# No. 333 Mark's 200 Miles **Cycling Adventure**

For most Sheffield teachers, the summer holidays are a time to relax ahead of the new term in September. Try telling that to Mark Conway.

The selfless St Wilfrid's Primary School: a Catholic Voluntary Academy teacher has just completed a gruelling charity bike ride to London which totalled around 200 miles.

Mark completed the challenge in just two days and cycled over 110 miles to Wellingborough on Saturday, 29 July before completing his journey the following day.

Mark, who is Head of RE at St Wilfrid's, raised over £1,000 for aid agency CAFOD and finished his journey at their head offices in Westminster.

CAFOD works in over forty countries, helping people to tackle poverty and injustice wherever the need is greatest.

Mark said, "CAFOD does a lot of good work and I wanted to raise some money in an exciting way.

"I stayed away from the M1 and got lost around Milton Keynes which added about 10 miles to my journey. This made the second day a bit of a killer and I was dreading it a bit, cycling around London can be quite hairy!

"It was great to have so many people cheering me on, including kids from my class and other members of staff at St Wilfrid's. I also got to meet a lot of people on the way who were very supportive.

"I won't be doing it again but I will definitely think of something else to do next vear!"

Mark initially hoped to raise £200 but has gone well beyond his target, with donations reaching £1,145.

CAFOD's representative in Hallam, Jeremy Cain, said, "Thank you to Mark for taking on this remarkable challenge we are very grateful for the time and effort he gave up.


"It sounds like a gruelling journey and it is testament to Mark that he was able to battle through.

# **Death of Cardinal Cormac Murphy-O'Connor**

On Friday, 1 September Cardinal Cormac Murphy-O'Connor died just a few days after his eighty fifth birthday.

He was appointed Archbishop of Westminster in 2000 and was made a Cardinal by Pope John Paul 11 in 2001.

In 2009 he became the first Archbishop of Westminster to retire.

Cardinal Murphy-O'Connor was known for his ecumenical work. He was awarded the Lambeth degree of Doctor of Divinity by the Archbishop of Canterbury in recognition of this work.

He was the first leader of the Roman Catholic Church in England and Wales to visit Sandringham as a guest of the Queen and preached to the Royal Family at St Mary's church on the estate. He also read prayers at the Queen Mother's funeral and thus became the first Cardinal to be involved in a royal funeral since 1509.

On becoming Archbishop of Westminster, Cardinal Murphy-O'Connor established an independent committee led by Lord Nolan to carry out a review on child protection practices in the Catholic Church. The recommendations from the Nolan Report were carried out and provided a model of good practice beyond England and Wales.







## SACRED HEART PARISHIONER Awarded International Fellowship

Councillor Ben Curran, a parishioner of Sacred Heart Parish in Hillsborough, Sheffield has been announced as one of the recipients of the prestigious Marshall Memorial Fellowship 2017-18, awarded by the German Marshall Fund of the United States.

The Marshall Memorial Fellowship is German Marshall Fund's flagship leadership development programme. It is awarded to exceptional leaders from all sectors, including business, government, and civil society. Selected fellows engage in six months of preparation designed to enhance their understanding of transatlantic relations, before embarking on twenty-four days of policy immersion across the Atlantic.

Councillor Curran was appointed Cabinet Member for Planning and Development in May after serving as Cabinet Member for Finance for nearly four years. He said, "As a big believer in lifelong learning, I am excited about the opportunity this fellowship brings. Sheffield, like many cities across the world, faces challenges around housing, climate change and the need to build a more inclusive local economy. This fellowship gives me the chance to witness firsthand how US cities are approaching these challenges, which will give me some great insights and ideas on how we can approach them here in Sheffield. "I also believe that Sheffield becoming more globally engaged and competitive is key to securing our economic future. During the fellowship, I plan to lay the foundations for future collaboration to help Sheffield improve its global engagement and gain wider recognition in the international arena.' Kevin Cottrell, Director of Transatlantic Leadership Initiatives at the German Marshall Fund commented, "German Marshall Fund has a long history of preparing leaders

from the United States and Europe for transatlantic relations. Ben has demonstrated that he is amongst the best and brightest in UK local government and is ready to step up to a new level. 



Can you write your own Thank You prayer for the food that you have eaten?


