures in a fabulous new book.

One of the Diocese's most successful schools is celebrating its 150th anniversary with the launch of a book charting its proud history in such a way as to evoke classroom memories for many generations.

The book entitled St Marys' Catholic High School, Chesterfield – Celebrating 150 Years has been written by Leonie Martin, who used to be a bursar at the school, and it was launched at Chesterfield Library on Saturday, 3 January. She said, "This book will appeal to a wide audience. It's not just about Catholic education in Chesterfield. It's also a social history. From the logbooks and other original sources we have been bequeathed, it offers a behind-the-scenes glimpse of our community through the decades."

From its humble origins in Spencer Street and Cross Street to its present day at Upper Newbold, the book tells a story through its Headteachers, staff and school records with over 300 pho-

Current Headteacher, Sean McClafferty said, "It's amazing. I feel privileged to be a part of St Mary's and to be part of such a deep, fascinating history."


The school which boasts an outstanding Ofsted rating was considered many years ago as undesirable. One former Headteacher between 1968 and 1992 recalls how he received calls asking if he had any idea of how rotten the school was and parents would only consider St Mary's if results improved.

But there are no such concerns today after the school was ranked among the country's best comprehensives in a Sunday Times' survey.

### FR REGINALD BESSLER RIP Homily at the Funeral Mass delivered by Fr Mark McManus

We are here to offer the Holy Mass; to make Thanksgiving. In offering to our loving Father the sacrifice of his Son, Jesus Christ, we seek today to give particular thanks for the life of a much-loved priest, Fr Reginald D Bessler.

Today, 17 December, marks the beginning of the second part of the Advent season. The part where we assert Christ's future coming in glory by beginning to focus upon his first coming to us in his Incarnation. In coming into existence as God-Man, Jesus entered our world of time and space, of flesh and the senses. In meditating upon this truth one of the early Christian Fathers, St Irenaeus, proclaimed that people may truly give glory to God only by being fully alive, Gloria Dei homo vivens.


Fully alive is how I think of Fr Bessler. His inner-child never truly died. Even when he reached ninety years he proclaimed he still felt fourteen inside. Indeed, when he left this parish (The Immaculate Conception, Herringthorpe) in 1999 at the age of seventy-seven to take up, what he called 'retirement with ministry', he treated himself to a low-slung, two-door sports coupe and enrolled himself on a course

for home computing so that he might not only conquer the road but the information super-highway also.

In the aftermath of World War One the Besslers were a very modern looking European family with Franco-German-Irish roots. Born in Sheffield on 27 July, 1922, to William and Edith Bessler, the young Reg, along with his older sister Marie-Antoinette, enjoyed a happy childhood. He always expressed a deep and abiding gratitude for his parents, the upbringing they had given him and for the family life that he and his sister shared. His sense of family remained very important to him and he remained close to members of his family, visiting them in Cheshire, London, Berlin, Paris and the Bahamas. He was proud of his family and their achievements.

At the age of six he was taken to see the Speedway at Owlerton Stadium, Hillsborough, and he never looked back. He discovered a lifelong passion for motor bikes and motor cars that endured until the end. When he left De La Salle School at fourteen he went to work on the bikes at Owlerton as an apprentice electrical-mechanic.

His Catholic upbringing stirred his soul and even as he worked on his



motor-bikes at Owlerton the young teenager heard the Lord call to him and invite him to follow him in service of his holy people.

He was ordained a priest at St Anne's Cathedral, Leeds on 24 April, 1949 and served many parishes in the Leeds Diocese and the Diocese of Hallam.

There are not so many now who can remember him as anything other than as a priest. This is surely appropriate for he was above all else Fr Bessler, a priest of the Church. His fervour in proclaiming the Gospel and celebrating the Sacraments are well known to

us. So too his good example and gentle, dignified service. Following his retirement he lived for another fifteen years. Twelve of those years were spent at The Annunciation, Chesterfield but he also lived at St Anne's Residential Home, Burghwallis, before finally returning to his native city at The Mother of God parish. To the end he remained what he was: a good and faithful priest, still able to help and inspire others.

Each class at St Joseph's studied an aspect of Zambia, and presented their work at a special assembly on Friday, 14 November, where they said "Good Bye" to Mr Kitakwa and Mrs Mukosai. The children sang the Zambian National Anthem and "God Save The Queen".




The first weekend retreat on 6-8

Speaking to coincide with the national distribution of information about the project titled Proclaim '15, Cardinal Nichols said, "This pioneering initiative is for all clergy, religious and lay people. Why? Because we all share the one mission – to PROCLAIM the joy of the Gospel. The wide range of practical ideas offered for planning and carrying out fruitful parish evangelisation will help us all to be better missionary disciples. Please don't let this opportunity pass you by."

Proclaim '15 aims to support, inspire and encourage new expressions of parish evangelisation involving all 22 of the Catholic dioceses ac countries, as well as the Bishopric of The Forces and the Personal Ordinariate of Our Lady of Walsingham. Cardinal Nichols added, "Proclaim '15 has a practical and 'how to' focus because while there is enthusiasm within the Catholic community to share confidently and joyfully our Faith, it can at times be hard to discern where to begin. This initiative aims to address that difficulty and is inspired by Pope Francis' Apostolic Exhortation, Evangelii Gaudium, in which he writes: 'I wish to encourage the Christian faithful to embark upon a new chapter of evangelisation marked by this joy, while pointing out new paths for the Church's journey in years to come." There are five parts to Proclaim '15

which include: the provision of small group materials for parishes (published in January); the resourcing of prayer vigils for the evening of 11 July 2015; the organisation of a National Catholic Evangelisation Conference in Birmingham on 11 July; the creation of templates to encourage the organisation of local Proclaim '15 events; the collation of New Evangelisation resources as a fruit of the National Conference.

Rt Rev Mark O'Toole, Chair of the Bishops' national Department for Evangelisation and Catechesis, said, "Pope Francis' Evangelii Gaudium offers us a blueprint for Catholic evangelisation. We are invited to give our encounter with Jesus Christ simple, but radical and creative, expression in our local communities. Proclaim '15 support and many parishes as possible to take new steps in service of this mission. It is being offered in partnership with generous co-workers in Catholic Dioceses across England and Wales and has a wholly practical focus. 

## Venerable Nano Nagle and the Presentation Sisters

The foundress of the Presentation Sisters was known as "the Lady of the Lantern" in 18th century Cork, Ire-land. At great personal risk, she opened several schools in Cork and after her work in her schools, she walked the streets of Cork visiting the homes of the poor. She carried a lantern to light her way.

Nano Nagle was born Honora Nagle in Ballygriffin in Cork in 1718, a turbulent time in Irish history due to the Penal Laws. The Nagle family was a wealthy Catholic family and Nano had the benefit of a European education and privileged lifestyle. She devoted her life to God and to working with

people on the margins of society.

Her mission of educating the poor began in a 'little school' in Cove Lane in Cork in 1754. In setting up schools in defiance of the established colonial order she sided with those made poor and challenged the institutional injustice that perpetuated marginalisation and poverty. Nano responded to the needs of her time and developed an educational curriculum suitable to the individual capabilities of her students. Hers was a global vision as in 1769 she wrote to a friend, "For I can assure you my schools are beginning to be of service in a great many parts of the world." Nano's famous words are, "If I could be of service in saving souls, in any part of the globe, I would be willing to do all in my power."

In 1775, she gathered a small group of women around her and founded the Presentation Sisters on Christmas Eve

which has become a place of prayer and pilgrimage in her honour.

The Presentation Sisters can be found in the five continents working with those made poor and enabling them to secure a better standard of living for To this day Presentation Sisters and Friends of Nano remain committed to working with those most in need through a broad range of ministries. Those ministries include spirituality, faith development, chaplaincies, lifelong learning and innovation, social finance, social inclusion, outreach, human rights and justice, ecology and sustainable living and healthcare proj-

On 31 October, 2013, Pope Francis proclaimed Nano Nagle, Venerable, "The Universal Church has recognised Nano, as a woman of faith, hope and heroic virtue, whose vision and work transformed the lives of so many. For our Sisters, Associates and Friends of Nano throughout the world, Nano has been and continues to be a source of inspiration and challenge, as we respond to the needs of today, in fidelity to the Gospel and in the spirit of Nano."

The Presentation Sisters came to Manchester in 1836, from Clonmel, County Tipperary, Ireland.

To-day we minister all over England. In the Diocese of Hallam, we can be found in Holy Family Parish, Sheffield and ministering in St Mary's Catholic Primary School and St Mary's Catholic High School in Chesterfield.


