HALLAM STUDENTS EMBARK ON YEAR OF VOLUNTEERING

Dozens of students from four schools in the Diocese of Hallam have embarked on a year of volunteering to help both local and international communities.

Year 11 pupils from All Saints Catholic High School in Sheffield, St Mary's Catholic High School in Chesterfield, the McAuley Catholic High School in Doncaster and Notre Dame High School in Sheffield gathered together to kick-start a year of fundraising with aid agency CAFOD.

The thirty-seven students are now part of CAFOD's Young Leaders programme. They attended a session on 11 October at All Saints High School aimed at developing several leadership skills, such as communication, organisation and problem solving.

The pupils also learned about key areas of CAFOD's work, including its programmes with partners in developing countries and its efforts to fight poverty and injustice.

Rose Krzyz ran the meeting alongside Alex Krzyz and Mike Campbell. Rose said, "The objectives for the day were to obtain a better understanding of CAFOD, to discuss leadership qualities and to explore different ways to raise awareness about CAFOD.

"The students also shared their experiences on social media channels such as Instagram and Snapchat.

"Members of staff from the schools told me that the students were very enthused by the challenges put forward to them."

Two more sessions are planned for the





Young Leaders on 31 January and 5 May next year.

In between the training sessions, the pupils will be putting their knowledge and skills into practice by organising fundraising activities, taking part in the charity's campaigns, delivering assemblies and leading others to learn about CAFOD's work.

Last year, over two hundred and fifty young people were trained as part of the young leadership programme and they collectively reached out to almost forty thousand people through their volunteering.

CAFOD representative in Hallam, Jeremy Cain, said, "Young people play a very important part in CAFOD's work and I know we have signed on thirty-seven brilliant students.

"I am looking forward to seeing what the pupils achieve during their time volunteering for CAFOD."



Hallam Catholics asked to Help Homelessness Service

Youth homelessness charity, Depaul volunteer for the night. UK has seen a 21 percent rise in referrals to its emergency accommodation Nightstop this year- a trend reflected in South Yorkshire.

In the first half of this year, Depaul Nightstop services have seen an increase in demand by over 300 referrals to reach more than 1,400 compared to the same period in 2016.

The local Nightstop service in South Yorkshire, which opened in 2016 with support from players of People's Postcode Lottery, has also noticed an increase in demand as young people become more aware of its presence in the local commu-

The network, which provides a safety net for young people with nowhere else to go, places them in the home of a vetted and trained

One young person recently supported by Depaul said, "I used Nightstop for a couple of months and I felt safe. They DBS-check all the people you stay with and you're invited into a family home for the night. The families go to great lengths to make you feel at home."

Amy Smith, Manager of Nightstop South Yorkshire, is now concerned for young people as temperatures drop this winter. She is worried demand for the service will increase as the Christmas period draws to a

She said, "One of the busiest periods is post-Christmas. People try to patch things up in this season and then things start to go wrong. The week between Christmas and New Year can be particularly difficult."

Hallam (Bethlehem) Fund **Christmas Appeal**

As the Feast of the Nativity of Our Lord approaches we again appeal for your support to help elderly people in Bethlehem, the place of his birth.

We all want to enjoy Christmas with the giving of presents, plenty of food and celebration. Many feel they have more than enough. A great many want to do something for others at Christmas.

There are people in Bethlehem who have little or nothing. Bethlehem, in the emerging state of Palestine, does not have the infrastructure or resources to provide social care, health care or state pensions. Peace has not come there and communities, depending on tourism, do not have income particularly in times of turmoil when the tourists do not come. In all of this the elderly are among the most vulnerable.

There is, however, hope. St Martha's House is a locally established 'Care and Repair' Centre for elderly women. Its ethos is Christian but it is open to all. Its resources are meagre.

St Martha's House extends a compassionate hand of support to poor, lonely and vulnerable elderly women in Bethlehem. Here ladies meet for companionship, food, personal care and mutual support. Without St Martha's, and its limited programmes, many elderly women would literally be abandoned.

The rented rooms are cramped and admit only 22 people at any one time. Some help with running costs is provided by other charities but, even with outside help, St Martha's House can only cater for a total of 37 women on a rota basis. The list of those who are known to be in need is many times that number. There is no provision for elderly men.

The local community cannot make St Martha's House permanent. They simply do not have the resources.

The Hallam (Bethlehem) Fund is a step closer to providing permanent care facilities for elderly men and women and a hospice for the dying is now in sight. The Trustees are in the process of getting a site on which to build. To build on the site the need for support intensifies.

Can you, your group or your parish help?

Last year we had donations from Parish Cribs; a UCM group collected 20p pieces; proceeds from parish concerts; coffee mornings; a golf day and people being sponsored to undertake various events. We have benefitted too from the generosity of individuals who make regular monthly contributions and we have had some very generous donations.

The Fund now stands at £180,000. Thus we continue to edge our way slowly but very purposefully towards our goal. The Trustees wish to thank all those who have contributed and supported the Fund.

Please pray for the success of this project and in your generosity please support the elderly in Bethlehem whatever way you can this Christmas.

The honour recognises a lifetime of service to education and particularly for her outstanding impact in supporting chil-




dren and young people grieving a significant and often devastating loss in their

OBERAMMERGAU PASSION PLAY 2020

Brendan Lally tells us, "In 2010, with the late Fr Gerard Harney, I organised a large group visit to the Oberammergau Passion Play. It was a wonderful experience, very moving and most memorable. I vowed then that the 2020 play would be on my bucket list.

"The event takes place from May to October every ten years and is about the suffering, death and resurrection of Christ. Residents of the Bavarian town have carried out the tradition for over 380 years. There are just over 5000 inhabitants and whilst different venues have been used in the past, the play is now performed in the Passion Play Theatre which has a capacity of 4800.

"The stage is almost the length of a football pitch and it was amazing to see how many people and animals, as well as scenery, could be on the stage at any one time. The acting, the costumes, the singing and orchestration were astounding. Last-

ing for six hours, with a dinner break in between, it was a unique experience.

"The town of Oberammergau has beautiful wood carvings and wall paintings on so many properties and this adds to its appeal as a tourist spot.

"The Passion Play in Oberammergau has worldwide appeal and is invariably "sold out" months in advance. There are about 100 performances. Anyone interested should be making plans now. The most expensive seats for 2020 are already fully booked! Our parish of St Mary's, Penistone is proposing an eight day air and coach package (including Category @ seating plus excursions to Austria) and accommodation in a 4 star hotel. The estimated cost is in the region of £1250 per person.
