



### WELSH PROVINCE

The area covered by this Directory and Year book comprises Wales and Herefordshire. Since March 1987 the province has contained three dioceses; the Metropolitan Archdiocese of Cardiff and the suffragan sees of Menevia and Wrexham.

### Historical background

The area known as the Welsh Province, comprising Wales and Herefordshire, has a long history of Christianity. The martyrdom of SS Alban, Julius and Aaron is the first landmark in our Christian history. It is probable that they were put to death in the persecution of Valeriam 257-9. It is believed Alban was martyred at where is now the City of St Albans and it is believed that Julius and Aaron were citizens of Caerleon and were probably martyred there. We know that at the Council of Arles three British Bishops were present.

During these years Christianity made great strides and spread throughout the whole land until the final withdrawal of the Roman Legions in 406. While Eastern Britain eventually became England through the Anglo Saxon invasion, Wales remained steadfastly Christian, which produced many great Christian Leaders, including SS Iltyd, Dyfrig, David and Teilo.

In 597 St Augustine was sent by the Pope to begin the conversion of the pagan English. He had two meetings with the British Bishops and Abbots. St Augustine wanted the Welsh Church to amend a number of its local traditions, particularly to keep Easter according to the Roman date. Without doubt, St Augustine handled this badly. The result was an excess of ill-feeling between the English and Welsh Churches which Augustine's successor, St Lawence, caused in Ireland and Scotland as well. The dispute lasted until 768 when a young Welsh Bishop called Elfodd persuaded his fellow countrymen to come into line with the Roman Easter date.

In the words of the great Welsh historian, Sir John Edward Lloyd, 'loyalty of the Welsh to the See of Peter was not in question and Rome found her commands as readily obeyed in Wales as in all other parts of the West.'

The capture and re-organisation of the Welsh ecclesiastical system by the Norman conquerors saw the confirmation of four Welsh dioceses, St. David's,

Bangor, Llandaff and St. Asaph with the appointment of Bishops in line with the wishes of the Norman overlords. They became accepted, often with some reluctance, by the people of Wales. Extensive foundation of monasteries, in particular by the Cistercians, and later the influence of the Franciscan, Dominican and other Friars, helped the process of pacification and acceptance until the Reformation.

Under Henry VIII, Wales became part of the realm of England and the four dioceses part of his autonomous "Church of England" of which he proclaimed himself the "supreme head". All the Welsh religious houses were suppressed in 1536 with deep social implications for the people and except for a brief period under Mary the members of the Catholic Church in Wales and England then entered a two hundred year period of deprivation and persecution.

Despite early resistance to the changes, the Old Faith barely survived in many parts of Wales. Large numbers of the Catholic gentry faced penury and imprisonment for being recusants - refusing to attend the new services in the parish church. Missionary priests educated abroad were hunted down when they returned and tried to minister to pockets of Catholics in secret houses. Being hung, drawn and quartered was the penalty they faced for being "massing" priests. These policies gradually prevailed and the supply of priests diminished drastically - except in some large estates owned by heroic and influential Catholics, particularly in Monmouthshire. Families like the

Vaughans, the Gunters and the Herberts hid and maintained chaplains so that their own families and their workers could attend the celebration of the Mass.

Gradually the penal laws against Catholics were eased and in 1829 this culminated in Catholic Emancipation when a great many - but by no means all - of the restrictions on Catholics were swept away.

From 1688, despite the danger to the individuals appointed, Rome chose men of piety, integrity, sacrifice and learning to act as vicars apostolic to areas of Britain. Wales and Herefordshire were part of what was known as the Western District This was

administered by the following monks and friars whose appointments as vicars apostolic carried the rank of bishop.

- 1688-1708 Philip Michael Ellis OSB
- 1715-1750 Matthew Prichard OFM
- 1750-1763 Lawrence York OSB
- 1763-1797 Charles Walmsley OSB
- 1797-1809 W. G. Sharrock OSB
- 1809-1829 Peter B. Collingridge OFM

### 1829-1840 Peter Augustine Baines OSB

In 1840 the Western District was divided into two. Herefordshire, Monmouthshire and Wales became the Welsh District, with Bishop Brown, OSB as vicar apostolic. Ten years later further changes were made to the Welsh District. In 1850 the diocese of Newport and Menevia was set up as a suffragan see of Westminster diocese, with Bishop Brown in charge. He was followed by Bishop Hedley:

### 1850-1880 Thomas Joseph Brown OSB 1880-1895 John Cuthbert Hedley OSB

Boundaries were changed in 1895, when the diocese of Newport was redefined as comprising the counties of Glamorgan, Monmouth and Hereford. Bishop Hedley was reappointed in 1895 and continued until 1916. Francis Mostyn was vicar apostolic for the rest of the area until 1898 when it was made the diocese of Menevia of which he became the Ordinary.

In 1916 the Cardiff Province was established, comprising the Metropolitan Archdiocese of Cardiff with the diocese of Menevia as a suffragan see, and the following served as archbishops:

The Bishops of Menevia from 1898 to 2008 are listed at the beginning of Menevia section. When the Province was restructured in 1987, James Hannigan, previously Bishop of Menevia, was translated to the new diocese of Wrexham and Daniel Mullins became bishop for the restructured Menevia diocese.

Grade I Buildings of exceptional, usually national interest. Grade II<sup>\*</sup> Particularly important buildings of more than special interest. Grade II Buildings of special interest, which warrant every effort being made to preserve them.

The listing of a church confers recognition of its special interest and unique character, but also brings responsibility; it is a criminal offence to alter, extend or demolish a listed building without consent! Works which affect the character of a listed building require Listed Building Consent. In the case of listed churches this consent, called a Faculty, is obtained from the Historic Churches Committee.

The Historic Churches Committee is established by the Bishops of the Province and its members are appointed by them. Members either have specialist knowledge of conservation matters or represent the interests of the Church. The committee operates to procedures developed under national Planning Laws. Parishes that include listed churches have received copies of the appropriate procedures and guidance on how to proceed. ### The Most Reverend Mark O'Toole

Born 22nd June 1963. Educated at St Ignatius Primary School, Stamford Hill and St Thomas More Secondary School in Wood Green and graduated at the University of Leicester with a BSc in Geography. Entered into priestly formation at Allen Hall Seminary, London and graduated with a BD in Sacred Theology from the University of London (Heythrop College) in 1989. Ordained Priest on 9th June 1990 by Cardinal Basil Hume. 1990-1992 entered further studies completing an M.Phil in Theology at the University of Oxford. Worked as an assistant priest in St Mary Magdalene parish, Willesden Green; whilst also working as a part-time lecturer in Catechesis. Joined the staff at Allen Hall Seminary full time from 1997-2022 as a lecturer in Theology and as a Formation Adviser to the seminarians. Served as Dean of Studies from 1999-2002. Obtained a Sacred License in Theology from the Pontifical University, Leuven in 2000. In 2002 was appointed Private Secretary to Cardinal Cormac Murphy-O'Connor. In 2008 was appointed Rector of Allen Hall Seminary. Installed ninth Bishop of Plymouth in January 2014 where he was appointed an Honorary Canon at both Truro and Exeter Cathedrals. Installed as Archbishop of Cardiff and Bishop of Menevia in June 2022.

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### **CARDIFF AND MENEVIA FOREWORD**

One of the first prayers that we learn as children is the Our Father. Indeed, this is very appropriate, since it is the prayer that Jesus taught his disciples in response to their request 'Lord, teach us to pray'. It is therefore a prayer that we, His disciples of the 21st century, hold dear to our hearts.

This year, the Church is encouraging us to deepen our prayer life, focussing particularly on the Our Father, in preparation for the Jubilee Year of 2025, entitled Pilgrims of Hope. It seems to me that the Our Father can provide us with a kind of blueprint of how we can live out our call to discipleship and evangelisation in this day and age. Indeed, what is the life of discipleship if not a consistent living out of our relationship with God, our Father – a constant cry from our hearts of those warm and comforting words 'Our Father' – and bearing witness to others of the beauty of that relationship? It involves giving God the greatest glory possible, that His Name may truly be 'hallowed' – held holy. It is an effort to truly build the Kingdom of God here on earth, here in Wales and Herefordshire, and to constantly seek to do His will 'on earth as it is in Heaven'. It is receiving from God 'our daily bread' in the form of all the graces that He, in His fatherly love, bestows on us. It is acknowledging those times when we fall, and rising up again, imploring His mercy, which is without end. It is forgiving others when they 'trespass against us'. It is that constant effort, relying solely on God's grace, to fight temptation and avoid evil.

One of the great joys I have had over the past year has been going around the two Dioceses, both visiting the Clergy and celebrating the sacrament of Confirmation in the parishes. I have been greatly encouraged by this. From visiting and getting to know our priests, I have seen how they are trying to faithfully live out their own relationship with the Lord as His sons, and their commitment and dedication to serving you, their people, in helping you to live out that relationship with your Father in Heaven. I am extremely grateful to all of our Clergy, and I ask you to pray for them. The Confirmations I have celebrated have given me a great sense of the life and joy that is so much a part of the faith of our young people, from which we can all learn, and which must be a part of the Kingdom that we build.

I saw this life and joy in two of the other highlights of this past year for me – attending the Flame Congress in London in March, and then attending World Youth Day in Lisbon in the summer, with a group of 60 young people from our two Dioceses. They were truly an inspiration to me in their eagerness to get involved, their zeal for Jesus Christ, and the fellowship that they fostered with one another. It is my sincere hope that we can build on these experiences to provide our young people with more ways here in the Dioceses of meeting together and deepening their faith. This is one of the many things that I look forward to in the coming year. Please pray for our young people, and for a youth ministry in our Dioceses that will serve them well.

It was a great honour for me to celebrate two ordinations this summer: Deacon Dale Cutlan to the Diaconate for Cardiff in June and Fr Gregory Beckett to the Priesthood for Menevia in July. Please also pray for these men, and that more men will respond to the Lord's call to serve Him in the Priesthood in these lands.

This year, we continue our journey along the Synodal Path, culminating in the first of two sessions of the Synod of Bishops in Rome in October. As some of you may have heard me say before, for me, the synodal path is about the conversion of our hearts:

discerning how we as the Church, and each of us individually, can be more open to the Holy Spirit and thus deepen our sense of being sons and daughters of God, 'Our Father', and deepen our love for God the Son, our brother, Jesus Christ. We make this journey together, we walk together on this path, for we do not pray 'My Father', but 'Our Father'.

Over this past year, it has also been good to see this ecclesial reality played out in how our two Dioceses have worked together in various areas and ways, drawing on each other's strengths in order to best serve the Mission of Jesus Christ and build the Kingdom of God.

So, as we approach another year, let us take up the invitation of the Church to deepen our prayer together, so that the fruits may overflow into our daily lives, that 'Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in Heaven'. Please pray for me, and be assured of my daily prayers for you all.

# THE IMPOSITION OF THE PALLIUM



#### The Papal Nuncio with Archbishop Mark

The Pallium signifies the communion between the Bishop of Rome and the Metropolitan Archbishops whom he has appointed to oversee the Church. Archbishop Mark's Pallium is embroidered with red silk crosses – to remind the wearer of the five wounds of Christ crucified for us. Three pins are inserted into three of the crosses to remind him of the three nails that caused these wounds in each of the hands and feet of Christ. The end tips of the garment are embroidered with black silk, reminiscent of the feet of the lambs the Good Shepherd laid down his life for so that they may walk safely on the path of life.

Archbishop Mark received the Pallium from Pope Francis on 29 June last year to bring back to the local Church. Its 'imposition' upon him took place during Mass in St David's Cathedral, Cardiff on 22 June last year at the hands of the Pope's representative in this Country, the Apostolic Nuncio, Archbishop Miguel Maury Buendia. This makes more visible to us all our close bond with the Universal Church and our communion with the Holy Father.



# WORLD YOUTH DAY PORTUGAL

For those of us who have attended World Youth Day before, there is some expectation of the fact that it will involve a real pilgrimage experience of getting outside our comfort zone. This is in respect of sometimes sleeping on camp beds or floors, sharing showers, with varying degrees of warmth and facilities and queueing for food and eating whatever is put in front of us. WYD is anything but a holiday.

However, what it does offer, particularly for the young, is an opportunity to realise that as young Catholics, they are part of something much much bigger than themselves in a way that is almost impossible to experience and appreciate in the UK. WYD usually involves going to a far off place, usually somewhere quite exotic and imbued with a Catholic culture, with long days being hosted by local parishes and dioceses, visiting new places, sampling the local cuisine, praying in incredibly beautiful churches and cathedrals and celebrating Mass together, both as a smaller group and with literally hundreds of thousands if not millions of other young Catholics and with thousands of priests, bishops, and, in the final week, the Pope himself.

All the faith-based activities, the prayer time and catechesis is balanced by many opportunities to socialise, meet new friends and develop lasting relationships with those we have travelled alongside. Portugal offered all of this; spending the first week near Porto (where the fortified wine comes from), staying in accommodation near to the beach, offered many opportunities to travel into the city as groups, to learn, sightsee and soak in the culture. A particular highlight was watching the sunset over the Atlantic ocean next to a chapel on the rocks as we ate and drank at a local restaurant and had opportunities for the young pilgrims to have some fun. We then moved to Fatima, which was a lot more comfortable, accommodation wise, and provided opportunities to learn about the visionaries, Ven. Lucia & Sts Jacinta and Francesco, well as take part in the rosary procession there and the penitential path.

The final main events in Lisbon were as expected; huge numbers of crowds flying flags representing every nation under the Sun coming in the millions to spend the final night at Parque Tejo. There were crowds settling down in sleeping bags literally as far as the eye could see in every direction, even over the other side of the river up to the main stage where the Pope was to celebrate Mass the next day. It was very clear that our young people had never experienced anything like this before and were absolutely amazed by it. A nice highlight for me was bumping into some Chaplaincy alumni at the vigil in Lisbon, who had returned home and, in several cases, gone back to Europe or America. To summarise, world youth Day is always exhausting but the memories and friendships that are forged last a lifetime.

# THE SISTERS OF ST. JOSEPH LEAVE LLANTARNAM ABBEY

On the 6th July 2023, the 150 years of presence of the Sisters of St. Joseph in Newport was celebrated with Mass in St. Mary's at which the chief celebrant was Archbishop Mark O'Toole. It was attended by many priests and people of the Newport area who had known the Sisters over the years and who, after Mass, enjoyed sharing memories in the Institute.

2023 will also be remembered as the year when the Sisters left Llantarnam Abbey their homebase wherever they were missioned in Wales, England, Scotland or Ireland for seventy-seven years. The abbey was held in affection not only by the Sisters, but also by the many people who had come to know them through their many ministries over the years or by coming to Mass there in pre-Covid days. In the end, the building and grounds were no longer suitable, and last summer, the Sisters moved to new accommodation in Newport and New Inn.

The Sisters first came to Wales at the request of Fr. Michael Bailey I.C., the Parish Priest of St. Mary's, Newport, when, as far back as 1873, three Sisters came to teach in what is now called the 'Institute', next-door to the church. They lodged initially in town with an Irish lady married to an Italian jeweller, then acquired 'Arundel House' at the top of Stow Hill in Newport. In time this became the Provincial House, novitiate, and school. By the late 1940s, however, more space was needed, and the move was made to Llantarnam Abbey.

Over the years the Sisters have established and taught in many schools in the archdiocese, founded a hospital and hospice service, run a spirituality centre, worked in social services, provided pastoral care in parishes and prisons and served the archdiocese in numerous other ways.

Whether still active or taking life more gently now, the Sisters remain, by their apostolate of prayer, at the heart of the Church in the archdiocese.



# THE MINISTRY OF READING

"Receive the book of Holy Scripture and faithfully transmit the Word of God so that it may germinate and bear fruit in the hearts of men."

To have that said to you while receiving a bible from the hands of the successor to St. Peter in the basilica that bears his name on the Sunday of the Word of God, you do not take lightly.

You know how it came about although you never dreamt that what you'd hoped and prayed for for years would ever impinge on, let alone involve, you. Vatican II set the scene for the greater recognition of lay ministry in the Church but nothing had happened in any meaningful sense. Pope Francis changed that and through various motu proprios he has enabled lay people of both sexes to be instituted as lectors and acolytes (hitherto reserved to the clergy) and, newly, catechists. He instituted six lectors from around the world last year and this year I was privileged to be one of three, the other two coming from the Democratic Republic of the Congo and the Philippines, to be so instituted. It is the Holy Father's wish, expressed in those motu proprios, that diocesan bishops throughout the world do the same and I fervently hope they do so because the laity, in reality, are the church. As Cardinal Newman famously said, the church would look foolish without them.

That having been said, life for this particular layman will never be the same again so thanks be to God.

#### LOOKING TOWARDS THE JUBILEE YEAR 2025

Next year the Church celebrates the Jubilee Year 2025. What is a Jubilee Year? Where does it come from? And what is the Jubilee Year 2025 about?

A Jubilee Year is a special celebration the Church holds every 25 years. It's a year of pilgrimages, of a focus on the spiritual life, of reconciliation and special liturgies, marking a general turn towards God in thanksgiving, and in repentance.



The root for Jubilee Years can be found in the Old Testament. The Jewish people passed on a set of customs that gave them a 7-year cycle. After every seventh year, Israel celebrated a Jubilee - slaves would be set free, debts would be cancelled, and leased property would be returned to its original owners. Such acts were ways of honouring God reminding the people that all things belong to Him and justice was served as equity among God's people was restored. They pointed to the longed for coming of the Messiah and the harmony he was to bring. Fast forward to the Gospels and Jesus highlights that in Him this comes to fulfilment. In Luke as he reads from the prophet Isaiah he says:

"He has sent me to bring the good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives and to the blind new sight, to set the downtrodden free, to proclaim the Lord's year of favour." And "Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." (see Lk 4:16ff)

In Catholic Tradition, we have taken on the custom of the Jubilee Year since the year 1300. Pope Boniface VII declared "a year for the forgiveness of all sins" during which the pope would ask the God to deliver the people from a time of war and pandemic. The Holy Father also declared such 'Holy Years' should take place every 100 years. Over the centuries this has evolved into a practice into a celebration every 25 years, known as 'Jubilee Years'.

#### Jubilee Year 2025

The Jubilee Year 2025 will focus on the theological virtue of Hope as the world emerges from the crisis of the Covid-19 pandemic and the economic effects. The theme for the year will be "Pilgrims of Hope". The year is intended to help fan the flame of hope once again in our world after the turbulent times of the past few years. With hope we are called to rebuild fraternity in our communities and around the world. Details are thin at this time but more information will become available throughout this year.

#### Preparing for the Jubilee: 2024 – The Year of Prayer

The jubilee calls for us to set out on a journey and to cross boundaries, both physically and spiritually. It is important to prepare ourselves well for our journey and learn about where we are going. Therefore, 2024 has been designated by Pope Francis as the 'Year of Prayer'. Prayer "to renew our desire to be in the presence of the Lord, to listen to him and to adore him ... to thank God for the many gifts of his love for us" (Letter of the Holy Father to Msgr Rino Fisichella for the Jubilee 2025).

Throughout the year our parishes will be invited to take part in activities and events around the Diocese as part of our preparations for the Jubilee Year. Only through our preparation can we truly be "pilgrims of hope" and transform not only our own lives but also the lives of the people around us. Let us pray for each other throughout 2024 that we may be open to experience in our parishes and across our Diocese all the graces the Lord wishes to give during the Jubilee Year.

# THE PERMANENT DIACONATE

Archdiocese of Cardiff and the Diocese of Menevia.

The Permanent Diaconate is one of the earliest expressions of the Apostolic Church, established by the apostles' ordination of "seven men of good standing, full of the Spirit and of wisdom". These were to serve the early Christian community.

According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the Permanent Diaconate is an important enrichment for the mission of the Church. It is a vocation. It is a calling by God to serve the Church and all God's creation in a particular way.

The first step for those considering the Permanent Diaconate is to discuss matters with your parish priest. Following this initial period of discernment the second step, with the support of your parish priest, is to discuss your possible calling with those responsible for the programme of formation. Archbishop Mark has set up a Permanent Diaconate Team consisting of:

In general, the programme of formation to ordination takes about five years which includes a year of preparation and a four-year part time course at a seminary.

Further details can be obtained from the Director or one of the team. Possible candidates may also find it useful to have a discussion with existing deacons.

Amongst the beautiful scenery of County Mayo, Ireland, can be found Knock Shrine, where, in August 1879, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared, along with St Joseph, St John the Baptist, and a Lamb, representing Christ, the Lamb of God. For the last 150 years, Knock has welcomed pilgrims from all over the world. Last September, Archbishop Mark led a small group of 20 pilgrims to spend time with Our Lady at this special place.

After arriving in Knock airport, the building of which had been organised and overseen by the most famous Parish Priest of Knock, Mgr James Horan, the next day was spent in and around the shrine itself, learning about the story of Knock and praying. We were struck by the sense of peace and tranquillity in this little place. Archbishop Mark celebrated Mass with the Sacrament of Anointing in the Basilica – a very special moment of the pilgrimage. He spoke of the uniqueness of the Marian apparition at Knock in its silence: Our Lady did not say anything. This teaches us of the need to stop, be silent and listen, before God and before our neighbour. He also highlighted the importance of walking together, as we do on pilgrimage, and as we currently are in the Church as we tread the synodal path.

The following two days were spent visiting places of significance in the surrounding area. We spent time in the Fr Peyton Centre to learn about Venerable Patrick Peyton, the inspirational 'Rosary Priest', who encouraged the praying of the rosary in families, before visiting the Museum of Country Life, learning about how the people of Ireland lived and survived in the country down through the ages. Archbishop Mark celebrated Mass with the group in Ballintubber Abbey, an ancient Augustinian Monastery, dating back to the 13th century, with a fascinating history, where weekend Mass has continued to be celebrated virtually without interruption since its foundation, even, for over 200 years, without a roof!

Throughout our trip, we also spent valuable time with each other, sharing our experiences, laughing together, and even with a bit of singing and dancing!

We returned home after our short pilgrimage having learnt much, made new friends, seen many new things, and, most importantly, grown closer to Jesus and Mary.



## CENTENARY OF ST ILLTYD'S CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOL

St Illtyd's College was founded in 1923, when the De La Salle Brothers came to Cardiff to open a Roman Catholic school for boys. The school was opened as a grammar school on a site in Courtenay Road, Splott. In 1941, during the Second World war the main school building was badly damaged by a bomb. Severe overcrowding due to the damage sustained and growing pupil numbers led to the school moving to its current location on Newport Road in Rumney and a house was built at the rear of the school for the La Sallian Brothers to live in.

As many know, the St Illtyd's of now is a merger between the college and Heathfield House. Heathfield House was a Roman Catholic grammar school for girls, founded by the Sisters of Providence of the Institute of Charity in 1867. It was initially called St Joseph's Grammar School, though it moved to Heathfield House on Richmond Road in 1877 which led to the school changing its name. In the 1970s the school moved again, to a site on Ty Gwyn Road in Penylan.

The two schools were merged as part of the reorganisation of Catholic education in 1987. The school was renamed St Illtyd's Catholic High School, and was now a coeducational school for pupils aged 11-16. Sixth form provision was transferred to the new St David's Catholic College situated in the vacated Heathfield campus on Ty Gwyn Road.

The school was rebuilt on its existing site in 2002-3. Where we still are today.

The school, therefore, has gone through many changes since its inception in 1923. Although the De La salle Brothers and Sisters of Providence have withdrawn from the school their legacy lives on in the pupils they taught and the schools continued emphasis on the gospel values and developing every young persons relationship with Jesus Christ.

The Centenary year has, and will, involve Masses, centenary dinners and various school events. It is always a privilege to welcome "Old Illts" back to the school and the current

Illtydians have learned so much from listening to their predecessor's school experiences. How they coped without a mobile phone has been a real eye opener!

There is a lot to celebrate and there is a lot to look forward to as the school enters its second century. Our core purpose is "Together in Christ we make a difference" Those pupils, parents, teachers and members of the religious communities certainly have for the last hundred years. The challenge for our community today is to emulate them and to continue to make St Illtyd's the best school it can be for the families who entrust their children to our care. In doing so we can enable those children to be all that they can be and together with Christ, lead us into the next hundred years, and beyond.

#### FOREWORD





One of the first prayers that we learn as children is the Our Father. It is receiving from God 'our daily bread' in the form of all the graces that He, in His fatherly love, bestows on us. It is acknowledging those times when we fall, and rising up again, imploring His mercy, which is without end. It is forgiving others when they 'trespass against us'. It is that constant effort, relying solely on God's grace, to fight temptation and avoid evil.

One of the great joys I have had over the past year has been going around the two Dioceses, both visiting the Clergy and celebrating the sacrament of Confirmation in the parishes. I have been greatly encouraged by this. From visiting and getting to know our priests, I have seen how they are trying to faithfully live out their own relationship with the Lord as His sons, and their commitment and dedication to serving you, their people, in helping you to live out that relationship with your Father in Heaven. I am extremely grateful to all of our Clergy, and I ask you to pray for them. The Confirmations I have celebrated have given me a great sense of the life and joy that is so much a part of the faith of our young people, from which we can all learn, and which must be a part of the Kingdom that we build.

I saw this life and joy in two of the other highlights of this past year for me - attending

the Flame Congress in London in March, and then attending World Youth Day in Lisbon in the summer, with a group of 60 young people from our two Dioceses. They were truly an inspiration to me in their eagerness to get involved, their zeal for Jesus Christ, and the fellowship that they fostered with one another. It is my sincere hope that we can build on these experiences to provide our young people with more ways here in the Dioceses of meeting together and deepening their faith. This is one of the many things that I look forward to in the coming year. Please pray for our young people, and for a youth ministry in our Dioceses that will serve them well.

It was a great honour for me to celebrate two ordinations this summer: Deacon Dale Cutlan to the Diaconate for Cardiff in June and Fr Gregory Beckett to the Priesthood for Menevia in July. Please also pray for these men, and that more men will respond to the Lord's call to serve Him in the Priesthood in these lands.

This year, we continue our journey along the Synodal Path, culminating in the first of two sessions of the Synod of Bishops in Rome in October. As some of you may have heard me say before, for me, the synodal path is about the conversion of our hearts: discerning how we as the Church, and each of us individually, can be more open to the Holy Spirit and thus deepen our sense of being sons and daughters of God, 'Our Father', and deepen our love for God the Son, our brother, Jesus Christ. We make this journey together, we walk together on this path, for we do not pray 'My Father', but 'Our Father'.

Over this past year, it has also been good to see this ecclesial reality played out in how our two Dioceses have worked together in various areas and ways, drawing on each other's strengths in order to best serve the Mission of Jesus Christ and build the Kingdom of God.

So, as we approach another year, let us take up the invitation of the Church to deepen our prayer together, so that the fruits may overflow into our daily lives, that 'Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in Heaven'. Please pray for me, and be assured of my daily prayers for you all.



#### **CANON NICHOLAS JENKINS RIP**



We are sorry to report the death of Canon Nicholas Jenkins on 24th May 2023. His funeral Mass took place on Wednesday 21st June at St. Mary of the Angels, Kings Road, Canton, Cardiff.

Nicholas Albert George Jenkins was born in Llanharen in 1944 being the last of 8 children to Giovanna Negri and William Jenkins. His father William died young and in 1950 the family moved to Canton where Canon Nicholas was introduced to the church as part of his attendance at St Marys school with his siblings. Both he and his older brother Joe were Altar boys at St Marys.

From a very young age Canon Nicholas had a passion for politics and public speaking and found himself being more involved with the Labour Party where he made some very prominent friends in Lord George Thomas, Lord Paul Murphy and Baroness Hoey.

Canon Nicholas loved nothing more than preparing for a good debate and speaking to a prestigious audience. One of his most prized achievements was winning the annual Observer Mace competition twice; and he remains the only person to do so. He spoke against some formidable characters including Alf Garnett, Mary Whitehouse and Betty Boothroyd and the well-known journalist and politician Malcolm Muggeridge.

In 1965 at just 20 years old Canon Nicholas launched his career in politics and was elected as a leading member of Cardiff City Council. A lasting influence on his life was his mentor Lord George Thomas who had influenced his studies and early career choices. Canon Nicholas attended the prestigious College Harlech where he continued to hone his skills as a public speaker. In 1969 he succeeded Neil Kinnock as the president of the Student's Union at the University of Wales. In 1973 Canon Nicholas became a Master of Education at Oxford University where his ability to achieve success within high offices continued.

Canon Nicholas briefly taught at a number of schools in Birmingham and in the late 1970's became the deputy head of St Illtyd's College Cardiff before being appointed as the headmaster for Fitzalen School in 1976 making him the youngest headmaster of the largest school in Wales.

It was clear to Canon Nicholas that despite having the most successful career as a politician and educator his vocation in life was to be a servant of the Church. In 1985 he applied to test this vocation with the Diocese of Menevia and was sent to the Pontifical Beda College in Rome. In 1989 he was ordained at St Joseph's Cathedral by Bishop Mullins, and his first appointment was as the assistant priest at the Cathedral.

After only a few months at the Cathedral Canon Nicholas became the Parish priest at Ammanford but quickly found his more permanent home as the Parish priest of Carmarthen. It was at Carmarthen where he spoke about his most treasured memories as a priest where he devoted himself to visiting the sick and housebound. He then moved to St. Illtyd's, Danygaig.

During his active priesthood Canon Nicholas was called upon for his expertise in the field of education where for much of his career he held the position of Director of the Schools Commission and was later appointed by Bishop Mullins as the Episcopal Vicar for Education, Planning and Development. Canon Nicholas's last appointment was as the


Dean of St Joseph's Cathedral returning to where he was first ordained and was made honorary Canon of the Cathedral.

In 2003 Canon Nicholas retired from his active duties as a priest due to ill health and returned to Llanharen. He never really recovered from a heart attack during Covid and his health continued to worsen. Eventually he was taken to the Royal Glamorgan hospital where he fought numerous infections.

Canon Nicholas will be remembered as a larger than life character, with a great sense of humour; he was an amazing narrator who achieved success in everything he did. He left lasting memories everywhere he went and will be sadly missed by all those who had the fortune of knowing him.

May he Rest in Peace and Rise in Glory

Please Pray For Sr Jean Byrne OCSO Holy Cross Abbey, Whitland, Wales

Who died on Monday 5th September 2022 at Holy Cross Abbey Whitland, with her sisters gathered at her bedside praying.

Jean Watson Byrne was born in Largoward, Fife, Scotland, on 5th November 1939, she always claimed that the firework celebrations were for her entrance into the world. Jean was the eldest girl of a large family who were all very close to each other.

Sister Jean entered Stapehill in Dorset on 22 July 1962, she made her Simple Profession on 11th August 1964 and her Solemn Profession 11th August 1967

Sister Jean was 82 years old and had been in monastic vows for 58 years when the Lord called her.

During her years at Stapehill she had great energy and strength, she helped with the farm, milking, gardening, repairs in the monastery anything from mending the roof to changing a tap washer. She was sub chantress in choir.

When the community moved to Whitland, Sister Jean was tasked with setting up the altar bread production department, the community had never been involved with the altar breads before so it was a huge undertaking. Later she was Housekeeper, looked after the Orchard, kept the hens, and when she was less mobile she made cards and icons for sale.

Ill health was part of Sister Jean's life and she would have many bouts of severe pain, she would persevere and not let it thwart her both in her participation in the divine office, in her work or in any other activities in the life of the community.

From Christmas 2019 Sister Jean became unwell and moved into the infirmary, since then her health became steadily worse, her incapacity increased. For such an active person this was truly hard to bear, which she did with good grace and cheeky humour. With help from carers morning and evening, the sisters of Holy Cross Abbey looked after Sister Jean with great generosity. Sister Jean received the full ministrations of the church with frequent anointings and sacrament of the sick to sustain her.

Sister Jean's last illness started 25th August, and she was ready to go to the Lord whom she had so faithfully loved all her life.

#### DR DENIS DALEY, OBE FRCP KCSG



Denis died peacefully at his home in Usk on Saturday 1st July 2023. He was the much loved husband of Mary and brother of Jean; a beloved father, father-in-law and grandfather. His Requiem Mass was at St David Lewis & St Francis Xavier, Usk on Wednesday 12th July.

Denis was born on 6th Nov 1932 in Cardiff. He was the younger brother to four older sisters. His early education was at St Monica's school, and St Illtyd's Catholic grammar school for boys, before attending Cardiff Medical School, where he won the Gold Medal for Bacteriology & Pathology and graduated with exceptional marks.

After Medical School came junior posts in Church Village, Llandough and then Sully hospitals, followed by National Service at Liphook, Surrey. Before starting a Senior Registrar job back in Llandough, Denis did two locums for GPs- in Merthyr, and then in Porthcawl. Here he met and

Mary on April 24th 1965; they celebrated their 58th wedding anniversary earlier this year. In the Autumn of 1965 Denis was rotated to Swansea and soon he was appointed Consultant Physician in both Morriston and the newly built Singleton hospitals. Denis specialised in Diabetes and helped to instigate specialist diabetic care in Swansea.

By 1971 four sons had arrived. Denis, family man to every fibre of his being, was never more in his element than when surrounded by Mary and the four boys. For 52 years in Gower Road, Denis and Mary were also of course stalwart members of the Dunvant parish of St Joachim and St Annes,

Denis became increasingly involved in management. He was Chairman of the Medical Staff Committee of Moriston hospital during the strikes of the 1970s and chaired several of the medical committees which directed resources and planned health provision across Wales. In the 1992-3 New Year's honours list he was awarded the OBE- for services to the NHS in Wales.

In 1978, Denis was awarded a papal knighthood for his involvement with Lourdes. Christian values ran through all of Denis' medical career (indeed a doctor who first met Denis in the 1950s wrote to Mary last week 'more than any other physician I know, his sole ambition was to treat patients with respect and dignity'). But Lourdes was where Medicine and faith came together most obviously in Denis' life.

From being a doctor on the 1962 Welsh National Pilgrimage to Lourdes he became the Senior Medical officer for the pilgrimage until his retirement in 1992, and continued to go with it every year until the pandemic, a run of nearly 60 consecutive years. In addition, Denis joined other British and Irish doctors in founding the Lourdes Medical Association and was later invited to represent Wales on the Lourdes International Medical Committee, the body of doctors who investigate when someone claims to have been cured in Lourdes, to ensure that only genuine miracles are recognised.

Diagnosed with incurable cancer, he accepted his lot in the firm belief that death is only the beginning. Looked after by the ever-devoted Mary in their new home in Usk, he continued to live well until almost the very end, near to his children and grandchildren and enjoying the company of yet another new set of friends- his delightful neighbours and fellow-parishoners.

It also seemed very fitting and only fair that Denis, a gifted physician and a human being who overflowed with love, was looked after with such professionalism and affection by the wonderfully kind priest, GP, nurses and carers from Usk and from St David's Hospice Care. Denis departed the world very peacefully at home, with Mary at his side.

#### **CENTENARY OF HOLY NAME CHURCH, FISHGUARD**



The Parish Community of Fishguard and St David's gathered on Friday 27 January 2023 to give thanks to God for the 100 years of the Church of the Holy Name in Fishguard. This celebration should have taken place in January 2021, but it had to be held over because of the Covid pandemic.

It was therefore a commemoration of the Centenary of the present Church rather than the Parish. The Catholic Mission at Fishguard was started in 1899 with the coming of the Railway. During the next ten years there was an influx of Irish workers and their families who came to work on the construction of Fishguard Harbour by the Great Western Railway Company as it took over the role of the port at Neyland. A plot of land between the old town and the new port was purchased from the Laugharne family in 1908-1909. A temporary Church of corrugated zinc was constructed. This however burnt down during

Advent 1918. A new Church was constructed slightly closer to the road, and this opened on 1 January 1921.

The Centenary Mass was celebrated by Archbishop Mark, assisted by the Parish Priest, Fr Richard Jones OSB and previous Parish Priest, Fr Ross Patterson. The singing was led by the children from Holy Name School. There were light refreshments afterwards in the School Hall. There was an exhibition there of old photographs of First Communion Celebrations, Confirmations and Weddings put together from items provided by Parishioners. These brought back many memories and illustrated how the interior of the Church has developed over the years, but is basically still the same.

#### **ORDINATION OF FR GREGORY BECKETT**



My Ordination to the Priesthood on July 15th this year was the culmination of seven years of Seminary Formation, a day when one journey came to an end, and another began.

My time in the Seminary, one year in The Royal College of St Alban in Valladolid, Spain, followed by six years in St Mary's College, Oscott in Birmingham, has given me so much.

From intense study nearly every day to monthly spiritual direction; pastoral experiences in parishes, schools, hospitals, care homes, prisons and more; character building and counselling; qualifications in such disciplines as safeguarding, theology, and counselling-skills; ministry in the Minor Orders of Lector and Acolyte and in a year as a Deacon; lessons on spirituality, homiletics, liturgy, philosophy, culture, cooking and even on wine; friendships and fun as well as hard times, struggles and sadness; even opportunities to improve (a little bit!) at football, which of course came at the price of two twisted ankles over the years; Seminary was so full of life and intensity. Without this time of Formation, I certainly wouldn't be the person I am today.

When I reflected on all of this, it felt quite strange to have it all behind me. As people who have known me throughout these past seven years have often said, it all seems to have gone very quickly!

Yet on the day of ordination, I felt very much at peace. There had been a significant amount of effort put into preparing for the big day, especially from friends and family and from members of the Diocesan family; Canon Benedict, Fr Matt, Fr Laurence from Cardiff Archdiocese, John and Anne at the Cathedral, along with the ladies who provided the wonderful buffet afterwards, and especially the fantastic Fr Paul Brophy who worked so hard to prepare the music which he and Jenni Burridge directed.

However, with the work done, I was able to enjoy a most amazing day. The weather just about held (although we did get drizzled on as we processed into the Cathedral!), the music was beautiful, Archbishop Mark preached such a profound and moving homily, and everything went as planned!

The Liturgy of Ordination which the Church gives to us is so beautiful. It emphasises that a priest is no longer his own but, by the power of the Holy Spirit working through the Bishop, he is changed in his very soul and conformed in a unique way to Jesus, the one High Priest Who offers His very Self as a Sacrifice on our behalf.



A priest then, belongs to God and to the people who he is called to serve, and for me this powerful truth that was really emphasised when I lay down on the floor of the Cathedral for the Litany of Saints, and when Archbishop Mark anointed my hands with the Oil of Chrism.

That I have been ordained not for myself but for others was also so apparent to me because so many of the people I have been called to serve were there with me on the day! It meant so much that so many people from the Diocese came to the Ordination; as many priests as could make it (over thirty of them!), and a wonderful turn out of parishioners; from my home in Haverfordwest, to Aberystwyth where I went to university, all the way to Brecon, Morriston, Port Talbot and more! Even Bishop Tom was able to make it!

I have already received so many wonderful things from God in this journey towards the Priesthood and I am full of hope that the future will bring many more blessings too.

Please pray for me as I begin my Priestly ministry in Morriston and in Aberystwyth, and let us all continue to pray that those young men whom God is also calling to the Priesthood may be open-hearted enough to respond to Him and to take up this most amazing vocation, a gift and an honour which no-one could ever deserve, and a wonderful way of life which brings such great rewards.

I thank Fr. John Patrick Thomas for his accommodation, our former vicar general, Mgr. Joseph Cefai, and chancellor, Mgr. Michael Lewis for helping me to acquire temporary accommodation in Swansea Marina when there was uncertainty about where I would rest my (emeritus) head.

Please remember me in your prayers, as I remember you, and remember also that you are always welcome to call at 46 Llythrid Ave., Swansea, SA2 0JJ, for tea and sympathy - at least the tea is guaranteed.

# MENEVIA

#### WORLD YOUTH DAY 2023



This year a group of 60 pilgrims from across Wales and Herefordshire accompanied and led by Archbishop Mark, travelled to the World Youth Day celebrations held in Lisbon. The event was begun by St John Paul II in 1985 as a way of inviting all young Catholics to come together alongside the Pope to celebrate their faith in Jesus. The World Youth Day happens every year locally, and every three or four years it's celebrated globally, with a different country hosting each time.

Our first few days were spent being hosted by the Diocese of Porto for what's known as 'Days in the Diocese'. We were put up in a summer camp in a small town called Aguda near Porto, on the west coast of Portugal. We were treated to some beautiful sunsets, lovely Portuguese food, and great opportunities to pray both in our small groups and with the local community. On one of

the days all the pilgrims staying across Porto Diocese came together for Mass led by the local Bishop, celebrated by 1000 priests and attended by thousands of young people!

We then travelled to Fatima, which became our base for the World Youth Day itself (a Day which actually lasts a week!) It was a great grace to be living so near to the site in which Our Lady appeared to three shepherd children in 1917. Her message to those

children (Francisco, Jacinta and Lucia) focused on the call to conversion, to penance and to prayer. Our Lady told the children that great trials were to come to the Church and to the world, but she encouraged them to have faith - as she said in her fourth apparition, "in the end, my Immaculate Heart will triumph". This promise can bring us great consolation in our own struggles. Our Lady encouraged the children to pray the Holy Rosary each day, something we tried to incorporate into our daily timetable in the aroup.

We travelled into Lisbon for the three main World Youth Day events: the opening Mass with the Cardinal of Lisbon, the welcome ceremony with Pope Francis, and the outdoor Vigil with the Holy Father on the last night where all 1.5 million young pilgrims attended and slept under the stars. The








scale of these events was unlike anything we see anywhere else – so much colour, so much joy, so many young people in one place, all of whom had travelled to the event because of their Catholic faith. This was so inspiring to see – it was amazing to see so clearly how the Church is alive across the world, and to see young people from our local Welsh parishes discover the call of Jesus for their own lives. It was a blessed time we shared together, and we'd ask that you pray for ongoing fruit of our pilgrimage for our local Church in Cardiff, Menevia and Wrexham.

#### Foreword



For the Church, 2023 began on a solemn note as we prayed for the repose of the soul of Joseph Ratzinger, Pope Benedictus XVI (19.iv.2005 - 28.ii.2013) who died on the last day of 2022. Our prayers for the deceased were called for again later that month with the death of Deacon Iain Cameron. He was one of the Church's most senior deacons, being ordained only ten years after the restoration of the Deaconate in 1971 following the Second Vatican Council therefore having served the Church and Diocese in the deaconate for over forty-one years. The third and perhaps most shocking death was that of Father Shaji Punnattu Thomas who died tragically and suddenly at the end of March.

The obituaries of these two men are to be found towards the end of the Wrexham section of this Yearbook.

Departures of a different sort were marked by the leaving of the Vocationist Fathers (SDV) from Holywell, Mgr Alex Rebello' retirement back to the Diocese of Bombay and the re-appointment of Fr. Reginald, A.J. to the Archdiocese of Birmingham. Sadness was also expressed in the definitive closure of two churches: S. Anne's, Menai Bridge and Christ the King, Rossett, neither had re-opened after the 2020 COVID lockdown. When that and other factors were taken into account it was with regret the decision was made to celebrate a final Mass in each in thanksgiving for all that had been celebrated by the communities past and present over the sixty-seven and fifty-four years respectively. The fact of the closure reflects the changes in the Catholic population and society as a whole over just two generations. – post war growth and the baby-boomers to twenty-first century technology and digitisation, and generation-z.

Arrivals saw the coming of Fr. Jasper, AJ. and Fr. Robert, SMMM. To all I am most grateful for the service given or now being given within the Diocese. As we begin a new year in the life of the Church, we begin a new era as we welcome the Missionary Congregation of the Evangelising Sisters of Mary (MCESM) and the Daughters of Divine Love (DDL) as they establish themselves in the Diocese, assisting with pastoral care, catechesis and chaplaincy across a number of parishes.

Significantly at the beginning of the Church's year at Advent 2022 the Diocese launched CLARION, principally an online newsletter which replaced The LINK which had become prohibitively expensive to produce and circulate and was inevitably a victim of the coronavirus pandemic. Now a year old the take up of CLARION has been impressive with over 500 direct free subscribers and an easy and greater circulation through the parishes and beyond. CLARION has given the Diocese the opportunity to promote and report on important current events as well as to provide some spiritual and pastoral formation through its articles and news.

Other notable events in the Diocesan calendar were the celebration of the Coronation of King Charles III and our opportunity to express loyalty to our sovereign and to pray for him and Queen Camilla that his reign may be a powerful influence for justice and peace in our nation and the world. Last year the Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes was re-established. As we were in Lourdes the week before the World Youth Day in Lisbon it was impressive to see so many young pilgrims from around the globe in Lourdes as they had a stop-over before travelling on to Lisbon to be with P. Francis and another one and half million others who literally 'arose up and went' (Luke 1:39) in imitation of Mary to celebrate and bring the Good News to others. A small group of our young people were in Lisbon and were able to represent the Wales and the Diocese. That event was linked to Grandparents Day in June and then our day event in September in the remembrance of the young Virgin Mary going to visit the elderly Elizabeth in her maternity. Though separated by a generation each in their own particular vocation bring joy and the love of God to the world.

I am delighted that the Shrine and Well of S. Winefride has continued to grow in popularity as a place of pilgrimage. Every additional pilgrim or visitor makes the task of developing the Shrine as a place to go a little easier and enables further development as a place of prayer and spiritual refreshment. At the national pilgrimage last year and drawing on the 21st century relevance of S. Winefride and her life's story I extended the tradition and initiated the Shrine as a place of healing for those victims of sexual attack or abuse. May they find peace, re-creation and reconciliation through the intercession of S. Winefride. The S. Winefride's Shrine and Well website has also been rebuilt to reflect the growing importance of the Shrine to the mission and work of the Diocese.

At the beginning of October there was the beginning of the culmination of the great listening project begun in 2021 when the Church embarked upon the pilgrimage of the Synod on Synodality call by P. Francis. A synod that is neither parliament not opinion poll, but the evidence of a Church that listens to herself attentively and with compassion, that being renewed a new pathway for sharing the faith that we hold to be true, good and beautiful may be proclaimed afresh to a world in need of the Word of God, Jesus Christ whom we profess in word, action and mission. Its purpose is not to produce documents, but to plant dreams, 'draw forth prophecies and visions, allow hope to flourish, inspire trust, bid up wounds, weave together relationships, awaken a dawn of hope, learn from one another and create a bright resourcefulness that will enlighten minds, warm hearts, give strength to our hands.' I am mindful of the words of the prophet Zechariah when he speaks the word of the Lord of hosts, 'Many peoples and strong nations shall come to seek the Lord of hosts ... and to entreat the favour for the Lord of hosts. ... men will take hold of [your] robe saying, "Let us go with you for we have heard that God is with you."' (cf. Zech.8:20-23) The second session of the Synod and its conclusion will be this year. I am grateful to all who have taken part in the conversations across the Diocese that have contributed to the discussions at the National and then Continental stages and have now helped to form the Instrumentum Laboris (working document) for this XVITH Ordinary Assembly of the Synod of Bishops. We continue to pray for the delegates and work of the Synod.

As too we join in the great reflection on and activity of prayer that forms the second part of the preparation for the Jubilee 2025 given the theme 'Pilgrims of Hope'. Being invited afresh to support the centrality of both individual prayer and community prayer in our parishes, schools, and communities.

The theme of walking together occurred again as the Synod began, with the Holy father promulgated his latest Apostolic Exhortation, Laudate Deum (Praise God) to all people of good will on the climate crisis. In this document we are reminded how "little time" we have left. Personal changes, cultural changes, alliances, global agreements, and multilateralism with real authority... and walking together in the same direction is the only way to act against the climate crisis that besets our planet now.

Between the Synod, the Jubilee and realistically addressing the climate crisis we have the agenda for 2024 as the Church of Wrexham clearly set before us as the 'missionary disciples' of Jesus Christ.

As ever I am most grateful to all who have contributed to the compilation of this year's Directory and Yearbook. Particular thanks go to the Curial staff who strive tirelessly to serve the Diocese and maintain the usefulness of this Provincial publication in print as well as to those who populate and monitor the digital face of the Diocese. In conjunction with the Diocesan website which grows as a source of up-to-date information and inspiration by the day, together -Yearbook and website and CLARION- become more and more an arm of the Diocese's commitment to evangelisation. No publication, no technology can do more than we ourselves in reading, re-reading and reading again the Gospels; living what we have learnt and sharing by proclamation with joy what we believe. Do please continue to use the God Who Speaks website (godwhospeaks.uk) where you will find an ever fresh and informative opening-up of the Bible for young and old alike.

I continue to pray for you, your families and our communities that 2024 be a year of peace, joy and blessing and I look forward to seeing in your parishes and at all our Diocesan events to which you are of course entitled to attend without further invitation.

### The Legend of St. Winefride



Winefride (Genfrewi) was the daughter of a local prince named Tewyth and his wife Gwenlo.

Her uncle was St. Beuno.One day, around the year 630, Caradoc, a chieftain from Hawarden attempted to seduce Winefride. She ran from him towards the church which had been built by her uncle. Caradoc pursued her and cut off her head. In the place where her head fell, a spring of water came up. St. Beuno came out from the church, took up her head and placed it back on her body. He then prayed and raised her to life. A white scar encircled her neck, witness to her martyrdom. Caradoc sank to the ground and was never seen again.

Winefride became a nun and, after her uncle's departure from Holywell for the Monastery of Clynnog Fawr, joined a community at Gwtherin where she became the Abbess. She died there some 22 years later.

Pilgrimage to St. Winefride's Well has taken place throughout the 1,300 years since St. Winefride was restored to life. It is of great historic significance that the Crypt was not destroyed during the reformation of the middle ages and that pilgrims continued to come despite the threat of persecution which existed for those practising the catholic faith.

### Prayer Service and Veneration of St. Winefride's Relic

From Pentecost Sunday until the end of September. a prayer service and veneration of St. Winefride's Relic takes place daily at 12 noon on weekdays and 2.30pm on Sundays (unless otherwise advertised). The service, which lasts around 15 minutes, is led by a Priest or Lay Minister. This service is a tradition which dates back over 120 years. All Pilgrims and Visitors are invited to join in the service. The relic of St. Winefride is a small fragment of her finger bone. In 1138, her remains were moved from North Wales Shrewsbury. During the reformation her remains were destroyed, however a small fragment of a finger bone survived. Part of the relic is held at Shrewsbury, with the other half being held in Holywell. Veneration of St. Winefride's Relic takes place on other occasions in the annual programme as advertised. Veneration outside of these times is only possible if arranged in advance.

Pilgrims & Visitors are welcome to participate in the rite of bathing in the holy waters during advertised times. Bathing takes place in the outer pool. Bathing times are 10.00am to 11.00am and 2:30pm to 3:30pm. Bathing Is permitted on Sundays with permission from the administrator.

Holy Mass is celebrated in the Chapel above the crypt on Sundays at 5pm (unless otherwise advertised).

The repository stocks a wide range of religious articles and cards for sale.

Pilgrims and Visitors come to St. Winefride's Well all year round. The majority of major pilgrimages take place during the Pilgrimage Season which runs from Pentecost until the end of September. See the Annual Programme of Events for more details. All Pilgrims and Visitors are invited to join in the service.

The Annual Diocesan Pilgrimage takes place on the anniversary of St. Winefride's martyrdom, 23rd June (or the following Sunday if 22nd is not a Sunday).

### Charges

Charges for entry to the Crypt are agreed with CADW as a condition of the guardianship arrangements. All proceeds from entry charges and from sales in the repository go directly towards the upkeep of St. Winefride's Well.

St. Winefride's Well is the responsibility of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Wrexham. Operational oversight is delegated to the St. Winefride's Well Committee.



### **Obituaries**



#### **Reverend Deacon Iain Cameron**

The Reverend Deacon Jain Cameron was born in Richmond, Yorkshire on the 22nd September 1937. For the first 8 years of his life, he had quite a transient existence due to his father's senior position within the British Army. Added to this was the start of the second world war. He spent a number of years living in Bermuda with his older brother and his mother, and then they moved to Washington State in the USA. He returned to the UK in 1942 in a convoy of 3 ships near to the end of the second world war, of the 3 ships sailing, only 1 made it safely back to Liverpool. lain's family lived together in Swinbrook, the Cotswolds near Oxford and finally settled in Central London. London was a place he loved very much, and it played a major role in shaping his life.

He went to boarding school from a very young age. School was the place where he developed his love of

sport, with cricket being his favourite. When he left his senior school in 1955, he began his National Service in Inverness, Scotland, joining the Cameron Highlanders. During his service he was posted to Aden, Yemen. On completing his national service his interest in travel was to continue. He moved to Paris for approximately 3 years and worked for a travel service company and a local library. During his time in France, he became a fluent French speaker and this started his interest in learning foreign languages. He returned to London in 1961 due to his father's ill health. He then settled back into life and work in London, which is where he met his wife, Vicki.

In 1978 lain started his journey and went into formation for the permanent Diaconate for the Diocese and was ordained in 1981, dedicating 41 years of service to the Diocese of Wrexham. His faith was a huge part of his life, and he served as a retired Deacon right up to his passing. One of lain's ancestors was one of the forty Martyrs, St Robert Southwell and also, his Great Uncle, was Francis Mostyn, who was the first Bishop of Menevia – so it is true to say that he came from good stock!

lain's ministry was spent at the Cathedral Parish in the heart of Wrexham and was very much at the centre of parish life – loved and admired by so many parishioners and clergy alike. Hospital chaplaincy also played a large and important part of his diaconal ministry, and he would be seen most days, walking the long corridors of the Maelor Hospital visiting and ministering to the sick at all hours of the day and night. Iain's great faith, his love of the Lord and his gentle and humble disposition, endeared him to all he met, and the care, comfort and consolation that he provided to the sick and their families was deep and meaningful. When he eventually retired from the chaplaincy, he was greatly missed by the chaplaincy team, hospital staff and of course the patients being treated at the hospital. His devoted service of 41 years to the diocese, as a deacon, touched so many people's lives, and in so many ways that it is impossible to account for all his charitable works

Deacon lain Cameron died peacefully on 21st December 2022 at the age of 85 years. His Requiem Mass was held on 13th January 2023 at St Mary's Cathedral, Wrexham.

As a Diocese we would like to thank lain, for his diaconal service, a man of great compassion and integrity – he is deeply missed. We also would like to express our sincere sympathy to his wife Vicki and his children and thank them for their unwavering support of his ministry to the diocese.

May he rest in peace.

#### Fr Shaji Punnattuu

Father Shaji Thomas Punnattu - In Loving Memory Father Shaji Thomas Punnattu, one of four children born to Thomas and Mary on May 15, 1971, in Pulpally, Kerala, was a shining example of love and faith. From a young age, Fr. Shaji displayed a deep-rooted faith and a profound calling to serve others, a path he embarked upon by joining the Benedictines in Kerala in his journey of discernment.

Later, he embraced the life of a Vocationists (SDV) religious order, eventually being ordained as a Catholic priest on May 14, 2000, in Mati, Philippines. This marked the commencement of a remarkable journey of faith and service that took him to distant lands, including the Philippines, India, Italy, and finally, the United Kingdom. Fr. Shaji was known for his exceptional talent for preaching, captivating audiences with his heart-touching homilies, and a remarkable sense of humor. He

was not only a priest but also a great entertainer, bringing joy and laughter wherever he went. He had a unique way of connecting with people, leaving a lasting impact on their hearts. In the midst of his pastoral duties and entertaining others, Fr. Shaji was a man of prayer. He firmly believed that prayer was the cornerstone of his life, a source of strength that sustained him through all endeavors. Beyond the boundaries of his family and parish, Fr. His sister, choosing a religious path, further enriched the faith-filled tapestry of their family. Fr. Shaji's reach extended far beyond his immediate family; he was a valued member of the Catholic Diocese of Wrexham, serving in various parishes, including Holywell, Porthmadog, Rhyl, Flint, Dunphy, Blaenau Ffestiniog, and Tywyn. He not only served but also cultivated strong bonds with fellow priests, frequently visiting them, and enriching their lives with his presence.

He was an active and regular member of Jesus Caritas, embracing gatherings and retreats as opportunities to strengthen his identity as a Catholic priest. He firmly believed that praying together and sharing life's joys and sorrows with his fellow priests within the association enriched his spiritual journey. On March 23, 2023, the world mourned the loss of a beloved son, brother, and cherished priest. Fr. Shaji Thomas Punnattu left a lasting legacy as a man of great joy, compassion, and unwavering faith. His infectious smile, heart-touching homilies, and entertaining spirit brightened the hearts of all those fortunate to have known him.

Fr. Shaji Thomas Punnattu will forever be remembered and cherished by the many lives he touched. May his soul rest in eternal peace, and may his legacy of love, compassion, and profound faith continue to inspire and guide us all.



# **HISTORIC AGREEMENT - HOLYWELL**

An historic agreement to recognise and celebrate the significance of the holy well and Shrine of Saint Winefride, Holywell was signed by Bishop Peter and the Bishop Grogory of the Anglican Diocese of St Asaph on July 12th 2023.

The Bishops have pledged to work co-operatively towards the development of the whole site in Holywell as an integrated place of worship, pilgrimage and tourism, while maintaining the distinctive tradition of worship associated with the Shrine.

Bishop Peter Brignall said during the service: "The history and tradition of Saint Winefride and Holywell provide an opportunity for the church in the 21st century as a place of witness and evangelisation. So many facets of Winefride's story will appeal to the world today. In some ways she can be seen as a patron or example for women who experience domestic violence or abuse. There will be people who come for the heritage, architecture and history but also those who come for healing and an encounter with the divine physician through Winefride and her traditions.

"St Winefride's Well is also a reminder that faith is the centre of ordinary life. The pre-Victorian engravings on the walls tell a story of people washing their clothes in the holy well. If we can put faith at the centre of life today, that is all well and good. I am delighted to sign this statement of intent at this time."

The Bishop of St Asaph, the Rt Revd Gregory Cameron said during the service: "The site St Winefride's Well and associated buildings is a world class place of pilgrimage, sacred to Christians across all traditions down through history. We have huge hopes for the development of the Shrine site, with the local priest, Father Dominic using St James' as a centre for healing and community.

"Today's signing of the statement of intent is really making public what we already do together; we're co-operating to establish this special place to welcome all Christians and people of all faiths, sharing as much as we can, while maintaining our distinctive traditions."



# **RITE OF CANDIDACY**

On the 11th August 2023, surrounded by family, friends, parishioners and clergy from around the diocese, Bishop Peter celebrated the rite of candidacy at the Church of St Mary's the Virgin, Ruabon,

during which David Tarbrook was accepted as a candidate for ordination as a permanent deacon in just under two years' time.

The Rite for Admission to Candidacy is the formal step in the formation towards Holy Orders, where the Church formally recognises that the candidate has a call from God to Holy Orders. The transition in formation moves from one of discernment to preparation for Ordination.

Candidacy is the point at which 'an individual has reached a maturity of intention, confirmed by the Church. It marks a depth of interior relationship with Christ which makes the individual humanly, spiritually, intellectually, and pastorally ready to finish his preparation and equip himself for ordination.'

During the rite, the intention to receive Holy orders was expressed publicly by David, which was then accepted by Bishop Peter.

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#### THE ORDER TO BE OBSERVED FOR THE CELEBRATION OF MASS AND THE LITURGY OF THE HOURS

#### IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF CARDIFF, THE DIOCESE OF MENEVIA AND THE DIOCESE OF WREXHAM, IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD 2024

#### INTRODUCTION

The Cardiff, Menevia and Wrexham Calendar combines the Universal Calendar of the Latin Rite with the Welsh National Calendar as it appears in the 2011 edition of the Roman Missal, together with certain celebrations peculiar to each diocese, *e.g.* the dedication of the Cathedral Church. In addition, regional adjustments have been made for the county of Herefordshire in accord with the Proper Calendar for England incorporated in the same edition of the Roman Missal.

#### **DEDICATIONS AND TITULAR FEASTS OF CHURCHES**

This Order does not contain any indication of the Anniversary of Dedication or of the Titular Feast of individual churches. (The Dedication applies only to consecrated Churches). Parish priests are therefore advised to annotate their own copies of the Order concerning these feasts at the start of the year.

Note that where the church is known to have been consecrated but the date is not recorded, the Dedication Festival may be kept on 25 October or on the Sunday before All Saints' Day (*i.e.* the Sunday which falls on 23-29 October, allowing for the occasional transfer of All Saints' Day to Sunday 30 October). The choice of date should be made once and fixed permanently for its parish community.

Both the Dedication and the Titular feast are celebrated as solemnities, *i.e.* with Evening Prayer I, Gloria, Creed, and *Te Deum*. They are celebrated on the normal days unless these happen to fall in Holy Week or Easter Week, or on Ash Wednesday, Ascension Day or Pentecost Sunday, Sundays of Advent, Lent or Eastertide, or on any other solemnity. In such cases they may be transferred to the next free day (or to the previous Saturday if the clash occurs on a Sunday). If it is considered pastorally beneficial, the Mass of the Dedication or Titular may be used at all public Masses on the following Sunday, but only during the period of Ordinary Time. If the Titular of a particular Church no longer exists in the Roman Calendar, the same date may be observed as hitherto.

ORDO

The Holydays of Obligation for England and Wales are: every Sunday, Christmas Day, the Epiphany of the Lord (6 January), the Ascension of the Lord, St Peter & St Paul (29 June), the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (15 August), and All Saints (1 November). With the exception of Christmas Day, any Holyday of Obligation falling on either a Saturday or a Monday is transferred to the Sunday. Since Advent 2006, one Solemnity has been permanently transferred to Sunday, namely, that of the Body and Blood of the Lord (*Corpus Christi*).

## THE TE DEUM

The *Te Deum* is sung or said at the Office of Readings on Sundays outside of Lent, during the Octaves of Easter and Christmas, and on Solemnities and Feasts.

#### ALTERNATIVE CALENDARS

Where Mass is celebrated in the Extraordinary Form according to the provisions of *Summorum Pontificum*, a different calendar applies: this may be found on the website of the Latin Mass Society of England and Wales. See: www.Ims.org.uk/mass-listings

The Bishops' Conference of England and Wales submitted a *dubium* to the Pontifical Commission *Ecclesia Dei* which confirmed that in the Roman Rite, whichever Form of the liturgy is being celebrated, the Holydays of Obligation are held in common, on the date prescribed for the Ordinary Form. Where the obligation has been removed and the Holyday transferred to the Sunday, this is to be followed in both Ordinary and Extraordinary celebrations of Mass. A further *dubium* submitted by the Latin Mass Society (*N107/97 20 October 2008*) clarified that where the Extraordinary Form is being followed, it is proper to also celebrate the Mass and Divine Office of these solemnities on the traditional dates indicated in the 1962 calendar, though there would be no obligation on the faithful to attend Mass on such days.

Celebrations proper to the Personal Ordinariate of Our Lady of Walsingham – the canonical structure under which former Anglicans can worship as Catholics while retaining their distinctive patrimony – follow the Calendar and Ordo available via their website at: www.ordinariate.org.uk/resources/liturgical-documents.php

Members of Religious Orders, or of Eastern Rite Churches, should consult their local superiors or clergy concerning their proper calendars.

# PROPER MATERIAL FOR WALES

In 1974, the Roman Missal and Divine Office published in that year reflected the Calendar for Wales issued by the Bishops of Wales in 1973. In 1981, the *Proper for Wales* was published with the Imprimatur of Archbishop Murphy and the authority of the Holy See, Protocol CD 607/77 for the Divine Office Proper and CD 984/80 for the Mass Proper.

The new English Translation of the Roman Missal published in 2011 was granted *recognitio* by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, for the dioceses of England and Wales (Prot. N. 915/06/L) on 28 March 2010. The proper calendar, texts, and adaptations for the dioceses of England and Wales were confirmed by the Apostolic See by decrees of the same Congregation on 7 January 2011 (Prot. N. 915/06/L), 9 January 2011, (Prot. N. 1035/10/L), and 11 January 2011 (Prot. N. 1036/10/L). Blessed John Henry Newman was subsequently added to the Calendar for Wales (Prot. n. 342/12/L, 8 June 2012), and his observance

in England & Wales was raised to the rank of a Feast in 2019 following his canonization. In 2013, the Holy See granted permission for Wales and England to keep the celebration of the then-Blessed (now Saint) John Paul II as an Optional Memorial on 22 October. The current official Calendar for Wales is therefore given by the prescriptions of the 2011 Missal, with the subsequent addition of St John Paul II, and can be found on the Liturgy Office website:

All the Proper Material for Mass will now be found in the 2011 edition of the Roman Missal, except for subsequent additions; national celebrations are included in the Proper of Saints as part of the natural sequence of dates.

The Proper Material for the Divine Office in Wales (1981 edition) may be obtained on request by email from Rev. Dr Gareth Leyshon **(leyshon.gareth@rcadc.org).** Note that the liturgical books for the Divine Office currently in print may indicate that some days in the Calendar for Wales are Obligatory Memorials when in fact they are now all optional.

Older books also indicate that 4 May is the Feast of the Beatified Martyrs of England and Wales. In the current calendar for England, the Feast of the Forty Martyrs on 25 October has been suppressed in favour of a combined celebration of the English Martyrs on 4 May, chosen because it marks the first Reformation martyrdom (three Carthusians at Tyburn in 1535). In Wales, however, 25 October remains the Feast of the "Six Welsh Martyrs and Their Companions"; omission of 4 May from the calendar for Wales in the 2011 Missal indicates that this date is no longer a Feast or even a Memorial of the Beatified Martyrs. If a votive celebration is to be offered in honour of the Beatified Martyrs, proper material can be found at Daily Prayer 319\*, Divine Office Volume II 204\*, Lectionary II 1332 and *Book of Gospels* 365.

Among the 85 martyrs beatified in 1987, the following have connections with Wales and Herefordshire:

Nicholas Wheeler, a seminary priest from Herefordshire, was executed at Tyburn 21 January 1586, aged 36.

Richard Flower (or Lloyd), a Welsh layman, aged 22, was executed at Tyburn, 30 August 1588.

Humphrey Pritchard, a Welsh serving man, was arrested with Blessed Thomas Belson in Oxford, and executed there on 5 July 1589.

William Davies (born in North Wales, probably Croes yn Eirias, Denbighshire, date uncertain; executed at Beaumaris Castle, 27 July 1593) was a Welsh Roman Catholic priest. There is a chapel in Anglesey built as a memorial to him.

Charles Mahoney (Mahony; alias Meehan) born after 1639, executed at Ruthin, Denbighshire, 12 August 1679, was an Irish Franciscan.

Roger Cadwallador, born at Stretton Sugwas, near Hereford, in 1568, executed at Leominster, 27 August 1610, was an English Roman Catholic priest.

In addition, Blessed Philip Powell, a native of Breconshire, was martyred at Tyburn 30 June 1646; he was beatified by Pope Pius XI in 1929.

#### THE ROMAN MARTYROLOGY

Optional memorials and votive celebrations of saints may be kept on the weekdays of Ordinary Time, on weekdays of Advent before December 17th, on weekdays of the Christmas season from January 2nd onwards, and weekdays of the Easter season. On such days, even when there is an optional Memorial, a priest may celebrate either the Mass of the weekday or that of any Saint inscribed that day in the Roman Martyrology (cf. *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* 316b,c). The same holds, analogously, for the celebration of the Liturgy of the Hours (cf. *General Instruction of the Liturgy of the Hours*, 244). It is perfectly legitimate, therefore, in such circumstances, to celebrate in honour of a Saint found in neither the General Calendar nor in a proper calendar. Obviously, such cases call for the exercise of pastoral good sense on the part of the celebrant. Mention is made in this year's calendar of a selection of saints and beati local to Wales or Herefordshire who are listed in the 2004 edition of the *Roman Martyrology*.

#### NUPTIAL MASSES

Whenever marriage is celebrated within Mass, the Ritual Mass for Marriage is used, along with white vestments. If, however, such a Mass is celebrated on a Sunday or Solemnity, the Mass of the day is used with its own proper readings, plus the nuptial blessing and if appropriate, the final blessing of the wedding Mass. (On Sundays during Ordinary Time, the Ritual Mass for Marriage may nevertheless be used, if the timing does not coincide with a scheduled Mass for the parish community).

Since the Liturgy of the Word is of great importance in the celebration of marriage, in cases where the Ritual Mass for Marriage is not used, one of the readings may be taken from among those provided for the celebration of marriage. If marriage is celebrated on a day of penitential character, especially within Lent, the parish priest should advise that account be taken of that character. The celebration of marriage on Good Friday or on the following day, Holy Saturday, is absolutely forbidden.

#### MASSES FOR THE DEAD

First place among Masses for the Dead is held by the funeral Mass, which may be celebrated on any day except on Holydays of Obligation, on Maundy Thursday, during the Paschal Triduum, or on the Sundays of Advent, Lent and Eastertide. It is appropriate that the paschal candle be placed, lit, near the place where the coffin will rest.

If the Mass is combined directly with the other funeral rites, once the prayer after communion has been said, omitting the concluding rites of Mass, the rite of final commendation and farewell is carried out. This is not to be done unless the body is actually present.

On reception of news of a death, on the occasion of a final burial, or on the first anniversary, a Mass for the Dead may be used even on days within the Christmas Octave, and on an obligatory memorial, or on other weekdays, other than on Ash Wednesday or within Holy Week. Daily Masses of the Dead, unless some real need of the faithful dictates otherwise, are permitted only on weekdays in Ordinary Time, and on optional memorials or days when the weekday Office is used, provided too that the Mass is actually said for the dead.

#### MASS FOR THE PEOPLE (MISSA PRO POPULO)

A parish priest is bound on each Sunday and on each Holyday of Obligation to offer one Mass for the people entrusted to him. If he is lawfully impeded in this, he should have someone else celebrate Mass for the people on these days or else celebrate it himself on other days.

#### EUCHARISTIC PRAYERS

The choice among the Eucharistic Prayers found in the Order of Mass is suitably guided by the following norms:

Eucharistic Prayer I, that is, the Roman Canon, which may always be used, is especially suited to be sung or said on days when there is a proper text for the *Communicantes (In union with the whole Church)* or in Masses endowed with a proper form of the *Hanc igitur (Father, accept this offering)* and also in the celebrations of the Apostles and of the Saints mentioned in the Prayer itself; it is likewise especially appropriate for Sundays, unless for pastoral considerations Eucharistic Prayer III is preferred.

Eucharistic Prayer II, on account of its particular features, is more appropriately used on weekdays or in special circumstances. Although it has been provided with its own Preface, it may also be used with other Prefaces, especially those that summarize the mystery of salvation, such as the common Prefaces. When Mass is celebrated for a particular dead person, the special formula may be inserted in the place indicated.

Eucharistic Prayer III may be said with any Preface. Its use is preferred on Sundays and feast days. If, however, this Eucharistic Prayer is used in Masses for the Dead, the special formula for the dead may be used, to be included at the proper place.

Eucharistic Prayer IV has an invariable Preface and gives a fuller summary of salvation history. It may be used when a Mass has no Preface of its own and is particularly appropriate for Sundays in Ordinary Time. Because of its structure, no special formula for the dead may be inserted into this prayer.

On 1 May 2013, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments decreed that the name of St Joseph should be inserted into Eucharistic Prayers II, III & IV. For further information and for a "bookmark" containing the amended passages, see: **tinyurl.com/JoeTexts** 

The four forms of the Eucharistic Prayer for Masses for Various Needs and Occasions may be used only with the formularies of the Masses for Various Needs and Occasions, which do not have their own proper preface. Each of the four formulations has its own integral preface, and may not be used with any other preface. These Eucharistic Prayers are ideally suited for use in the Cycle of Prayer, outlined below.

The two Eucharistic Prayers for Reconciliation each contain their own preface, but it is permitted to use these prayers with any other preface which speaks of penance or reconciliation. These prayers may therefore be used at any time during Lent with suitable Lenten Prefaces, and also, with their integral prefaces, during the weekdays of the first four weeks of Lent; they may also be used on penitential occasions at other times of year.

There also exist three Eucharistic Prayers for Masses with Children, which may only be used at Masses when children constitute a significant proportion of the assembly, and a Eucharistic Prayer for Deaf People which may only be used by a celebrant who can sign, and when a significant number of Deaf people are present.

#### MASS AND COMMUNION

It is highly appropriate that the faithful receive the Body of the Lord by means of hosts consecrated at that same Mass and that on the occasions laid down they also communicate from the chalice, so that through such signs Holy Communion may more clearly be seen to be a sharing in the sacrifice being celebrated. The faithful who have already received the Blessed Eucharist once, may also receive it again on the same day, that is to say for no more than a second time on that same day, in the course of a further Eucharistic celebration in which they take part (*cf. Code of Canon Law* 917 and the authoritative interpretation of the same promulgated on 26 June 1984).

In Wales and in England, broad permission was extended in 1985 for communion under both kinds (*Briefing,* 1985, volume 15, page 190). Owing to the Covid-19 pandemic, the Bishops' Conference ruled that the chalice should not be offered to the congregation, and that concelebrating priests should communicate by intinction. Subsequently, as civic restrictions were eased there was a discussion at the Standing Committee of the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, regarding the permissive reintroduction of Holy Communion under both kinds. This was to take effect from Holy Thursday 2023. The Standing Committee made the following points:

The reintroduction of Holy Communion under both kinds is permissive, not obligatory and the permission is given by the Diocesan Bishop as the moderator of the liturgy in his diocese.

The Church's defined Theology of the Eucharist states: Since Christ is sacramentally present under each of the species, communion under the species of bread alone makes it possible to receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace. For pastoral reasons this manner of receiving communion has been legitimately established as the most common form in the Latin rite. But "the sign of communion is more complete when given under both kinds, since in that form the sign of the Eucharistic meal appears more clearly." This is the usual form of receiving communion in the Eastern rites. (Catechism 1390)

If communion is offered to the faithful under both kinds, the Instruction *Redemptionis Sacramentum* states: *The Priest, once he has returned to the altar after the distribution of Communion, standing at the altar or at the credence table, purifies the paten or ciborium over the chalice, then purifies the chalice in accordance with the prescriptions of the Missal and wipes the chalice with the purificator. Where a Deacon is present, he returns with the Priest to the altar and purifies the vessels. It is permissible, however, especially if there are several vessels to be purified, to leave them, covered as may be appropriate, on a corporal on the altar or on the credence table, and for them to be purified by the Priest or Deacon immediately after Mass once the people have been dismissed. Moreover a duly instituted acolyte assists the Priest or Deacon in purifying and arranging the sacred vessels either at the altar or the credence table. In the absence of a Deacon, a duly instituted acolyte carries the sacred vessels to the credence table and there purifies, wipes and arranges them in the usual way.* (#119). This task may not be delegated to an Extraordinary Minister of Holy *Communion.* 

Priests have asked whether Holy Communion can be distributed by intinction. The bishops discussed this and decided to affirm the teaching in *Celebrating the Mass* (2005, #211) which states that this form of the reception of Holy Communion "is not recommended in England and Wales." Communicants are not permitted to receive Holy Communion by "self-intinction" where having received the Sacred Host in the

hand, they proceed to the Precious Blood and "dip" the host themselves into the chalice. This is taught clearly in the General Instruction on the Roman Missal (#287).

Should a priest, because of his own health conditions, feel vulnerable in purifying the chalice after the people have received, and this cannot be delegated to a deacon or an instituted acolyte, he should speak with his bishop regarding the reintroduction of Holy Communion under both kinds in his parish.

## EASTER DUTY

Once admitted to the blessed Eucharist, each of the faithful is obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled during paschal time (*i.e.* between Palm Sunday and Pentecost Sunday), unless for a good reason it is fulfilled at another time during the year.

# EUCHARISTIC FAST

A person who is to receive the Most Holy Eucharist is to abstain for at least one hour before Holy Communion from any food and drink, except for only water and medicine. A priest who celebrates the Most Holy Eucharist two or three times on the same day can take something before the second or third celebration even if there is less than one hour between them. The elderly, the infirm, and those who care for them can receive the Most Holy Eucharist even if they have eaten something within the preceding hour; the former discipline of requiring a quarter-hour fast no longer applies. (*Code of Canon Law* 919).

## THE CYCLE OF PRAYER

In 1996, the Bishops of England and Wales set out a Cycle of Prayer, allocating particular intentions to each of six divisions of the year. Each individual intention might be remembered frequently – by individuals, parishes, and other groups – throughout its allocated season, but also has its particular focal point,*i.e.* a particular Day of Prayer ordered by the Holy See or by the Bishops of England & Wales. Over time, additional intentions, such as 'Victims of Human Trafficking' and 'Survivors of Abuse', have been added to the established cycle.

The Cycle is based on a division of the year into six periods, three of these being the principal liturgical seasons of Advent-with-Christmas, Lent, and Easter. The other three periods are divisions of Ordinary Time, namely Winter, Summer and Autumn. On the Day of Special Prayer itself, and especially on Sundays, it is appropriate to announce the Day of Special Prayer in the opening remarks at the beginning of Mass, and to make special mention in the Prayer of the Faithful. Care should be taken that the remaining petitions of the Prayer of the Faithful should be formulated in accordance with the norms given in the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* (GIRM) 69-71. When a Day of Prayer or other observance falls on a Sunday, the Mass and Lectionary texts of the Sunday are normally used.

On weekdays the use of suitable 'Masses for Various Needs and Occasions' or 'Votive Masses' should be considered to support the marking of the Day of Prayer (GIRM 373-378). The readings assigned for each day in the Lectionary for weekdays should not be omitted too frequently and without sufficient reason. It is often more fruitful to explore any special intentions through the readings assigned to the day, than to choose from the Common those which may appear at first sight more appropriate to the intention. #### GUIDE TO USING THE ORDER

In the calendar which follows: + indicates a HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION.

Entries under the rubric *EVENING* prescribe both the Liturgy of the Hours to be celebrated for Evening Prayer and Night Prayer, and also the Mass to be used if Mass is celebrated later than Evening Prayer.

It is assumed that the user is familiar with the main cycles in the liturgical books: Ordinary Sundays; Ordinary Weekdays; the Seasons of Advent, Christmastide, Lent and Eastertide; the Proper of Saints from January to December. Page numbers are given in this Order only when material is found outside these main cycles, such as the Solemnities of the Lord in Ordinary Time, or the National Propers for the Divine Office. This Order is meant to be used in conjunction with the liturgical books, and in general, rubrics printed clearly alongside the texts in the Roman Missal and Divine Office will not be duplicated here.

The *Gloria* is always said on weekdays designated **FEAST;** this is not explicitly mentioned in the calendar below, but every Sunday and Solemnity will be annotated with explicit mention of the Gloria (when required) and Creed.

Where page numbers are given, **M&EP** indicates *Morning and Evening Prayer* (not to be confused with the abridged *Shorter Morning and Evening Prayer*); **DP** indicates *Daily Prayer* (the volume which includes Prayer During the Day); and **DO-I**, **DO-II** and **DO-III** the three volume set of *The Divine Office*. Note that some volumes include three sequences of page numbering – one plain, another marked by an asterisk (\*) and the third by square brackets []. **RM** indicates the current edition of the Roman Missal, internally indicated as the 2010 edition though actually published in 2011. **BG** is the *Book of Gospels*. Reference is also made to the *Book of Blessings:* page numbers are in the USA edition, which has been authorized for use by the Bishops of England and Wales in the absence of our own national version.

#### PRAYING THE DIVINE OFFICE

On days which are not marked as **FEASTS** or **SOLEMNITIES**, psalms for the Divine Office (also known as the Prayer of the Church or the Liturgy of the Hours) are wholly or mostly taken from the repeating cycle of the 4-week psalter. The current week is always indicated in the Order below, at the entry for Saturday evening, since a new week normally begins with the First Evening Prayer of Sunday.

The psalms for Prayer During the Day are always those of the occurring weekday except where the Breviary or the Order explicitly indicates the contrary. Sometimes the "Complementary Psalms" will be specified: these can be found at DP [485], DO-I [592], DO-II [514] and DO-III [514].

#### CHOICE OF MASS AND OF PREFACE

Where more than one observance is offered, with the rubric "or", the Celebrant may freely choose to celebrate the Mass and the Liturgy of the Hours corresponding to any of the options presented. On such days, and on Weekdays of Ordinary Time, of Advent up to 16 December, of Christmastide and of Eastertide, the Celebrant may also choose to celebrate a Votive Mass of any Saint listed in the Roman Martyrology, or any Blessed proper to the place, or (if applicable) their religious order, or a Mass for Various Needs and Occasions.

Whenever a Memorial is kept, all the proper material provided in the Roman Missal should be used. If there are no proper texts given for the Prayer over the Offerings and the Prayer After Communion, the prayer of the Season may be used, or an appropriate text from the Commons. Where a suggested reference is given to the Commons, it is permitted to choose other suitable material from the Commons, including mixing material from different Commons (for example, when a Martyr is also a Bishop or a Virgin); material from the Common of Holy Men and Women may always be used in such cases. During Advent, Christmastide and Eastertide, on days when Memorials may be celebrated, the celebrant may choose the Preface of the Season or the Preface appropriate to the Saint.

#### LITURGICAL COLOURS

These are given in full, except:

"ROSE/P" indicates that on *Laetare* Sunday and *Gaudete* Sunday, rose or purple vestments may be used.

"P/BLACK" indicates that on All Souls' Day, purple or black vestments may be used.

"W or G" indicates that on Votive Masses of Our Lady on Saturday, white or green vestments may be used.

#### REMEMBRANCE OF DECEASED CLERGY

This Order includes, in italics, the names of those who died as clergy of one of the dioceses of Wales and Herefordshire, on the dates of their death. Bishops and Deacons are explicitly identified as such; entries not otherwise identified are of presbyters (priests). Anniversaries of presbyters and deacons will not be included in the Order beyond 25 years from the date of death, but these dates will still be available in the diocesan listings present in the Yearbook. The entries for Bishops continue to be included in the text *ad infinitum*.

#### **PENITENTIAL ACTS**

#### **FASTING AND ABSTINENCE**

All of Christ's faithful are obliged to do penance. The obligation arises in imitation of Christ himself and in response to his call. During his life on earth, not least at the beginning of his public ministry, Our Lord undertook voluntary penance. He invited his followers to do the same. The penance he invited would be a participation in his own suffering, an expression of inner conversion and a form of reparation for sin. It would be a personal sacrifice made out of love for God and our neighbour. It follows that if we are to be true, as Christians, to the spirit of Christ, we must practise some form of penance.

Every Friday is set aside as a special day of penitence, as it is the day of the suffering and death of the Lord. In 2011, the Bishops of England and Wales decided that abstinence from meat on Fridays should be reintroduced according to Canon 1251. Under that canon, abstinence from meat applies on all Fridays except those which are solemnities. Those who cannot, or choose not to, eat meat as part of their normal diet should abstain from some other food of which they regularly partake. This decision came into effect on 16 September 2011. The Bishops of England and Wales believe it is important that all the faithful again be united in a common, identifiable act of Friday penance because they recognise that the virtue of penitence is best acquired as part of a common resolve and common witness. For this reason, all Catholics aged over 14 are to observe Friday penance by abstaining from meat and by uniting this to prayer. Those over 18 are bound by the law of fasting (which applies on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday) until the beginning of their sixtieth year. Priests and parents are urged to foster the spirit and practice of penance among those too young to be the subjects of either law.

In a Q&A document published at the time of reintroduction, the General Secretary of the Bishops' Conference noted that:

There is no requirement for us to eat fish instead of meat on a Friday. Our act of abstinence does not mean that we have to eat another particular type of food as the regular substitute for meat on a Friday.

If we are invited out for a meal on a Friday, then we should make the most of an opportunity to witness to our Catholic faith. If our friends and colleagues value us they will not be offended or upset if we tell them, ahead of time, that we do not eat meat on Fridays.

Our Bishops wish us to focus on the importance of observing penance as a regular and necessary part of our spiritual lives as a whole. If we make it our practice to do penance during the prescribed penitential days and seasons of the Church's year, then failure to abstain from meat on a particular Friday would not constitute a sin.

The relevant texts from the Code of Canon Law (1249-1253) are as follows:

**Can. 1249** All Christ's faithful are obliged by divine law, each in his or her own way, to do penance. However, so that all may be joined together in a certain common practice of penance, days of penance are prescribed. On these days the faithful are in a special manner to devote themselves to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, and to deny themselves, by fulfilling their obligations more faithfully and especially by observing the fast and abstinence which the following canons prescribe.

**Can. 1250** The days and times of penance for the universal Church are each Friday of the whole year and the season of Lent.

**Can. 1251** Abstinence from meat, or from some other food as determined by the Episcopal Conference, is to be observed on all Fridays, unless a solemnity should fall on a Friday. Abstinence and fasting are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

**Can. 1252** The law of abstinence binds those who have completed their fourteenth year. The law of fasting binds those who have attained their majority, until the beginning of their sixtieth year. Pastors of souls and parents are to ensure that even those who by reason of their age are not bound by the law of fasting and abstinence, are taught the true meaning of penance.

**Can. 1253** The Episcopal Conference can determine more particular ways in which fasting and abstinence are to be observed. In place of abstinence or fasting it can substitute, in whole or in part, other forms of penance, especially works of charity and exercises of piety.

#### INDULGENCES

The Catholic Faith teaches that while sacramental confession restores us to friendship with God, we may still need to be purified, after death, of the consequences of our sinful choices. This purification may be accomplished, at least in part, while still on earth, by our own prayers, fasting, and works of charity. When the Church declares a particular spiritual exercise to be **indulgenced**, it adds the prayers of the Church at large to our own personal prayer. In some cases, a plenary indulgence is offered – a promise that if we fulfil the conditions set down perfectly, the prayers of the Church will achieve our total purification. Such prayers may be offered on behalf of the soul of a person who has already died, and (unless otherwise specified) may also be offered on their own behalf by the living person undertaking the indulgenced exercise.

A plenary indulgence can be gained only once a day, except when a person is in danger of death. In order to obtain it, the faithful must, in addition to being in the state of grace: (i) have the interior disposition of *complete detachment from sin, even venial sin;* (ii) *have sacramentally confessed* their sins; (iii) *receive the Holy Eucharist on the day of the exercise* (preferably at Mass, but to fulfil the conditions only Holy Communion is required); and (iv) *pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff.* Prayer for the Pope's intentions is left to the choice of the faithful, but an *Our Father* and a *Hail Mary* are suggested. One sacramental Confession suffices for several plenary indulgences, but a separate Holy Communion and a separate prayer for the Pope's intentions are required for each plenary indulgence. A plenary indulgence may also be gained twice a year in parish churches: on the feast day of the Church's Titular, and on 2nd August (*Portiuncula*).

It is appropriate, but not necessary, that the sacramental Confession and especially Holy Communion and the prayer for the Pope's intentions take place on the same day that the indulgenced work is performed; but it is sufficient that these sacred rites and prayers be undertaken within about 20 days before or after the indulgenced act. In the year 2000 the Apostolic Penitentiary specified this window of about 20 days, in place of the earlier interpretation which allowed about 8 days before or following the indulgenced act (see *Gift of the Indulgence*, 5).

Although indulgences may always be applied to the dead, a plenary indulgence **applicable only to the dead** can be gained in all churches and public or semi-public oratories on 2nd November or on the following Sunday. The work prescribed, in addition to Confession and Holy Communion, is a visit to a church or oratory during which the Our Father and the Creed are said for the Pope's intentions. In addition, a plenary indulgence may also be gained on each day from 1st to 8th November, by visiting a cemetery and praying for the dead.

#### DECEMBER 2023

**The Pope's Intention:** We pray that people living with disabilities may be at the centre of attention in society, and that institutions may offer inclusive programmes which value their active participation.

#### ADVENT 2023

Advent has a twofold character: as a season to prepare for Christmas, when Christ's first coming to us is remembered: and as a season when that remembrance directs the mind and heart to await Christ's coming at the end of time. Advent is thus a period for devout and joyful expectation. The playing of the organ and other musical instruments, and the decoration of the altar with flowers, should be done in a moderate manner, as is consonant with the character of the season, without anticipating the full joy of the Nativity of the Lord. The same moderation should be observed in the celebration of matrimony. Only when some genuine need or pastoral advantage requires it, may an appropriate Mass for Various Needs or a Votive Mass be celebrated. Daily Masses for the Dead are not allowed. For the rite of blessing an Advent Wreath at Mass, Evening Prayer or a Liturgy of the Word, see page 573-582 of the *Book of Blessings. The Cycle of Prayer:* During Advent and Christmastide, we are invited to pray for Migrants and Refugees, and for Expectant Mothers.

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At Mass, proper readings are given for the weekdays from 17-24 December, and these should be used instead of those indicated for the weekdays of the third week of Advent. The Divine Office uses the Antiphons, and hymns for Morning Prayer, Evening Prayer, and the Office of Readings, as prescribed for Advent II. Only when some genuine need or pastoral advantage requires it, may an appropriate Mass for Various Needs be celebrated. Votive Masses and Daily Masses for the Dead are prohibited. Memorials which occur on days between 17 and 31 December are optional; if kept, they are to be commemorated at Mass by using the collect of the saint in place of the collect of the Mass of the day. At the Office of Readings, the proper reading of a Commemoration, with its antiphon, is used following the Second Reading of the Season; at Morning and Evening Prayer, the Gospel Antiphon and Closing Prayer of the Commemoration are recited after the closing prayer of the day.

#### **ORDINARY TIME - WINTER**

During Ordinary Time (from now until Ash Wednesday), Votive Masses and the Daily Mass for the Dead are again permitted. Eucharistic Prayer IV may be used on Sundays, unless they are Solemnities or Feasts of the Lord with their own Proper Prefaces. In Votive Masses, including Our Lady's Mass on Saturdays, vestments proper to the colour of the Votive Mass may be used, or the colour of the occurring day, or of the season. On ferial days of Ordinary Time, the Mass texts may be of the Liturgy of the Day (taken from one of the 34 sets found in the Missal) or of any saint whose name is inscribed in the Roman Martyrology on that day, or may be a Votive Mass or one of the Masses for various occasions or needs, as set out in the Missal and Lectionary. The Ferial Cycle of readings should, however, be maintained as far as possible. Proper Readings are to be used on Solemnities, Feasts, and on those Memorials for which the Lectionary explicitly indicates that one or more readings are Proper. On Obligatory Memorials, the proper prayers given in the Missal must be used. However, if only the Collect is proper, other prayers may be taken from the appropriate Common or from the Liturgy of the Day.

#### LENT

The season of Lent is a preparation for the celebration of Easter. The liturgy prepares the catechumens for the celebration of the paschal mystery by the various stages of Christian initiation; it also prepares the faithful, who recall their baptism and do penance in preparation for Easter. The Lenten Alms Box should be placed in the Church. The two Eucharistic Prayers for Reconciliation may be appropriately used in Lent, with their Proper Prefaces up until the end of the fourth week of Lent, and with appropriate Lenten Prefaces at any time. Memorials which occur on a weekday may be commemorated, if wished, only by using the collect of the saint in place of the collect for the Mass of the Day. At the Office of Readings, the proper reading of a Commemoration, with its antiphon, is used following the Second Reading of the Season; at Morning and Evening Prayer, the Gospel Antiphon and Closing Prayer of the Commemoration are recited after the closing prayer of the day. Votive Masses and the Daily Mass for the Dead are not permitted. Only when some genuine need or pastoral advantage requires it, may an appropriate Mass for Various Needs be celebrated. The Alleluia is always omitted, both in the Liturgy of the Hours and in Mass. Gloria and Te Deum are omitted on Sundays, but retained for solemnities, feasts, and particular celebrations. It is not permitted to adorn the altar with flowers, and the organ and other instruments may only be played for the purpose of sustaining the singing. An exception is made for Laetare Sunday, and for solemnities and feasts. For the celebration of marriages, the parish priest should alert spouses to the need to take account of the particular penitential character of this season. The Nuptial Mass is allowed during Lent, but no weddings may be celebrated during the Sacred Triduum.

**The Cycle of Prayer:** During Lent, we are invited to pray for these intentions: Candidates for the Sacraments, (especially on the Sundays of Lent); Women; The Needy and Hungry of the World; Penitents and Wanderers.

#### 14 WEDNESDAYPURPLE ASH WEDNESDAY

*Mass:* The penitential act is omitted, in favour of the blessing and distribution of ashes which takes place after the homily. Lenten Preface IV is used. The ashes are of branches of the olive tree or, according to custom, of the palm tree or other trees, which have been blessed the previous year. The blessing and distribution of ashes may take place outside Mass. It is opportune for this to occur in a Liturgy of the Word, as described in the Roman Missal, or on pages 621-628 of the Book of Blessings. In this case, the ashes are blessed and distributed after the homily and the celebration concludes with the Prayer of the Faithful. Office: At Morning Prayer, the psalms and canticles of Friday Week 3 may be used. Otherwise from now until Saturday the psalmody is taken from PSALTER WEEK 4. In Holy Week the Church celebrates the mysteries of salvation accomplished by Christ in the last days of his earthly life, from his messianic entry into Jerusalem, until his blessed Passion and glorious Resurrection. The weekdays of this week are dedicated to the celebration of penance, abstaining from the celebration of the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, since these have their natural place in the Easter Vigil. Lent continues until Maundy Thursday. The rites of Holy Week, that is to say the blessing and procession of palms, the reposition of the Blessed Sacrament after the Mass of the Lord's Supper, the Solemn Celebration of the Passion of the Lord on Good Friday and the Easter Vigil, may be celebrated in all churches and chapels. In churches other than parish churches, and in chapels, it is best that these rites be celebrated only if this can be done worthily - that is to say, with an appropriate number of ministers, with the possibility of singing at least some parts of the liturgy, and with a sufficiently large congregation of faithful. Otherwise, it is best that these liturgies be celebrated only in parish churches and in other more important churches. Pastors should take care to instruct the faithful on the meaning and structure of the rites enacted in these days, and so lead them to an active and fruitful participation.

# PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

Mass: The blessing of palms and Procession, Solemn Entrance or Simple Entrance replace the Penitential Act; Mass begins with the Collect. There should be only one Procession, to be celebrated before Mass on either the Saturday evening or on the Sunday itself; the Solemn Entrance, without procession, may be repeated at another Mass which is habitually celebrated with a large gathering of the people. For the spiritual good of the faithful it is appropriate that the narrative of the Passion be read in its entirety, without however omitting the other readings which precede it. After the reading of the Passion, there should be a homily, even if only a brief one. The Passion is read according to the rubrics in the Missal; at the end is said Verbum Domini ("The Gospel of the Lord"), but the book is not kissed. Creed. Proper Preface. The liturgical books do not provide for the blessing of palm branches apart from the entrance rites of the Palm Sunday Mass.

On this day, the Church enters upon the mystery of the Death, Burial and Resurrection of her Lord, brings together the triumphal procession of Christ as King and the proclamation of his Passion. Both aspects of the paschal mystery should be explained in the catechesis of the day. Where it is not possible to celebrate Mass, there should be held a Liturgy of the Word about the Lord's messianic entry and his Passion, either on the Saturday evening or at a suitable time on the Sunday. *Michael F. # 28 THURSDAY White THURSDAY OF HOLY WEEK (MAUNDY THURSDAY)

Mass: In the morning: CHRISM MASS, with Gloria, Proper Preface. It is permissible to anticipate the blessing of the Holy Oils on another day, on condition that the day chosen is close to Easter and that the proper Mass is used. This Mass, which the bishop celebrates with his presbyterium, and at which the oils are blessed, manifests the unity and communion of the priests with their bishop. The faithful, too, should regularly take part and receive the Eucharist at this Mass. The readings bring out both Christ's messianic mission and its continuation in the Church by means of the sacraments. The newly blessed Oils should be borne with honour to the parish churches. The old Oils should be burned or poured into the Blessed Sacrament lamp. The reception of the sacred Oils may suitably take place before the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper or at another suitable moment. The faithful should, however, be instructed on the use of the sacred Oils and their efficaciousness in the Christian life.

Only the Chrism Mass and the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper may be celebrated today. The celebration of Funeral Masses and of Mass without a congregation are both prohibited today. Holy Communion may be distributed to the faithful only during Masses today, except for the sick, who may receive Communion at any hour.

## THE SACRED TRIDUUM

Christ accomplished the work of redemption and the perfect glorification of God principally through his paschal mystery, in which dying he destroyed our death and rising restored our life. Hence the Sacred Triduum of the Lord's Passion and Resurrection shines forth as the culmination of the whole liturgical year. By the celebration of the death, burial and resurrection of her Spouse, the Church means to make present and to fulfil the mystery of the Passover, the passing over of the Lord from this world to the Father.

EVENING: White

EVENING MASS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Mass: Gloria, during which bells are rung; bells then remain silent until the Easter Vigil. The mandatum (washing of feet) may be carried out. According to the revision promulgated by Pope Francis in 2016 (see tinyurl.com/Mandatum2016) if the ritual of foot-washing is carried out, those chosen should "represent the variety and the unity of each part of the people of God. Such small groups can be made up of men and women, and it is appropriate that they consist of people young and old, healthy and sick, clerics, consecrated men and women and laity." In the procession bearing the gifts it is fitting that there be included gifts destined for the poor, especially gifts which have been collected during Lent as the fruits of penance. While this happens, the hymn *Ubi caritas* ("Where charity and love...") is sung. Proper Preface, and special version of Eucharistic Prayer I as printed for today in the Missal. From the end of Mass until midnight, the Blessed Sacrament may be reserved publicly; it is fitting that for this purpose, a chapel should be arranged in which prayer and meditation may be fostered, but marked by that austerity which is appropriate to these days. The procession and repose of the Blessed Sacrament only takes place if the Celebration of the Lord's Passion is to take place in the same building tomorrow. RM 345 gives detailed rubrics for the procession and stripping of the altar. Office: For those who attend the Mass of the Lord's Supper, this takes the place of Evening Prayer.

29 FRIDAY

#### RED

# GOOD FRIDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

**Mass:** Celebration of the Lord's Passion in the afternoon, at around 3 pm, according to the prescriptions of the liturgical books. If, however, genuine pastoral reasons require it, the celebration may take place at a more suitable time, but not before noon and not after 9 pm. No one should introduce changes on private initiative. The altar should be completely bare: without cloths, cross and candlesticks. After the celebration of the Lord's Passion, the Blessed Sacrament should be carried back in a simple way to the place of reservation and kept there with the usual lamp burning. The altar should be stripped in private,

leaving however the cross and candlesticks. It is fitting that a place be arranged (as, for example, the chapel used for reposition and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament the previous evening), suitable for prayer and meditation, and that the cross be placed there to be adored by the faithful. A plenary indulgence is granted on the usual conditions for piously venerating the Cross during the Liturgy of the Passion.

Office: It is highly appropriate that the Office of Readings and Morning Prayer be celebrated in solemn fashion with the people. For those who attend the Solemn Liturgy of the Lord's Passion, this takes the place of Evening Prayer. Night Prayer II of Sundays is said, with the special antiphon for the Sacred Triduum. A day of penance marked by fasting and abstinence from meat. According to a most ancient tradition, the Church does not celebrate the Eucharist on this day. Holy Communion is distributed to the faithful only during the Celebration of the Lord's Passion, but may be taken at any time to the sick who are unable to take part in this liturgy. Of the seven Sacraments, only the Sacraments of Penance and of the Anointing of the Sick may be celebrated today. Funerals should be conducted without singing and without organ music or the ringing of bells.

#### 30 SATURDAY PURPLE HOLY SATURDAY

**Mass:** The Church today abstains completely from the celebration of Mass. Holy Communion may only be given in the form of Viaticum. For the rite of blessing food in readiness for the First Meal of Easter (a common custom in Eastern Europe), see pages 637-644 of the *Book of Blessings.* 

**Office:** It is highly appropriate that the Office of Readings and Morning Prayer be celebrated in solemn fashion with the people. If it is not possible to celebrate the Office of Readings and Morning Prayer with the people's participation, there should be a celebration of the Word of God or some devotional exercise appropriate to today's mystery, especially one that honours the Blessed Virgin Mary for her sharing in the Passion of her Son. For those who celebrate the Easter Vigil, this takes the place of Night Prayer. For those who do not attend the Vigil, Night Prayer II of Sundays is said with the special antiphon for Holy Saturday. Of the Seven Sacraments, only Penance and the Anointing of the Sick may be celebrated today. Holy Communion may only be given as Viaticum. An image of Christ crucified or laid in the tomb may be set up in the church for the veneration of the faithful, or else a portraval of his descent into Hell, such as casts light upon the mystery commemorated by Holy Saturday, or else an image of Our Lady of Sorrows.

Clocks go forward for the start of British Summer Time tonight.

### EASTERTIDE

The Paschal candle should be placed near the ambo or altar, and kept there for the whole Easter season until the end of Pentecost Sunday. It should be lit for the more solemn liturgical celebrations during this time, that is, for Mass and Morning and Evening Prayer. *The Cycle of Prayer:* During Eastertide we are asked to pray for these intentions: Survivors of Abuse; New Members of the Church; Vocations; The Right Use of the Media; the Church; Human Work. Throughout the Easter season, the Angelus is replaced by *Regina Coeli*.

PSALTER WEEK 1; SUNDAY READING CYCLE B EVENING: +WHITE THE EASTER VIGIL

> Mass: The whole celebration of the Easter Vigil should take place at night, so that it begins after night has fallen and concludes before daybreak. The celebration of a Mass without the rites of the Easter Vigil is not allowed; nor may a Mass be celebrated at the community's customary time for a Sunday Vigil Mass, unless this time is itself after nightfall. As regards the blessing of the fire, in so far as is possible a large fire should be prepared outside the church. The Easter candle, for effective symbolism, should be made of wax, of one piece, and of considerable size, and be renewed every year. The Exsultet may be sung, in case of necessity, by a cantor who is not a deacon, but in this event the cantor does not receive a blessing from the celebrant, and the second part of the invitation is omitted (*Quapropter* ... or "Therefore, dearest friends ...") as is the greeting ("The Lord be with you..."). At least three readings are to be proclaimed from the Old Testament, and even in urgent circumstances at least two. The reading from the Book of Exodus is never to be omitted. Gloria with bells. At the reading of the Gospel, incense may be used, but lights are not carried. The baptismal liturgy of the Easter Vigil reaches its fullest form when the baptism of adults, or at least children, is celebrated. However, even when the sacrament of Baptism is not celebrated, in parish churches the baptismal water should be blessed. In cases where there are neither baptisms nor blessing of the font, the sacrament of baptism should be recalled by the blessing of water, with which the faithful are then sprinkled after having renewed their baptismal promises. Proper Preface. Special insertions if Eucharistic Prayer I is used. Double Alleluia at the dismissal.

### 31 SUNDAY +WHITE EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

**Mass:** It is desirable that at Masses with a congregation, baptismal promises should be renewed. If sprinkling with holy water has replaced the penitential rite, this is not repeated at the renewal of vows. Gloria, Sequence, Creed or Renewal of Baptismal Promises, Proper Preface. Special insertions if Eucharistic Prayer I is used. Double Alleluia at the dismissal. At an evening Mass the Gospel may be Luke 24:13-35.

**Office:** For those who have attended the Easter Vigil, this takes the place of today's Office of Readings. Today, and throughout the whole Octave, Sunday Night Prayer (as after either first or second vespers), with the antiphon *Haec dies* (This is the day) instead of the short responsory.

When an optional memorial falls on a weekday of Easter time, it is possible to choose either the Office and Mass of the weekday, or the Office and Mass of the saint who is inscribed for that day in the calendar or in the Martyrology. Only when some genuine need or pastoral advantage requires it, may an appropriate Mass for Various Needs and Occasions, or Votive Mass, be celebrated. 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## **MAY 2024**

Since the month of May largely corresponds with the fifty days of Easter, the primary focus must be on the Resurrection of Christ rather than the Mother of God. Pious exercises practised at this time could emphasise Our Lady's participation in the Paschal mystery, and Pentecost: Our Lady journeys with the Church, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Eastertide is also a time for the celebration of the sacraments of Christian initiation and of the mystagogy. The pious exercises connected with the month of May could easily highlight the earthly role played by the glorified Queen of Heaven, here and now, in the celebration of the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist. **The Pope's Intention**: Let us pray that men and women religious and seminarians, grow in their own vocational journey through human, pastoral, spiritual and community formation, that leads them to be credible witnesses of the Gospel.

## **ORDINARY TIME - SUMMER**

The Paschal Candle is no longer kept in the sanctuary, but moved to the baptistry, where it is kept with due honour and lit at baptisms. At funerals it may be placed near the coffin, and lit, to signify that Christian death is a true Passover. The recitation of the Angelus is resumed. Eucharistic Prayer IV may be again used on Sundays, unless they are Solemnities or Feasts of the Lord with their own Proper Prefaces. The Readings of Ordinary Time continue from the 7th week of Cycle II.

**The Cycle of Prayer:** During Ordinary Time (Summer), *i.e.* up to September, we are asked to pray for these intentions: A Deeper Understanding between Christians and Jews; Those who Suffer Persecution, Oppression and Denial of Human Rights; Europe; Human Life; Seafarers.

## **ADVENT 2024**

Advent has a twofold character: as a season to prepare for Christmas, when Christ's first coming to us is remembered: and as a season when that remembrance directs the mind and heart to await Christ's coming at the end of time. Advent is thus a period for devout and joyful expectation. The playing of the organ and other musical instruments, and the decoration of the altar with flowers, should be done in a moderate manner, as is consonant with the character of the season, without anticipating the full joy of the Nativity of the Lord. The same moderation should be observed in the celebration of matrimony. Only when some genuine need or pastoral advantage requires it, may an appropriate Mass for Various Needs or a Votive Mass be celebrated. Daily Masses for the Dead are not allowed. For the rite of blessing an Advent Wreath at Mass, Evening Prayer or a Liturgy of the Word, see page 573-582 of the *Book of Blessings.*

### CHRISTMASTIDE

After the annual celebration of the Paschal Mystery, there is no more ancient feast day for the Church than the recalling of the memory of the Nativity of the Lord and of the mysteries of his first appearing. This is the purpose of Christmas Time. For the rite of blessing a Christmas Manger or Nativity Scene at Mass or during a carol service, see pages 583-591 of the *Book of Blessings.* The rite of blessing a Christmas Tree is on pages 593-600.

**The Cycle of Prayer:** Christmastide continues the themes begun in Advent: Migrants and Refugees; Expectant Mothers.

### EVENING: +WHITE THE NATIVITY OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST (SOLEMNITY) - CHRISTMAS VIGIL

**Mass:** The Vigil Mass of the Nativity has its own Proper Readings in the Lectionary. Gloria, Creed, and, if using Eucharistic Prayer I, special insertions for Christmas. Note genuflection during the Creed when the Incarnation is mentioned. Text for the Proclamation of the Birth of Christ from the Roman Martyrology can be found at tinyurl.com/BirthChant – this may be chanted as part of the Liturgy of the Hours on the evening of 24 December, or immediately before (not during) Midnight Mass. **Office:** It is very appropriate to keep a solemn vigil by celebrating the Office of Readings before Midnight Mass. Night Prayer is not recited by those who attend the Office of Readings and Midnight Mass; otherwise, Night Prayer I of Sundays and Solemnities is celebrated.

#### HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION 25 WEDNESDAY+WHITE THE NATIVITY OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST (SOLEMNITY) - CHRISTMAS DAY

**Mass:** The Readings may be interchanged from the formulae provided for Mass at Midnight, at Dawn, and During the Day. Gloria, Creed, and Christmas inserts for Eucharistic Prayer I. Note genuflection during the Creed when the Incarnation is mentioned. All priests may celebrate three (stipended) Masses today on condition that they are celebrated at the proper times (Midnight, Dawn and Day).

**Office:** Night Prayer II of Sundays and Solemnities is said.


